Dear Ms Bentz:

I am in receipt of your letter of July 15, 1987. I received this letter on July 24, 1987. I have tried to appeal your decision since July 24 th in vain. Furthermore, I have been equally unsuccessful in reaching you via telephone. On July 27th, I was told by an employee of the Pa. P.U.C. in Harrisburg that the proper appeal forms would be mailed to me that same day. I never received them.

While it is true that I have requested the assistance of the P.U.C. in the past. It is not true that I did not abide by their decision. On this occasion, I paid Duquesne Light in excess of \$6,000.00. I certainly hope that you do not consider a monthly bill of approximately \$300.00 for a single family dwelling a fair usage bill. My home does not have Air Conditioning, nor does it have an unusual number of appliances, to which one would attribute this size bill. It is heated by gas, water baseboard radiators.


In the past ten years or so, I have made every effort to locate the cause of these ridiculously excessive bills. In one instance we dis-connected the main switch, thereby cutting off all power, the meter, however, continued to revolve. Since, we are not permitted access to Duquesne Light's lines or meter connections, and they chose to ignore our protests, nothing could be done to rectify the situation.

Since your decision calls for me to immediately pay \$900.00, followed by sizeable installments, it has placed my family completely at their mercy. Although, we informed their representative that our infant grand-daughter shares our home and would most certainly be harmed by any adverse action on their part, they are utilizing your most unfortunate decision to dis-connect our service.

I am Federal Expressing this letter to you personally, at 6:45 P.M. on August 3, 1987, due to the extreme urgency of the situation.
