Application of Jenks, Inc., t/d/b/a Georgia P. Carroll Moving Company, Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, a corporation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for amendment to its common carrier certificate, which grants the right, to transport, by motor vehicle, household goods in use, between points in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny county: **SO AS TO PERMIT** the transportation of household goods in use, between points in the counties of Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Greene, Washington and Westmoreland, and from points in said counties, to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed October 31, 1997. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of November 15, 1997. Fifteen (15) protests were filed by the above-mentioned carriers.

All protests were withdrawn upon restrictive amendment limiting the service to six (6) named agencies and further limiting service between and from the county of Allegheny to points in the five named counties and vice versa; provided that no right is permitted to render service between points in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County.

Applicant further amended the application to limit service to four (4) of the six (6) named agencies.

The now unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing. The record consists of verified statements entered by the applicant and the four (4) named agencies.

After complete review of the application, we find:

1. Applicant seeks to amend its common carrier household goods in use authority.
2. The application was protested by fifteen (15) carriers; all protests were withdrawn as discussed supra.
3. Applicant further amended the application to limit the service to four (4) agencies.
4. The applicant has the equipment, experience, ability and fitness necessary to render the service, as amended.
5. The application is supported by four (4) agencies.
6. The evidence of record is sufficient to establish necessity for the service, as amended.
7. Approval of the application, as amended, is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; **THEREFORE,**

IT IS ORDERED: That the authority issued under certificate issued June 26, 1997, be amended to include the following right:

To transport, as a Class D carrier, household goods in use, for the Housing Authority of the City of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County Housing Authority, Housing Opportunities Unlimited and LLM-7 Cleaning Company, Inc., between points in the county of Allegheny, and from points in said county, to points in the counties of Beaver, Butler, Greene, Washington and Westmoreland, and vice versa;

subject to the following conditions:

Provided that no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service between points in the city of Pittsburgh, Allegheny County.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation in this application until the following is submitted to the Commission:

1. A tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.
2. The assessment due in the amount of \$858.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.
