7. FINANCIAL FITNESS

- Reports of Gross Receipts: Applicant shall report its Pennsylvania intrastate gross receipts to the Commission on a quarterly and year to date basis no later than 30 days following the end of the quarter.
- The Treasurer or other appropriate officer of Applicant shall transmit to the Department of Revenue by March 15, an annual report, and under oath or affirmation, of the amount of gross receipts received by Applicant during the prior calendar year.
- Net Metering Reports: Applicant shall be responsible to report any Net Metering per the Standards on http://www.puc.pa.gov/consumer_info/electricity/alternative_energy.aspx. Scroll down to the Net Metering Standards Section.
- Applicant shall report to the Commission the percentages of total electricity supplied by each fuel source on an annual basis per 52 Pa. Code § 54.39(d).

- Applicant will be required to meet periodic reporting requirements as may be issued by the Commission to fulfill the Commission's duty under Chapter 28 pertaining to reliability and to inform the Governor and Legislature of the progress of the transition to a fully competitive electric market.

- d. **TRANSFER OF LICENSE:** The Applicant understands that if it plans to transfer its license to another entity, it is required to request authority from the Commission for permission prior to transferring the license. Notice of filing of this Application must be published in newspapers of general circulation covering each county in which the applicant intends to provide service. The newspapers in which proof of publication are required is dependent on the service territories the applicant is proposing to serve.

The chart below dictates which newspapers are necessary for each EDC. For example, an applicant that wants to operate in Penn Power would need to run ads in both *The Erie Times-News* and the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette*. I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

On July 6, 2010, Energy Advisory Service, LLC ("Applicant") filed a verified application with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") requesting a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant ("ABC") in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 454 ("Part 454"). The Administrative Law Judge requested additional information and clarification of certain matters contained in the Application. The Applicant filed a verified response indicating that it is licensed in Texas, Maryland and Washington D.C., and that it has had no complaints filed against it for its provision of services in the gas or electric industry. Applicant requests authority to offer services as an ABC for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

II. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS UNDER SECTION 16-115C OF THE ACT

Applicant is a business organized under the laws of Georgia and licensed to transact business in Illinois. Applicant has certified that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ABC. Applicant is required by Part 454.70 to demonstrate that it meets the technical qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the technical qualifications set forth in Part 454.70 with the information provided, including the information included in Attachment B and the response to the Administrative Law Judge. Attachment B includes an exhibit containing occupational background information on the person or persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.70(a).

Applicant further agrees to comply with the Code of Conduct for ABCs contained in Section 454.90.

IV. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the application and attachments along with the supplementary information provided by Applicant regarding the technical and managerial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 454 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements.

At the Administrative Meeting held July 1, 2009, the Public Service Commission granted Energy Advisory Service, LLC's application for a license to supply electricity or electric generation services in Maryland. The Commission further directed the Company to pay the assessments as calculated by Staff for the periods in which the Company operated in Maryland without a license. Finally, the Commission took under advisement the issue of whether to impose a civil penalty as recommended by Staff.

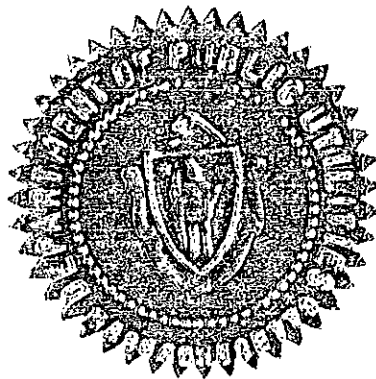

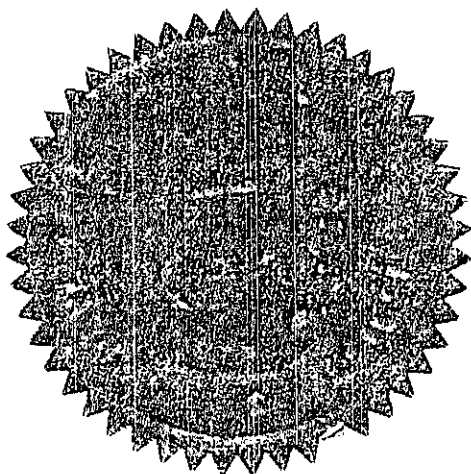

1. By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") grants Energy Advisory Service, LLC ("Energy Advisory" or "Applicant") licenses to function as an electricity and gas supplier in the District of Columbia.¹ Specifically, Energy Advisory intends to operate as a broker of electricity pursuant to Section 34-1505 of the "Retail Electric Competition and Consumer Protection Act of 1999" ("Act"),² and as a broker of natural gas pursuant to the licensing requirements set forth in GT 96-3, Order No. 12903.³ In both instances, the Applicant intends to serve commercial customers in the District of Columbia.

2. On February 12⁴ and 19,⁵ 2009, Energy Advisory filed its license applications. Pursuant to the Commission's licensing requirements as set forth in Formal Case No. 945, Order No. 11796, and Order Nos. 12709 and 12903 in GT 96-3,⁶ the Applicant provided the following information:

- a) Proof of technical and managerial competence;
- b) Affidavits of compliance with applicable Federal and District of Columbia environmental laws and regulations dated February 6 and 17, 2009;
- c) Proof of financial integrity to include financial statements;
- d) Proof that Energy Advisory has registered with the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs to do business in the District of Columbia;
- e) Affidavits that Energy Advisory is subject to all applicable taxes;
- f) Affidavits dated February 6 and 17, 2009, stating that Energy Advisory will comply with all the requirements of all orders and regulations of the Commission; and
- g) Energy Advisory's website address: www.energyadvisoryservice.com.

3. After a complete review of the applications and supplemental documentation,⁷ the Commission finds that granting Energy Advisory's applications will serve the public interest. The information contained in its applications, as well as the supplemental information submitted, demonstrates that the Applicant has the ability and the financial integrity to serve gas and electricity customers in the District of Columbia.

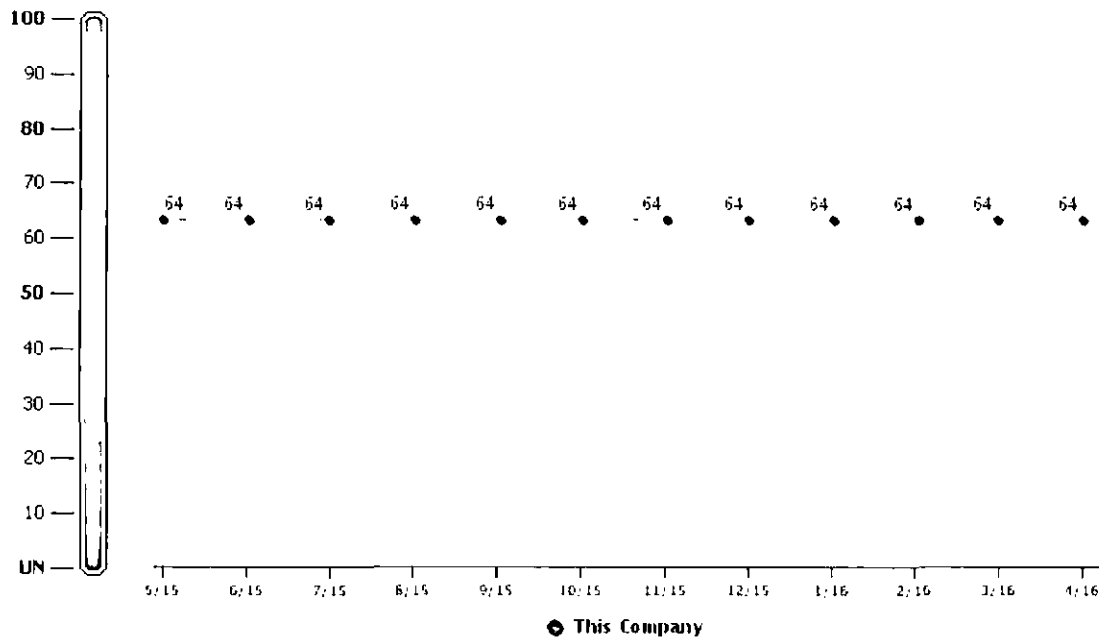

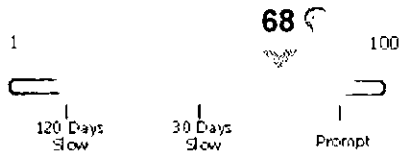

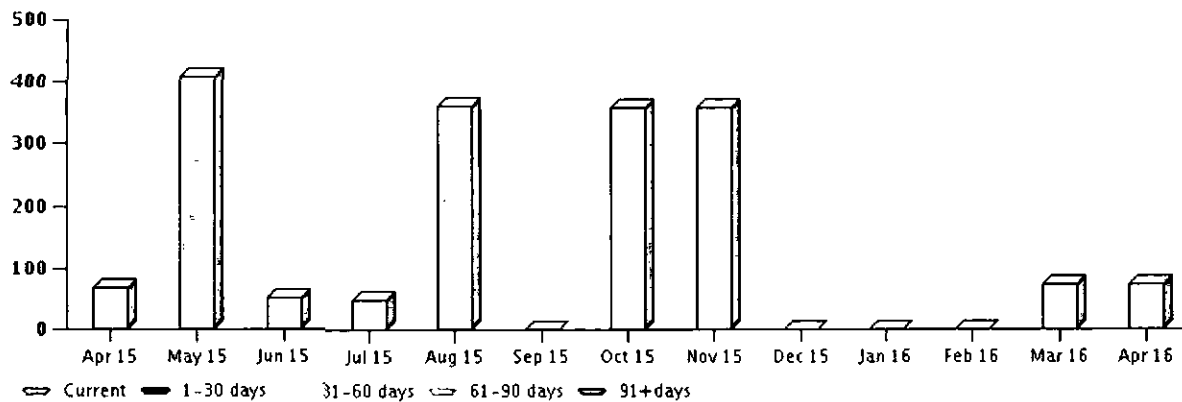
