PREHEARING ORDER

The parties are hereby directed to comply with the following requirements:

1. A request for a change of the scheduled hearing date must state the agreement or opposition of other parties, and must be submitted in writing no later than five (5) business days prior to the hearing. 52 Pa. Code §1.15(b). Requests for changes of hearing dates must be sent to me and all parties of record. My address is:

Changes are granted only in rare situations where good cause exists.

2. Commission policy promotes settlements. The parties should confact each other at least one week before the scheduled hearing to talk over a possible settlement of this case. Even if you are unable to settle this case, you may still resolve many questions or issues during your talks. If an agreement is reached, a formal hearing will not be necessary and the scheduled hearing will be cancelled.

3. If you intend to present any documents or exhibits for my consideration, you must bring four (4) copies to the hearing.

4. This hearing is a formal proceeding and will be conducted in accordance with

the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

5. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§1.21 & 1.22, you may represent yourself, if you are an individual, or you may have an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of

an marriada, or you may have an anomey member to practice taw in the commonwealth or

Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*, represent you. However, if you are a partnership, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, you must have an

attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted Pro Hac

Vice, represent you in this proceeding. Unless you are an attorney, you may not represent

someone else. Attorneys shall insure that their appearance is entered in accordance with the

provisions of 52 Pa. Code §1.24(b).

6. If you intend to subpoena witnesses for the hearing, you should review

the procedures established in 52 Pa. Code §5.421. You must submit your written application

to the Administrative Law Judge sufficiently in advance of the hearing date so that the other

parties will have the required ten (10) days' notice to answer or object, and so that you will

have enough time to receive the subpoena and serve it.

7. IF YOU FAIL TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HEARING, THE HEARING

WILL PROCEED WITHOUT YOU AND A DECISION MAY BE ENTERED AGAINST

YOU.
