Dear Ms. Chiavetta:

I am in receipt of the PECO cover letter with PUC Docket enclosures regarding my formal complaint. Initially, the formal complaint was a **request** which I had stated as such in an on-line form and a mailed letter to PUC. I filed it as a formal complaint, because there seemed to be no other way to communicate with PUC. *[Of note: PUC letter with Docket enclosures did not include a Notice to Plead or Appeal.]*

This entire issue is a simple matter. It is *not* a complaint nor does it *need* a hearing or conference. Due to financial hardship, I would gladly give PECO permission to remove my electric meter socket and attach it to the nearest utility pole in front of my house and therefore, they can place their AMI [Smart] Meter on that socket. For PECO it would be a minor job and build good customer relations.

According to Pennsylvania Law 1592, electric distribution companies shall furnish smart meter technology as follows:

(i) Upon request from a customer that agrees to pay the cost of the smart meter at the time of the request. *[Unless PECO does the work, financial hardship prevents me from hiring an electrician to move the socket to another location. Therefore, how can I agree to pay for a smart meter or anything else?]*

(ii) In new building construction.

(iii) In accordance with a depreciation schedule not to exceed 15 years [2023]. *[From the date Act 129 was approved in 2008, the correct calculation of 15 years is 2023. I do understand the statement "not to exceed" 15 years.]*

(3) Electric distribution companies shall, with customer consent, make available direct meter access and electronic access to customer meter data to third parties, including electric generation suppliers and providers of conservation and load management services. *[a. Please explain this process. b. Due to my financial situation and increase in rates with AMI meters, it would be illogical to give my consent for access to my meter and electronic access TO customer meter data, then TO third parties, etc.]*

In regard to this crossroads we face and in the interest of building good customer and public relations, I certainly do hope PUC can encourage PECO to help me.
