

MOTION FOR CONTINUANCE OF HEARING DATE

PECO Energy Company ("PECO Energy"), pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 1.15(b), hereby requests a continuance of the hearing date scheduled in this matter and states the following:

1. A telephonic hearing for this matter is currently scheduled to take place on Wednesday, June 8, 2016, at 10:00 a.m.
2. This matter arises from a complex commercial billing dispute where the Complainant disputes PECO's meters and billed charges.
3. PECO will present the testimony of at least two witnesses who will testify regarding the bills and meter tests.
4. PECO Energy's counsel, Shawane Lee, Esquire, is attached to another hearing scheduled on the same date at the same time before Administrative Law Judges Christopher P. Pell and Darlene D. Heep in the matter Maria Povacz vs. PECO Energy.
5. The Maria Povacz matter is an AMI health effects case with several expert witnesses who are scheduled to testify. Accordingly, that case must proceed on June 8th as the witnesses are travelling in from various locations and have pre-booked their travel.
6. As the Complainant's formal complaint involves a complex billing and meter dispute, the company requires PECO's in house counsel to handle this matter.

7. The Prehearing Order in this matter states that requests for a continuance are only granted “in rare situations where good cause exists.” (Prehearing Order, citing 52 Pa. Code § 1.15).

8. PECO Energy avers that “good cause” exists to continue the scheduled hearing to another date because PECO’s in house counsel is attached to another hearing.

9. PECO Energy has conferred with the Complainant’s counsel, Robert Cherwony, Esquire and he has consented to PECO’s continuance request.

10. Both parties are available for a rescheduled hearing date on Monday, June 13th or Monday, June 20th at 10:00 a.m.

11. PECO Energy therefore respectfully requests that the hearing be continued to a further date on June 13th or June 20th.
