TENTATIVE DECISION

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application for emergency temporary authority filed May 28, 1998. Corresponding applications for temporary and permanent authority were filed concurrently.

Applicant seeks to immediately begin providing service pending disposition of the concurrently filed corresponding applications for temporary and permanent authority. Support comes from eleven (11) parties residing in Lancaster County. From the support of the parties it appears that applicant has been rendering transportation without benefit of authority.

A review of the Commission's records reveals that there are a total of thirteen (13) certificated parataransit carriers with rights, generally, to transport persons between points in Lancaster County, and from points in said county, to points in Pennsylvania. Six (6) of the carriers have specific rights to transport persons whose personal convictions prevent them from owning or operating motor vehicles. Those carriers are as follows:


Due to the fact that thirteen (13) carriers are certificated to provide the service, the Commission believes that the emergency temporary authority application should be denied; **THEREFORE,**

IT IS ORDERED: That the application for emergency temporary authority be and is hereby denied for failure to establish an emergency situation which warrants a grant of emergency temporary authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the denial of the instant application will have no bearing on the disposition of any application for temporary or permanent authority.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That, unless exceptions are filed within twenty (20) days from the date of the entry of this order, this order shall become final.
