ORDER

Bayshore Transportation System, Inc., a corporation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (the Applicant), filed an application with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (the Commission). The Applicant applied for the right to transport household goods in use between points in the city and county of Philadelphia and the counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery, as stated in the application.

A notice of the application was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on October 4, 1997. Protests were due on October 27, 1997.

William H. R. Casey, Esquire, filed protests to the application on behalf of several protestants on October 14, 1997.

A hearing was convened on January 27, 1998. Before the hearing was held, the Applicant notified the Commission's Prothonotary Office that the parties had agreed upon a restrictive amendment to the application and that the protests had been withdrawn. The parties filed the original of the Restrictive Amendment with the Prothonotary, a copy of which is attached to this Order.



**STIPULATION RE AMENDMENT

WITHDRAWAL OF PROTESTS**

**COMES NOW**, Bayshore Transportation System, Inc. ("Applicant") and Clemmer Moving & Storage, Inc., Shelly Moving & Storage, Inc. and Morgan Moving & Storage, Ltd. (collectively referred to as "Protestants") and, by their representatives, enter into this stipulation providing for amendment of the above-captioned application and the withdrawal of the protests thereto.

1. As initially filed, this application sought the following authority:

Household goods, in use, between points in the city and county of Philadelphia and the counties of Bucks, Chester, Delaware and Montgomery, and from points in the said counties to points in Pennsylvania.

2. Applicant restrictively amends the above-captioned application so as to now seek the following:

Household goods, in use, between points in the counties of Chester and Delaware, and from points in said counties to points in Pennsylvania.

3. Conditioned upon the Commission's acceptance of the limitations set forth above upon any authority granted in this proceeding, Protestants withdraw their opposition to the application.\*
