PREHEARING ORDER

The above-captioned matter is scheduled for a hearing on Tuesday, April 23, 2002, at 10:00 a.m. on the Plaza Level of the Commonwealth Keystone Building, 400 North Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. The parties are directed to comply with the following:

1. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§1.21 and 1.22, you may represent yourself, if you are an individual, or you may have an attorney represent you. However, if you are a partnership, **corporation**, trust, association or governmental agency or subdivision, **you must have an attorney represent you in this proceeding**. Unless you are an attorney, you may not represent someone else. Any attorney representing a party in this proceeding must enter an appearance in accordance with the Commission regulations at 52 Pa. Code §§1.24-.25.

2. If you wish to offer into evidence at the hearing material in the form of documents (letters, bills, canceled checks and the like), you should bring with you the required number of copies (two copies for the court reporter, one copy for the administrative law judge, one copy for every other party in the case, and one copy for yourself). 52 Pa. Code §5.409. Documents should be properly pre-marked for identification.

3. Be aware that there often is a delay in my receiving documents filed in Harrisburg. Therefore, serve me directly with any documents that you file in this proceeding. My address is Administrative Law Judge Debra Paist, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265.

4. In order to facilitate the conduct of the hearing, counsel for the applicant and counsel for the protestants are directed to confer in person or by telephone on or before April 10, 2002, and to exchange in writing or otherwise the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all witnesses they intend to have testify. In the course of conferring, counsel also shall informally request copies of any documents deemed relevant so that any such document(s) may be reviewed prior to, rather than during, the hearing. Information may be exchanged by telephone, fax or e-mail as necessary.

5. If you need to subpoena witnesses for the hearing, you should review 52 Pa. Code §5.421. You should submit your written application for subpoenas sufficiently in advance of the hearing so that the other parties will have the requisite ten days' notice to answer or object to your application, and so that you will have enough time to receive the subpoenas and serve them.

6. Protestants shall be prepared to present their direct case on April 23, 2002 immediately upon the conclusion of the presentation of the applicant's direct case. Failure to be so prepared may be deemed a waiver of the opportunity to present evidence.

7. A request for a change of the scheduled hearing date must be submitted in writing no later than five (5) days prior to hearing. Requests for changes of initial or subsequent hearings must be sent to the Administrative Law Judge, with copies to all parties of record. The

correct address is Administrative Law Judge Debra Paist, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265. Such changes are granted only in rare situations where good cause exists.

8. It is the Commission's policy to encourage settlements. 52 Pa. Code §5.231(a). You are urged to discuss among yourselves the possible settlement of this case at least one week before the hearing. If you are unable to settle this case, you may still resolve as many questions or issues as possible during your informal discussion.
