Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

Pursuant to Section 5.94(a) of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("Commission") regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.94(a), the Bureau of Investigation & Enforcement ("I&E") hereby withdraws the Complaint in the above-referenced case.

On May 16, 2016, I&E filed a Complaint alleging that American Life Ambulance LLC ("Respondent") failed to pay the Commission's assessment for the July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016 Fiscal Year ("2015-2016 Fiscal Year") pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(c), and file an assessment report stating revenues earned during the 2014 calendar year pursuant to 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b). I&E seeks the following relief in the Complaint: (1) payment of the outstanding assessment for the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year in the amount of \$42; (2) payment of a civil penalty in the amount of \$1,006 for violating 66 Pa.C.S. § 510(b)-(c); (3) revocation of Respondent's Certificate of Public Convenience; (4) referral to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regarding the suspension or revocation of automobile registrations; and (5) referral to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the outstanding assessment and civil penalty.

Further investigation reveals that by Secretarial Letter dated May 16, 2016 and docketed at C-2015-2469310 and A-6411689, the Commission stated that it had received notification that Respondent intends to abandon and discontinue its operating authority and, consequently, the Commission cancelled Respondent's Certificate of Public Convenience. Given these circumstances, I&E is withdrawing the Complaint in this proceeding.

A copy of this letter has been served on the parties of record. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94(a), a party may object to this letter-petition within ten (10) days of service. **Should Respondent agree with the withdrawal of I&E's Complaint, no action is required.**
