P R O C E E D I N G S

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 2 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE KY VAN NGUYEN: Good  
 3 afternoon. We open the record for a hearing on the  
 4 complaint of Anthony Terrell versus the Philadelphia Gas  
 5 Works at Docket No. C-20065891. My name is Ky Van Nguyen.  
 6 I am Administrative Law Judge presiding at this hearing. I  
 7 will ask the parties to identify themselves for the record.

8 Mr. Terrell, can you tell for the record your  
 9 address, please?

10 MR. TERRELL: Anthony Terrell, 813 Marlyn  
 11 Road, Philadelphia, PA 19151.

12 JUDGE NGUYEN: Mr. Farinas.

13 MR. FARINAS: Laureto Farinas counsel's for  
 14 the Philadelphia Gas Works.

15 JUDGE NGUYEN: Did you reach any agreement?

16 MR. FARINAS: Yes, your Honor, fortunately,  
 17 the parties have reached an agreement concerning this  
 18 matter. The terms of the settlement arrangements of this  
 19 matter are as follows: This matter involves the amount of  
 20 \$4,498.09 for gas usage at 5637 Belmont Avenue in West  
 21 Philadelphia. This amount has been transferred to Mr.  
 22 Terrell's account at his current residence on Marlyn Road.  
 23 Through our negotiations, we found out there's an alleged  
 24 identity theft of Mr. Terrell's information, and it also  
 25 concerns the property, the Belmont Avenue address which he

1 currently is still, according to public records, has  
2 ownership of. Mr. Terrell has agreed to transfer from his  
3 current account for gas usage of Marlyn Raod of the amount  
4 of \$4,498.09 back to the account which he had had for the  
5 Belmont avenue Address 5637.

6 Mr. Terrell has agreed not to oppose PGW's  
7 liening that property, 5637 Belmont Avenue, for that amount,  
8 \$4,498.09. Mr. Terrell has agreed to take all of the  
9 information he has provided to PGW and other information  
10 regarding other matters involving his account and other  
11 accounts to report to the police, the Philadelphia Police,  
12 the identity they theft he has alleges to have occurred. As  
13 he states that he left the property, the Belmont Avenue  
14 address in 2000, but he has been charged for gas usage up to  
15 2004.

16 Mr. Terrell has also agreed to keep PGW posted  
17 on the outcome of the identify theft, so that in the event  
18 that there is a responsible party found, PGW may bill the  
19 appropriate party for that amount. In the event that the  
20 Belmont Avenue is successful in selling the Belmont address,  
21 the PGW will be paid as a result of the lien.

22 JUDGE NGUYEN: Did the theft actually occur?

23 MR. FARINAS: The theft was not gas theft, the  
24 theft was alleged identify theft, and unfortunately, your  
25 Honor, you are asking me for a factual finding.

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JUDGE NGUYEN: Of the police?

MR. FARINAS: Yes.

JUDGE NGUYEN: Is that agreeable to you?

MR. TERRELL: Yes.

MR. FARINAS: If I may, I left out one important line: Mr. Terrell is of the understanding that PGW is not forgiving him for the \$4,498.09 amount. We are simply taking precautions to protect both of us.

JUDGE NGUYEN: If the police report --

MR. FARINAS: Yes.

JUDGE NGUYEN: Is that agreed to you?

MR. TERRELL: Yes.

(Whereupon, at 2:22 p.m., the hearing was concluded.)
