PASSENGER CARRIERS:

15 passengers or less: \$35,000 to cover liability for bodily injury, death or property damage incurred in an accident.

\$25,000 first party medical benefits, \$10,000 first party wage loss benefits and shall conform to 75 Pa. C.S. §§1701-1798 (relating to Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Law).

First party coverage of the driver of certificated vehicles shall meet the requirements of 75 Pa. C.S. §1711 (relating to required benefits).

16 to 28 passengers: \$1,000,000 to cover liability for injury, death or property damage incurred in an accident.

29 passengers or more: \$5,000,000 to cover liability for bodily injury, death or property damage incurred in an accident.

PROPERTY CARRIERS:

Bodily Injury: \$300,000 per accident per vehicle to cover liability for bodily injury, death or property damage incurred in an accident.

Insurance coverage of motor carriers of property shall meet the requirements of 75 Pa. C.S. §1701-1798 (relating to Motor Vehicle Financial Responsibility Law).

Cargo: \$5,000 for loss or damage to cargo carried on a motor vehicle.

No motor carrier shall operate or engage in any transportation until compliance with all of the above requirements and a certificate of public convenience has been issued authorizing actual operations. You are advised that any equipment to be used in rendering the service authorized under the certificate must be registered with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, Department of Transportation, as a bus or taxi. Motor carriers operating without complying with the above requirements will be subject to the penalty provisions of the Public Utility Code.

Commission regulations require compliance with all of the requirements within sixty (60) days of this letter. Failure to comply within the sixty- (60) day period will cause the Commission to rescind the action of November 10, 2005 and dismiss the application without further proceedings.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

This matter comes before the Commission on an application filed May 31, 2005. Public notice of the application was given in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* of September 10, 2005, with protests due by October 3, 2005. No protests were filed and no hearings were held. The unopposed application is certified to the Commission for its decision without oral hearing.

DISCUSSION AND FINDINGS

Williams Moving & Storage, Inc., t/a Park Centre Carriers, *et al.* (applicant, transferee or Williams) seeks to acquire all the household goods in use rights from Fife Moving & Storage Co., at Docket No. A-00094528. Applicant is currently certificated to transport property, excluding household goods in use, between points in Pennsylvania, and household goods in use. Transferee will operate from facilities located at 740 Commonwealth Drive, Warrendale, Butler County, Pennsylvania. Communications will be by regular telephone. Williams will utilize five (5) tractors, three (3) straight trucks, and seven (7) trailers. A comprehensive safety and maintenance program in effect.

Williams was granted a certificate of public convenience by the Commission on July 15, 2002, which authorized the transportation of property, between points in Pennsylvania. Since that time, Williams has operated pursuant to this grant of authority and pursuant to a grant of household goods authority from Beaver County to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa, issued by the Commission at Docket No. A-00119007, F. 2, on or about October 10, 2002. Williams has almost three years of experience in the household goods industry.

Barton B. Williams is the sole stockholder and president of the company. Dan Dominick is the Secretary/Treasurer. Mr. Williams' family has been providing transportation service by motor vehicles since about 1919. Mr. Williams has over 35 years of experience in the household goods industry, including day-to-day managerial responsibilities, marketing, sales, acquisition of equipment, employee relations and virtually every aspect of a moving company's operations. Mr. Williams has employees involved in supervision, sales and safety, and has equipment dedicated to providing service in the transportation of household goods in use.

The purchase price for the rights is \$5,000.00.

Applicant's most current balance sheet as of December 31, 2004 shows total current assets of \$157,606, total assets of \$159,606, total liabilities of \$82,008 and an owners' equity of \$77,598.

Williams has a Form E, evidence of bodily injury and property damage insurance and a Form H, evidence of cargo insurance, on file with the Commission to cover its current operations; however, the Commission requires the filing of a new Form E, to cover the grant of authority herein.

The authority to be transferred has been operated by the transferor; therefore, it is presumed that there is a continuing need, which may be overcome only by evidence to the contrary. In re: Byerly, 270 A.2d 186 (Pa. 1970); Hostetter v. Pa. P.U.C., 49 A.2d 862 (Pa. Super 1947). Since the record is void of any such evidence, this presumption of continuing public need applies in this transfer proceeding.

A review of the record before us indicates that the applicant possesses the requisite vehicles, technical expertise, experience, equipment, facilities, sufficient capital and other resources necessary to provide the proposed service.

We find:

1. The applicant is fit, willing and able to provide the service proposed.
2. By Order dated May 4, 2005, the Bankruptcy Court approved the sale to Parks Moving & Storage, Inc. ("Parks") of various assets of Transferor, including the PUC operating rights involved in this transfer application. Williams accepts liability of purchasing Fife Moving & Storage subject to Chapter 11 bankruptcy proceedings.

3. Transfer of the authority is in the public interest and is necessary for the continued accommodation and convenience of the public; **THEREFORE,**

IT IS ORDERED: That the application, be amended to include the following rights:

To transport, as a common carrier, household goods in use:

(1) between points in the borough of Houston, Washington County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough;

(2) from points in the borough of Houston, Washington County, and within ten (10) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa;

(3) between points in the borough of McDonald, Washington County, and within fifteen (15) miles by the usually traveled highways of the limits of said borough, and from points in said area to points in Pennsylvania, and vice versa; and

(4) between points in the county of Allegheny, and from points in said county, to points in the county of Beaver, and vice versa.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the applicant shall not engage in any transportation authorized by this order until the following is submitted to the Commission:

1. A new Form E, as evidence of bodily injury and property damage liability insurance.
2. A tariff establishing just and reasonable rates.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That the transfer application be and is hereby authority granted herein, to the extent that it duplicates authority now held by or subsequently granted to the applicant, shall not be construed as conferring more than one operating right.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That in the event said applicant has not, on or before sixty (60) days from the date of entry of this Order, complied with the requirements hereinbefore set forth, the application shall be dismissed without further proceedings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That you must demonstrate safety fitness by completing a Safety Fitness Review. You will be contacted by the Commission's Bureau of Transportation and Safety, which will schedule a review to be completed within 180 days of the

date your certificate is issued. Failure to submit to a Safety Fitness Review or to attain a satisfactory evaluation will result in cancellation of the certificate.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: That upon compliance with this Order, the right(s) granted the transferor, Fife Moving & Storage Co. at A-00094528, be canceled and the record be marked closed.
