RE: Petition of PPL Electric Utilities Corporation for a Declaratory Order to Resolve Uncertainty Regarding Whether the Alternative Energy System Proposed by EPP Renewable Energy, LLC is Eligible to Receive Net Metering Public Utility Service from PPL Electric Utilities Corporation Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Code, the Alternative Energy Portfolio Standards Acts, Regulations and Orders Promulgated by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, and PPL Electric Utilities Corporation's Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission-Approved Tariff for Electric Service – Docket No. P-2016- 2574944

Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

EPP Renewable Energy, LLC (EPP) is in receipt of the petition referenced above. EPP wants to clarify it is not in a dispute with PPL Electric. In an effort not to waste the Commission's, PPL Electric's and everyone else's time on this matter, EPP was not intending to pursue this application any further after receiving its second denial from PPL Electric. EPP hereby rescinds its interconnection application to PPL Electric for this project at Wayne Township.

EPP requested in its last letter a face-to-face meeting with PPL Electric to discuss questions on our application as we understand this is a complex issue. Unfortunately, PPL Electric did not contact EPP for a meeting and instead issued its denial and this petition by letter only.

As there was no open discussion, EPP does want to state that there are various items in the petition that are inaccurate and should be clarified for the record. Here are a few of the more notable items:

- PPL Electric's A.32. As stated in its October 11, 2016 letter, EPP's on site load would exist whether the biomass generator exists or not.
- PPL Electric A.33.through 38. EPP was never seeking virtual meter aggregation. We are confused about this statement and the commentary?

- PPL Electric A.42. As stated in its October 11, 2016 letter, EPP's on site load would exist whether the biomass generator exists or not.
- PPL Electric A.45. EPP's proposed load that would be owned by EPP is greater than the amount stated.
- PPL Electric A.41 through 48. As stated in its letters, EPP would own independent load and would own the generators, separately from the landfill's operations. EPP would not be a third party generator for its own independent load.

Again, EPP does not wish to waste the Commission's or PPL Electric's time on this application. EPP reiterates that it hereby rescinds its interconnection application to PPL Electric for this project at Wayne Township.
