

ORDER



BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission upon an application filed March 4, 2001. Public notice of the application was given in the Pennsylvania Bulletin of May 12, 2001. No protests were filed. The unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS:

The applicant is seeking an additional grant of authority to transport household goods in use service through a transfer of that authority from Anthony P. Mastrocco, which is currently certificated to provide that service.

The transferor has stated it no longer desires to provide the household goods in use service and is selling the intrastate authority for \$1.00. The reason the consideration is \$1.00 is that it is a father to son transfer.

A. Mastrocco, Jr. Moving & Storage, Inc., is presently certificated to transport property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania. It

has been certificated since October 20, 1999. Anthony P. Mastrocco, Jr. is president of the transferee. He has experience working in his fathers moving & storage business. Applicant has provided a balance sheet dated February 28, 2001, reporting total assets of \$403,196.50.00 and total liabilities of \$79,506.54.

The authority to be transferred has been operated by the transferor; therefore, it is presumed that there is a continuing need, which may be overcome only by evidence to the contrary. <u>In re: Byerly</u>, 440Pa. 521 (1970); <u>Hostetter v. Pa. P.U.C.</u>, 160 Super. Ct. 94 (1947) Since the record is void of any such evidence, this presumption of continuing public need applies in this transfer proceeding.

After complete review of the record, we find:

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- 1. The applicant has the experience and fitness to provide the proposed service.
- 2. Approval of the unopposed application for transfer of the authority is necessary for the continued accommodation and convenience of the public; **THEREFORE**,

IT IS ORDERED: That the application be and is hereby approved granting the following additional rights:

- 1. To transport as a common carrier, household goods in use, between points in the City and County of Philadelphia; and
- 2. To transport as a common carrier, household goods in use, from points in the City and County of Philadelphia, to points within an airline distance of fifty (50) miles of the Philadelphia City Hall.

subject to the following general conditions:

- 1. That the authority granted herein to the extent that it duplicates authority now held or subsequently granted to the applicant shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.
- 2. That the approval hereby given is not to be understood as committing the Commission, in any proceeding that may be brought before it for any purpose to fix a valuation on the property and/or rights to be acquired by applicant from the present certificate holder equal to the consideration to be paid therefor, or equal to any value that may be placed thereon by the applicant, or to approve or prescribe rates sufficient to yield a return thereon.

3. That the certificate holder shall not transfer, sell or in anyway convey any of its outstanding capital stock to any individual, partnership, corporation or any other entity, without the prior filing of an application and approval thereof by the Commission under Section (a) (3) of Title 66 Pa C.S.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation authorized by this order until the following is submitted to the Commission:

1. A tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with the requirements herein before set forth, a certificate shall issue evidencing the Commission's approval of the right to operate as above described.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with the requirements of this order, the authority granted to Anthony P. Mastrocco, under the certificate issued at A-00089292 shall be canceled and the record be marked closed.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of the service of this order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That you must demonstrate safety fitness by completing a Safety Fitness Review. You will be contacted by the Commission's Bureau of Transportation and Safety, which will schedule a review to be completed within 180 days of the date your certificate is issued. <u>Failure to submit to a Safety Fitness Review or</u> to attain a satisfactory evaluation will result in cancellation of the certificate.
