## PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE FRED NENE:

Mr. Gray.

MR. GRAY: We have had further discussions until unfortunately six o'clock last night and my clients have decided to withdraw their protest, so I apologize for having everybody here this morning. We have had further discussions this morning. But it is so unavoidable. I apologize for that, but we were on the phone last night until at least 5:30.

JUDGE NENE: You may have inconvenienced these people for a couple of hours but not for the 8 hours that it would have been. I appreciate it that you worked it out. We will go on the record and you can put that on the record.

This is the time scheduled for a hearing on the application of Canterbury International, Incorporated, doing business as Two Men and a Truck. The application is so as to permit the transportation of household goods in use from points in the County of Allegheny to points in Pennsylvania, and vice

3                       Present in the hearing room is  
4           attorney Kenneth Olsen representing the  
5           applicant and attorney William Gray  
6           representing five separate protestants to the  
7           application.

8                       Before we begin the proceeding,  
9           counsel for the protestant stated he would  
10          like to put something on the record that  
11          would maybe move this along.   Mr. Gray.

12                      MR. GRAY:  Thank you, Your Honor.

13                      Your Honor, the attorney for the  
14          applicant, Mr. Olsen, and I have had  
15          discussions about this application, and more  
16          importantly, our clients who have had  
17          discussions about this application, and my  
18          clients have decided, upon further  
19          consideration, to withdraw their protest to  
20          this application.  Therefore, I hereby request  
21          that the protest that we filed on behalf of  
22          South Hills Movers, Inc., Weleski Transfer,  
23          Inc., Central Van and Storage of Charleston  
24          Inc. d/b/a Central Van & Storage Company,  
25          Vesley Brothers Moving and Storage, Inc. and

1 Century III Moving Systems, Inc., t/b/b/a  
2 Clairton Transfer Company, and Pleasant Hills  
3 Van and Storage be withdrawn.

4 JUDGE NENE: Mr. Olsen, I assume  
5 you have no objection to that?

6 MR. OLSEN: No, I do not have any  
7 objection and I echo the comments of Mr. Gray  
8 regarding our discussions regarding this  
9 application and the resolution resulting in  
10 withdrawal of the protest of this  
11 application.

12 Your Honor, since counsel has  
13 withdrawn the protests, all of the  
14 protestants' applications, I would request  
15 that the record reflect and your Honor have  
16 this file marked as an unopposed application  
17 and it be referred to the Bureau of  
18 Transportation for continued processing under  
19 the submission of written statements by the  
20 applicant.

21 JUDGE NENE: Certainly we will do  
22 that and the actions of the protestants  
23 certainly have expedited this proceeding, so  
24 we will move the papers to a non litigious  
25 disposition and you will be hearing from the

1 Commission with the authority that you seek.

2 MR. OLSEN: Thank you.

3 JUDGE NENE: I want to thank the  
4 large number of witnesses that have come out  
5 in support of this or against this action,  
6 and without participation of the public, it  
7 would be difficult for the Commission to  
8 determine whether or not there was an  
9 appropriate certificate to award. And I thank  
10 you all and I hope you get home before the  
11 rain, and that will end this proceeding then.

12 MR. GRAY: Thank you, Your Honor.
