**RESPONSE:**

West York Borough does not have a copy of an approved Act 537 Official Sewage Facilities Plan dated May 4, 1986. The long-serving Borough Engineer, C.S. Davidson, Inc., provided the attached summary of plans and reports prepared by other governmental agencies that have been adopted or reviewed by West York Borough.

York City provided York Water with a copy of York City's Act 537 Official Sewage Facilities Plan, which is dated March 1999, as well as its October 2002 Special Update of York City's Act 537 Official Sewage Facilities Plan. In reviewing existing records, York Water could find no March 3, 2008 version of the Act 537 Official Sewage Facilities Plan. Both the March 1999 Act 537 Plan and October 2002 update are attached.

SUMMARY OF WEST YORK BOROUGH'S ACT 537 PLAN

The original public sewer system was built in 1933 and preexisted the requirements of the "Pennsylvania Sewage Facilities Act, P.L. 1535, No. 537." While no Act 537 Report for West York Borough has been prepared, several comprehensive/regional sewage facilities plans prepared by other governmental agencies have been adopted or reviewed by West York Borough. Records show the following previously prepared Act 537 Reports apply to West York Borough.



The March 1999 Act 537 Facilities Plan for the above listed municipalities and the four other municipalities served by the York City Wastewater Treatment Plant (the plant,) approved by Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection on May 24, 1999, included a Table 4-4 providing an estimate of 1997 annual average flows for each of the municipalities served by the plant, proposed 5-Year, 10-Year, 20-Year, and Ultimate Flows, and Flows Allocated under agreements between the York City Sewer Authority, owner and lessor of the plant, the City of York, lessee and operator of the plant, and the other municipalities served by the plant under terms of the agreements.

Since approval of the Plan, two agreements have changed the flow allocations. These changes are listed below.

An agreement between the City of York and Springettsbury Township dated March 19, 2002 transferred 500,000 gallons per day (gpd) of allocated capacity from City of York to Springettsbury Township. This transfer was made because a projected increase in flows in the Springettsbury Township system required additional capacity in the plant. The transfer leaves the City of York with adequate Allocated Flow to meet the Ultimate Proposed Flow.

An agreement between West Manchester Township and York Township dated February 25, 1999 transferred 1,200,000 gpd of allocated capacity from West Manchester Township to York Township. This transfer was made because a projected increase in flow in York Township required additional capacity in the plant. The transfer leaves West Manchester Township with adequate Allocated Flow to meet the Ultimate Proposed Flow.

Table 4-4 Revised in this report reflects the changes made by the agreements described above. Table 4-4 from the 1999 Update (marked obsolete) is included in this report for reference.

This revision documents changes in the intermunicipal agreements. No other impacts are anticipated to result from this change in the facilities plans of these municipalities.

**REVIEW AND RESPONSE TO COMMENTS ON DRAFT ACT 537 PLAN UPDATE**

## Summary of Review Including Comments Received and Response to Comments

During August 2002 a draft of the Act 537 Plan Update – Special Study was mailed to the all the associated municipalities, York County Planning Commission and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection asking for questions or comments. A written comment was received from the York County Planning Commission and an oral comment from Springettsbury Township. The engineering firm C.S. Davidson, Inc. who represents several of the municipalities commented that no exceptions were taken. These comments were addressed in the transmittal of the second draft of the Act 537 Plan Update – Special Study sent out in October 2002. Only one comment was received in response to the second draft from C.S. Davidson, Inc. The response indicated that no exceptions were taken. The final report is unchanged from the second draft.

Dear Mr. Strehl:

As requested, the staff of the York County Planning Commission have reviewed the proposed allocation amendments for the York City Wastewater Treatment Plant. In reviewing the proposed changes one area of concern was noted.

The narrative regarding the two agreements for transfer of flow, notes that both facilities transferring capacity will retain enough capacity to meet the Ultimate Proposed Flow. A review of the Revised Table 4-4 shows this to be incorrect. In transferring 500,000 gpd of capacity from the City of York to Springettsbury Township, the City is left with a deficit of 4,900 gpd to meet the Ultimate Proposed Flow of 8,085,000 gpd.

Additionally, the transfer of 500,000 gpd to Springettsbury Township gives the Township excess capacity in the amount of 500,000 gpd. Based on this information, it is recommended that the City of York not transfer the entire capacity of 500,000 gpd, but retain sufficient capacity to provide for the Ultimate Proposed Flow and additional capacity to meet unexpected flow requirements.

Based on this information, it is recommended that the City of York not transfer the entire capacity of 500,000 gpd, but retain sufficient capacity to provide for the Ultimate Proposed Flow and additional capacity to meet unexpected flow requirements.
