O R D E R

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission by an application filed on August 16, 1991, and published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of September 7, 1991. One carrier protested the application but withdrew when the applicant restrictively amended the proposed authority by excluding service from nine townships and seven boroughs in Butler County, and excluding service between and from points in Mercer County.

The unopposed record is now certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing. Verified statements were submitted by the applicant and 96 supporting parties.

Francis B. McCormick, II, president of Personal Touch Limousine, Inc., t/d/b/a V.I.P. Limousine Service (or applicant), sets forth in a verified statement that the corporation has its principal offices located at 49 Merriman Road, Ambridge, Beaver County, and that it is currently authorized to provide limousine service between points in the borough of Monaca, Beaver County, and within an airline distance of 50 statute miles of the limits of the borough; limited to persons attending weddings, christening parties or other social functions, and further subject to certain geographical restrictions.

There will be some duplicating authority resulting from the approval of this application. Although the existing authority and the proposed authority are identical in territorial scope, due to the attendant restrictions in both authorities, there are certain areas the applicant may render service under the existing authority which cannot be served under the proposed authority. For example, under the existing authority, service can be provided in Mercer County with the exception of certain townships and boroughs, whereas the proposed authority prohibits service in all of Mercer County.

Similar conditions exist in Butler County. The applicant understands that the portion of the authorities which are duplicated are not severable and constitute only one right.

The applicant owns three luxury stretch limousines and they are in excellent condition. The equipment is not being used to maximum capacity; however, should it become necessary, the applicant stands ready to add more vehicles. The limousines are equipped with luxury features such as televisions, stereos, privacy dividers, tinted windows, etc. A stringent safety program is enforced.

An unaudited balance sheet shows that at year end 1990, the applicant had current assets of \$9,811, total assets of \$77,118, with current liabilities of \$13,781 and total liabilities of \$114,538, leaving a deficit in owners' equity of \$37,420.

George R. Zambelli, owner of Zambelli Fireworks Internationale Manufacturing Co., Inc., located in New Castle, Lawrence County, supports the applicant and states that in his business of manufacturing fireworks, he has occasion to invite customers to visit the facility. The applicant would be used as a means of customer transportation as well as transporting company personnel for business meetings to points such as the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, Pittsburgh, Seven Springs, Erie, Slippery Rock and points in Mercer County.

Joseph R. Raught supports the applicant as an authorized representative of Animal Medical Clinic located in New Wilmington, Lawrence County. As a general veterinary practice, the clinic will utilize the proposed service from the office to points such as the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, Greentree, Monroeville and Pittsburgh approximately five times per year.

Roxine Garrett, a resident of Pulaski, Lawrence County, supports the applicant as an individual interested in using limousine service approximately two times a year from Pulaski to restaurants in Mercer County and to the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Linda S. Wilson, a resident of Volant, R.D. 3, Lawrence County, has a personal interest in using limousine service from her residence to points such as Presque Isle in Erie and the Gateway Clipper in Pittsburgh. She wants transportation in clean, comfortable limousines which are driven by courteous drivers. The service would be used approximately three times a year.

Linda Kerr, a resident of Plain Grove Township, Lawrence County, would use the proposed service from her residence to points such as Pittsburgh and Monroeville at least once a year.

Rennae L. Allison resides in Slippery Rock, R.D. 3, which is actually in Lawrence County, and states that she would use the service approximately two times a year to restaurants in Sharon, Emlenton and New Castle.

George A. Baillie is an attorney with a business address of 336 South Main Street, Burgettstown, Washington County, and has a resident address of Avella, R.D. 2, Washington County. He supports the applicant attesting to the need for limousine service from his home to the office and from Washington County points to other points in Washington County, and to points in Allegheny County for realty closings, client entertainment, etc. He would use the service approximately six times a year.

Dennis Slagle supports the applicant on behalf of Slagle's Business Systems located at 47 North Main Street, Washington, Washington County. The company is involved in the sales and service of business equipment and would use the service primarily to transport clients between the Washington office and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport approximately 12 times per year.

John C. Grenfell, Jr., supports the applicant on behalf of J. C. Grenfell Heating and Cooling Co., located in Monongahela, Washington County. He expects to use the proposed service approximately 12 times a year from Washington County to Pittsburgh for business meetings with clients and to Mt. Washington and Union Square in Pittsburgh for dining purposes, and to Nemacolin for golf outings.

John E. Martin has presented a verified statement for Martin Optical Co., located in Canonsburg, Washington County, setting forth that the company has need for limousine service approximately once a month between the office and places such as a nursing home in Houston (Washington County) and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Octavius Proia resides in Washington, Washington County, and would use the limousine service approximately six times a year from his residence to points such as Erie and Seven Springs (Somerset and Fayette Counties).

Charles Phillips, owner of Interiors By Phillips, Greensburg, Westmoreland County, states that the company would use the proposed service six to 12 times a year between the office and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Michael Villi supports the applicant on behalf of Norwin Messenger Service located in Irwin, Westmoreland County, stating that the limousine service would be used for transporting clients from Irwin to points such as Greensburg (Westmoreland County) and Harrisburg. The service would be required approximately three times per year.

P. R. Lavella states that his company, Fun Services, is located in Jeannette, Westmoreland County, and will utilize the service to the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport approximately three times a year if it becomes available.

Rhonda Harshbarger, a resident of Darragh, Westmoreland County, states that she would use the proposed service approximately two times a year from her home to such points as Hidden Valley, Somerset County.

Ella Douglas has presented a supporting verified statement on behalf of Bonella's Steak House located in Kittanning, Armstrong County. The limousine service would be used primarily for restaurant shows in Seven Springs, and for transportation to and from the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Terrance G. Silagyí, a resident of Worthington, Armstrong County, supports the applicant on behalf of the County Seat Restaurant and Lounge located in Kittanning, Armstrong County. The restaurant would use the service between its facility and local high schools, the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, and it would be very beneficial to the restaurant if limousine service was available for its customers as well.

Karen Zambotti supports the applicant on behalf of Bridal Reflections located in Kittanning, Armstrong County. The service would be very useful between points in the Kittanning area of Armstrong County for bridal shows, and for entertainment purposes in Pittsburgh. It would be used approximately five times per year.

Carol L. Crytzer, a resident of Freeport, Armstrong County, states that she would personally use the service approximately four times per year to places such as Seven Springs and Hidden Valley.

Robert C. Barry, Jr., supports the applicant on behalf of KPMG Peat Marwick as manager of its Pittsburgh, Allegheny County office. As Certified Public Accountants, the service would be very useful as a means of transportation from Pittsburgh to business meetings and training seminars located outside of Allegheny County. The service would be used approximately six times a year.

Alan J. Terputac is a Certified Public Accountant with an office located in Imperial, Allegheny County. He would use the service approximately four times per year to points such as Connellsville (Fayette County) and Waynesburg (Greene County), bringing clients to and from business locations.

Thomas C. Seger supports the applicant on behalf of Seger Associates which is involved in advertising, public relations, promotions, production and training at facilities located in Pittsburgh, Allegheny County. The company would use the service to points outside of Allegheny County such as Greensburg, Washington, Nemaquin, Seven Springs, and other places where there are meeting/hotel facilities in western Pennsylvania for business entertainment, planning and/or training programs.

Peter Pucci, a resident of Leet Township, Allegheny County, has an interest in using limousine service from his home to such points as Blue Knob (Blair County) for skiing, and State College (Centre County) for sports events. The service would be used approximately four times a year.

Loren Scott Wesche resides in Leetsdale, Allegheny County, and would use the proposed service to points such as State College and Tionesta (Forest County) approximately three times a year.

John H. Brown has entered support on behalf of Earth Works, Inc., located in Gibsonia, Allegheny County. The company is an excavating contractor and would use the service for meetings and client entertainment at points such as State College, Greensburg, Irwin and Butler.

George W. Rodgers supports the applicant on behalf of Slippery Rock Agway located in Slippery Rock, Butler County, and states that the company expects to use the applicant's service to points such as the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport and to restaurants in the Mercer County area approximately four times a year.

Edward A. Bloom, an employee of Bortnas, The Butler Florist which is located in Butler, Butler County supports the applicant. The company will use the service from Butler to points such as Grove City (Mercer County) and Wexford (Allegheny County) approximately eight times a year.

Ronald L. Bennett, owner of Ron Bennett Studio in Butler, Butler County, supports the applicant stating that he would use the limousine service for photography promotion work in Butler County and for service to the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Harlan E. Wible and Pamela L. Uber are residents of Slippery Rock, Butler County, and attest to a personal desire to have limousine service available for transportation to places such as Pittsburgh, Mt. Washington restaurants, Station Square and the ski resorts in Somerset County. Collectively, they would use the service approximately four times a year.

Kevin D. Adamson, operator of a hair salon under the name of Hair by Kevin which is located in Brownsville, Fayette County, supports the applicant. He will use the service from Brownsville to Pittsburgh (for hair shows) and Seven Springs approximately three times a year.

Edward T. Stevenson, an employee of Lunden's Flower Shop in Brownsville, Fayette County, and Philip A. Gianneti, owner of Phil Gianneti Dodge, also in Brownsville, support the applicant. The service would be used for entertaining clients and business associates at points and places such as Heinz Hall, the Benedum Center and sporting events in Pittsburgh, and Nemacolin Woodlands for business meetings.

Joseph Zosky, a resident of Brownsville, Fayette County, has need for reliable limousine service approximately three times a year to points such as Seven Springs and Harrisburg.

Linda P. Myers, an employee of Formal Impression's Bridal Shops in Rimersburg, Clarion County, supports the applicant. She would have use for limousine service to points such as Butler, DuBois, Clarion and Kittanning, and will use it approximately three times a year.

Catherine Crawford supports the applicant on behalf of The New Look Salon located in Sligo, Clarion County, and expects to use the applicant's services approximately three times a year to points such as Philadelphia, Erie and DuBois for hair shows.

Vaughn P. Hawk, a resident of Rimersburg, Clarion County, states that the proposed service would be used between Rimersburg and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport approximately two times a year.

R. J. Ruffdale, Jr., supports the applicant on behalf of Ruff Creek General Store located in Ruff Creek, Greene County, and states that he would use the service at least once a year to Pittsburgh, Allegheny County.

Victoria Barnhart has submitted a supporting affidavit on behalf of Barnhart's Honda located in Prosperity, R.D. 2, Greene County. In the company's business of selling and servicing motorcycles and all terrain vehicles, it would have use for limousine service from its facility to points such as Waynesburg, Uniontown, Harrisburg and Erie for business promotions, and to Mount Morris for race meets.

Steve Caro, owner of Steve's Tavern, and Stephen Smoggie, owner of Smoggie's Amoco, both located in Clarksville, Greene County, support the applicant and state their use for limousine service would be between their facilities and points such as Washington and Pittsburgh.

Sydney Ray, an employee of Emily's Jewelry and Gift Shop in Saltsburg, Indiana County, supports the applicant stating that the service would be utilized to transport clients between Saltsburg and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport.

Mark C. Cable, proprietor of Mark C. Cable Insurance Agency; Chuck Schiefer, an employee of Julian's Pharmacy; and Jennie Busi, as an individual, and all being located in Saltsburg, Indiana County, support the applicant. Collectively, they would use the service for business and personal reasons to and from places such as Nemaocolin and Pittsburgh.

Marilyn Steadman supports the applicant on behalf of Louis L. Steadman Logging/Lumber located in Clintonville, Venango County. The company expects to use the service between its facility and the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport approximately two times per year.

Mary Kaye Cunningham states that she is an authorized representative of Days Inn located in Barkeyville, Venango County, and supports the applicant on its behalf. The service would be used between the motel and the airports in Pittsburgh and Erie on a regular basis.

Ronald McElhinney, owner of McElhinney's Autobody and Eugene L. Texter, both of Clintonville, Venango County, support the applicant. They are interested in limousine service for transportation to Pittsburgh and Erie for various types of events. They anticipate using the service approximately seven times a year.

Paul L. Birnesser, Jr., a resident of Darlington, R.D. 2, Beaver County, estimates that he would use the service approximately three times a year to Pittsburgh and Erie for dining, sports, music concerts, etc.

Crystal Finch, Sally Thomas and Kelly O. Smith are residents of Galilee, Beaver County, and support the applicant. They would use the service from their homes to places such as Franklin (Beaver County), Pittsburgh, the Poconos, and the outlet stores in Reading.

Thomas W. Pieri and Patty L. Seidler reside in Koppel, Beaver County, and support the applicant stating that they would use the service approximately four times and three times per year, respectively, to Pittsburgh, the Greater Pittsburgh International Airport, and various points in Beaver County.

George C. Wiltrout, Bruce Hill and Paula Benko are residents of Beaver Falls, Beaver County, and support the applicant. They will use the proposed service to local areas of Beaver County for social functions, to Pittsburgh, Big Beaver, etc., as the occasions arise.

Anthony Esolo supports the applicant on behalf of The Corner Tavern located in Koppel, Beaver County, stating that the service would be useful from the tavern to the Three Rivers Stadium in Pittsburgh.

Philip Jones, a representative of WGEV-FM, a non-commercial, non-profit radio station in Beaver Falls, Beaver County, supports the applicant. The station would use limousine service approximately four times a year for promotional events to points such as Pittsburgh, New Castle, Beaver Falls, etc.

Donald Paladine on behalf of Dapco Copying Products, Inc., located in Beaver, Beaver County, supports the applicant stating that the company will use the proposed service for transportation to meetings at points such as Beaver Falls, Slippery Rock and Darlington approximately three times a year.

Robert Vucinic, an employee of Primerica Financial Services located in Monaca, Beaver County, states that the limousine service would be used approximately four times a year to Harrisburg and Pittsburgh.

The applicant is further supported by 21 other residents and business representatives of Beaver County who are domiciled at points such as Washington Township, Beaver Falls, Darlington, Ambridge, Beaver, North Sewickley Township, Franklin Township, Homewood, Racine, Aliquippa, etc. All attest to a desire and need for limousine service to, from and between a wide variety of points in the proposed area of operation.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

By this amended application, Personal Touch Limousine, Inc., t/d/b/a V.I.P. Limousine Service seeks to amend its common carrier certificate so that it will have the right to provide limousine service between points in the borough of Monaca, Beaver County and within an airline distance of 50 statute miles of the limits of said borough, and from points in said territory to points in Pennsylvania. The provisions of a restrictive amendment preclude service from certain points in Butler County (except as presently

authorized), and between and from points in Mercer County (except as presently authorized).

On October 31, 1989, the applicant was issued a certificate granting the right to provide limousine service for persons attending funerals, weddings, christening parties or other social functions, and flowers and accessories for such events, between points in the borough of Monaca, Beaver County, and within an airline distance of 50 statute miles of the limits of the borough of Monaca, subject to certain conditions. From a territorial standpoint, the radial authority of Monaca is the same as the radial authority proposed in this application. The proposed authority however, extends the existing authority further so that service is not limited for persons attending specific functions, and service can be provided from the radial territory to points in Pennsylvania.

At first blush, it appears that the broader authority proposed herein fully encompasses the existing authority. However, due to the conditions attached to both the existing and proposed authority, there is slightly less than a complete duplication of rights. There are certain areas in which the applicant can render service under the existing authority which it cannot render under the proposed authority. For example, under the present authority, service can now be provided in Mercer County, with the exception of certain townships and boroughs, whereas the proposed authority prohibits service from and between points in all of Mercer County. Similar conditions exist in other areas.

A 50-mile radius of the borough of Monaca, Beaver County embraces the counties of Mercer, Lawrence, Butler, Beaver and Allegheny in their entirety, and portions of Venango, Armstrong, Washington, Indiana, Westmoreland, Fayette, Greene and Clarion. The applicant has obtained creditable support from 96 residents and business concerns representing all of the counties, regardless of the territorial extent to which they are included within the prescribed radial area of Monaca, Beaver County. The cross-section of the public is most favorable. For example, the radial authority includes a very minute portion of Indiana County, leaving only the borough of Saltsburg in the serviceable territory; however, we have a showing of need for service from four residents of Saltsburg. The base area of Beaver County itself is represented by 33 witnesses. The applicant has been very convincing in sustaining its burden of establishing public need.

At this point, we should discuss the ramifications of the inclusion of Allegheny County within the radial operating territory. In Port Authority of Allegheny County v. Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, 494 Pa. 250, 431 A. 2d 243 (1981), the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania held that under Section 2 of the Second Class County Port Authority Act, Act of April 6, 1965 (P.L. 1414) (55 P.S. §552), the jurisdiction of the Commission over common carriers of passengers in Allegheny County is limited to taxicabs and school buses. Based on this decision, the Commission holds no jurisdiction over the regulation of limousine service between points in Allegheny County. Accordingly, any authority which may be granted hereinafter should not be construed as conveying the right to provide limousine service between points in Allegheny County. The authority will be conditioned to this effect.

We note that each of the Allegheny County witnesses attest to the need for service originating in Allegheny County with destination at a point or points outside Allegheny County. It is apparent that the applicant has knowledge of the Allegheny County service limitations.

We find:

1. That the applicant has shown that a public need for the service as proposed, amended and modified does exist.
2. That the applicant is fit, ready, willing and able to provide the proposed service as amended and modified.
3. That approval of the application, as amended and modified, is necessary for the accommodation and convenience of the public; THEREFORE,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved as amended and modified, and that the certificate issued to the applicant on October 31, 1989, be amended to include the following right:

To transport, as a common carrier, persons in limousine service, between points in the borough of Monaca, Beaver County, and within an airline distance of fifty (50) statute miles of the limits of said borough, and from points in said territory to points in Pennsylvania;

subject to the following conditions:

- (1) That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service from points in the townships of Adams, Connoquenessing, Cranberry, Forward, Jackson, Lancaster, Butler, Penn and Middlesex, and the boroughs of Seven Fields, Callery, Connoquenessing, Evans City, Mars, Valencia and Zelienople, Butler County, except as presently authorized.
- (2) That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service between points in Mercer County or from points in Mercer County to points in Pennsylvania, except as presently authorized.
- (3) That no right, power or privilege is granted to provide service between points in Allegheny County.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation granted herein until it shall have complied with the requirements of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code and the rules and regulations of the Commission relative to the filing and acceptance of a tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event the applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days of the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.

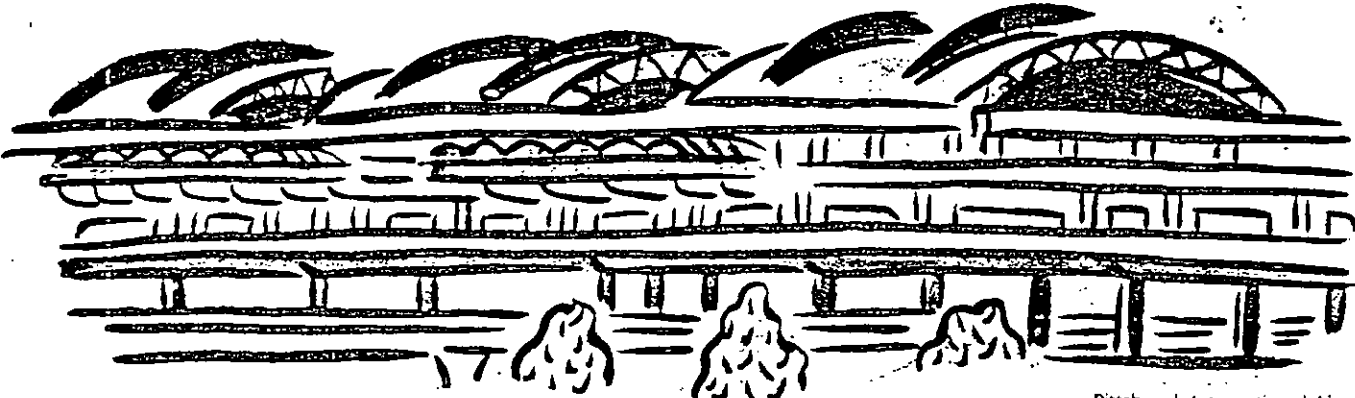
