3 JUDGE MICHAEL C. SCHNIERLE:

4 We're going to go on the record while I
5 try to contact the Claimant on the phone here. This
6 is Administrative Law Judge Michael Schnierle with the
7 Public Utility Commission of Pennsylvania. Is this
8 Janet Moore?

9 MS. MOORE:

10 Yes, it is.

11 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

12 All right. We're about to conduct the
13 hearing of your complaint against Capital City Cab
14 Company.

15 MS. MOORE:

16 Okay. I'll put you on the speakerphone.
17 Just a minute.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 Thank you.

20 MS. MOORE:

21 Okay.

22 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

23 All right. This is the time and place
24 set for hearing in the matter of Janet L. Moore versus
25 Capital City Cab Service, Incorporated. The Docket

1 Number is C 20030124. My name is Michael Schnierle.
2 I'm the Administrative Law Judge assigned to this
3 case. At this time I have on the conference phone
4 representing herself, Janet L. Moore. And Ms. Moore,
5 has your home address or phone number changed since
6 the last hearing?

7 MS. MOORE:

8 No, it has not.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 All right. And in the courtroom is Peter
11 Foster representing Capital City Cab Service,
12 Incorporated. At this time it is --- having heard
13 from the Complainant at the last hearing it is Capital
14 City Cab's opportunity to put on evidence. Mr.
15 Foster?

16 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

17 Judge, the various records that I want to
18 introduce into evidence. But more I simply wanted to
19 question her as to whether she received those
20 documents.

21 MS. MOORE:

22 Yes, I have and I have them. I have some
23 questions on those, too.

24 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

25 All right. Ms. Moore, let me ask you

1 this. Have you received the log sheets, what's
2 representing the log sheets from September 24th to
3 September 28th, 2002?

4 MS. MOORE:

5 Yes, I did.

6 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 All right. And did you receive from me
8 what is labeled the shop sheet for September 25th,
9 2002 and September 23rd, 2002?

10 MS. MOORE:

11 Yes, I did.

12 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

13 And did you receive a copy of what I
14 would refer to as an invoice from Carlisle Auto and
15 Truck Salvage, Incorporated dated ---?

16 MS. MOORE:

17 Huh?

18 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

19 Did you receive an invoice from ---?

20 MS. MOORE:

21 Hello?

22 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

23 Can you hear me?

24 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

25 Go ahead.

MS. MOORE:

I didn't hear you.

ATTORNEY FOSTER:

Can you hear me now?

MS. MOORE:

Yes. The phone went blank there for a few seconds.

ATTORNEY FOSTER:

Okay. Did you receive an invoice from Carlisle Auto and Truck Salvage, Incorporated dated December 26th, 2002?

MS. MOORE:

Yes, I did.

ATTORNEY FOSTER:

That's all I have, Judge.

JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

All right. Ms. Moore, you'll get a chance to ask questions about those as they're introduced.

MS. MOORE:

Okay.

JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

Mr. Foster?

ATTORNEY FOSTER:

All right. Judge, should I label these

1 exhibits first? I'm going to call the record keeper.

2 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

3 Well, we can do them as you go along if
4 you'd like. That's fine. Or label them first, take
5 a minute, either way. Why don't you label them first
6 actually. We'll go off the record for a few minutes
7 while Mr. Foster labels his exhibits.

8 MS. MOORE:

9 All right.

10 SHORT BREAK TAKEN

11 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

12 All right. I would now like to call the
13 record keeper.

14 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

15 All right.

16 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

17 Shirley Mohr is her name, M-O-H-N.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 Why don't we have her --- actually, why
20 don't you stay right there as a matter of fact,
21 because otherwise --- and try to move that. Let me
22 explain. The microphones don't work. You're going to
23 have to keep your voice up, Mr. Foster, and you'll
24 have to keep your voice up as well. All right.
25 Please stand and raise your right hand.

2 SHIRLEY MOHN, HAVING FIRST BEEN DULY SWORN, TESTIFIED
3 AS FOLLOWS:

5 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

6 Please be seated.

7 DIRECT EXAMINATION

8 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

9 Q. All right. State your full name, please, for the
10 record.

11 A. Shirley Mohn.

12 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

13 Could you spell that?

14 A. S-H-I-R-L-E-Y, M-O-H-N.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 Thank you.

17 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

18 Q. Keep your voice up. And you work for Capital City
19 Cab Service, Inc.?

20 A. Yes, I do.

21 Q. And in September 2002, were you acting as office
22 manager and record keeper for that organization?

23 A. Yes, sir.

24 Q. Okay. And as part of your duties, did you
25 maintain records of the log sheets and shop sheets?

1 A. Yes, we're required to.

2 Q. Okay. Now, can you explain what a log sheet is?

3 A. It's the trip where they pick them up, where they
4 take them to, what cab it is, what cab driver took the
5 fare. The mileage of the car, the car number, the
6 time they started working.

7 Q. And you're required to keep those log sheets
8 current and complete; is that correct?

9 A. Yes, sir.

10 Q. All right. Now, I'm showing you what is marked
11 Respondent's Group Exhibit One.

12 (Respondent's Exhibit Number One marked
13 for identification.)

14 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

15 Q. Please look through there, please. And I want to
16 ask you some questions about them. These are a group
17 exhibit. Look through the documents.

18 MS. MOORE:

19 Okay. Which one's that?

20 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

21 It's Number One, the log sheets, Ms.
22 Moore.

23 MS. MOORE:

24 Okay.

25 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

1 All right. Mr. Foster, do you have a
2 copy for me?

3 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

4 Yes. These are out of order, Judge, but
5 it's the 24th and the 25th.

6 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

7 Thank you.

8 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

9 Q. All right. Now, have you had a chance to inspect
10 group exhibit?

11 MS. MOORE:

12 Yes, I have.

13 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

14 No, no. He was asking --- hold on a
15 second. Ms. Moore, you have to listen while they're
16 presenting their evidence. When he's done examining
17 Ms. Mohn you'll get a chance to cross examine her, but
18 you've got to wait.

19 MS. MOORE:

20 Oh, I'm sorry. I thought you said Ms.
21 Moore.

22 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

23 No. All right.

24 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

25 Q. Maybe I should refer to her as Shirley.

1 A. That's fine.

2 Q. Shirley, are those copies of log sheets for
3 Capital City Cab for September 24th through September
4 28, 2002?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. All right. Now, what happened to the originals of
7 those documents?

8 A. The PUC's private investigator ---.

9 Q. Investigated it?

10 A. Yes, Mr. Kaufmann. I didn't have the copier
11 machine working at the time, it keeps breaking. So we
12 had to give him the original, he actually gave me this
13 copy, because he had the original. And he went and
14 recopied them for me when I asked him for a copy.

15 Q. You had given the originals to Mr. Kaufmann?

16 A. Yes, sir.

17 Q. You're stating that this is a copy of the original
18 that you gave Kaufmann?

19 A. Yes, sir.

20 Q. Okay. Have you had a chance to look through all
21 of those log sheets?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Okay. Does the cab number 838 appear anywhere on
24 those log sheets?

25 A. No, sir.

1 Q. Okay. Let me have that, please. All right. Now,
2 I'll show you Respondent's Exhibit Number Two, which
3 is labeled a shop sheet.

4 (Respondent's Exhibit Number Two marked
5 for identification.)

6 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 Q. That's a copy of the record; correct?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. Is that a shop sheet dated September 25th, 2002?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. Now, is the original of that record a
12 record which you would have maintained?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. What happened to the original?

15 A. I gave everything to the PUC --- Mr. Kaufmann
16 because we did not have the copier working at the
17 time.

18 Q. And he then gave you that copy?

19 A. He gave me these copies of everything back.

20 Q. Did he give you a copy of the shop sheet?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Now, I show you what is marked Respondent's --- RG
23 Number Three.

24 (Respondent's Exhibit Number Three marked
25 for identification.)

1 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

2 Q. That also is a shop sheet; is that correct?

3 A. Yes, sir. It's another shop sheet. They stopped
4 in, but the didn't get it fixed so they just wrote up
5 another sheet to have it fixed, because the mechanics
6 didn't get to it.

7 Q. All right. All I'm asking about the record is
8 what's the date on that record?

9 A. The 23rd.

10 Q. Of what?

11 A. September 23rd.

12 Q. 2002?

13 A. 2002.

14 Q. All right. And is that --- the original of that,
15 is that a record that you would maintain?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. And what happened to the original?

18 A. I gave it to Mr. Kaufmann.

19 Q. And he then gave you a copy?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. Do you recognize this signature, the mechanic name
22 on that?

23 A. Dwight Holiday.

24 Q. Exhibit Number Four, what is that?

25 (Respondent's Exhibit Number Four marked

- 1 for identification.)
- 2 A. That is an invoice for ---.
- 3 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:
- 4 Q. Speak up.
- 5 A. An invoice for a transmission for a '94 Intrepid.
- 6 Q. Coming from who?
- 7 A. Carlisle Auto and Truck Salvage.
- 8 Q. What's the date on it?
- 9 A. September 26, 2002.
- 10 Q. For what?
- 11 A. For a transmission.
- 12 Q. Okay. And do you recognize that handwriting on
- 13 that exhibit?
- 14 A. This is --.
- 15 Q. The handwriting.
- 16 A. Yeah. We write check numbers.
- 17 Q. Do you know whose handwriting that is?
- 18 A. The check number is written by the office, A38 was
- 19 written by me.
- 20 Q. A38 was what?
- 21 A. The cab number for the transmission that it goes
- 22 to.
- 23 Q. What happened to the original of this document?
- 24 A. Mr. Kaufmann has it.
- 25 Q. Did he give you this copy?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. All right. Are you familiar with --- how long
3 have you worked at Capital City Cab?

4 A. About three years.

5 Q. Speak up.

6 A. About three years.

7 Q. Okay. Now, in September of 2002, what was the
8 color of the Capital City cabs?

9 A. What was the colors?

10 Q. Yes.

11 A. We have all different colors.

12 Q. How many cab companies operated in Dauphin County
13 in September 2002?

14 A. Three, I believe, maybe four.

15 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

16 All right. Cross examine.

17 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

18 Before you do that, can you give me
19 copies of the other exhibits? Thank you. Ms. Moore,
20 it's now your turn to ask questions of Ms. Mohn.

21 MS. MOORE:

22 All right.

23 CROSS EXAMINATION

24 BY MS. MOORE:

25 Q. My first question is that on the log sheet, do you

1 always write cab number A38 or 38. Are there two
2 different cabs?

3 A. No. It just would be either --- we usually
4 reference the number or the A. It depends on who is
5 dispatching that day, ma'am.

6 Q. Okay. So on one day A38 would be different from
7 cab 38 then?

8 A. No.

9 Q. Okay. My other question is, in September were you
10 guys keeping logs?

11 A. I didn't hear you.

12 Q. In September of '02 were you guys keeping mileage
13 logs?

14 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

15 Were you keeping logs in September of
16 2002?

17 A. Yes.

18 BY MS. MOORE:

19 Q. Do you know why the owner of Capital City would
20 have told us in the first hearing that you guys did
21 not keep mileage logs or records of where the drivers
22 go?

23 A. No. Every driver goes directly from the airport
24 --- it doesn't matter where they leave from they need
25 to report to, by PUC law.

1 Q. I wonder why the owner wouldn't know that?

2 A. The owner was not even here that I was aware of.

3 Q. Okay. And then on September 23rd, the cab number
4 five it started at 20,959 miles at 6:38 and then at
5 5:12 another the record reported of having 392,000
6 miles. Can you explain the mileage?

7 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

8 Can you give us that again?

9 BY MS. MOORE:

10 Q. On September 23rd cab number five ---.

11 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

12 Just give us a minute.

13 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

14 What was that date again, Ms. Moore?

15 MS. MOORE:

16 September 23rd on the mileage log.

17 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

18 I only have --- are you saying September
19 23rd?

20 MS. MOORE:

21 23rd.

22 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

23 I only sent her the 24th through the
24 28th.

25 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

1 We've only

2 MS. MOORE:

3 Well, I've got the 23rd through the 28th.

4 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

5 Oh. We've got the 24th through the 28th.

6 MS. MOORE:

7 Okay.

8 BY MS. MOORE:

9 Q. Then on September 24th, cab A8 was posted of
10 132,590 miles, same day, same cab three hours later
11 had 195,199, which is over 62,000 miles in three
12 hours.

13 A. This dispatcher could have made a mistake in the
14 cabs, ma'am.

15 Q. On number two?

16 A. No. I doubt that, ma'am. What it is is when they
17 call the mileage in somebody must have switched cabs
18 because he might have went home for the afternoon, he
19 might have been sick, he might have gave the cab to
20 somebody else and somebody else came back out in that
21 cab.

22 Q. But it's the same cab with over 62,000 miles in
23 three hours?

24 A. And what I'm saying is maybe the dispatcher made a
25 mistake in the mileage when they were writing, because

1 that sometimes that happens even to me when I
2 dispatch.

3 Q. But there was no way you could have miswritten the
4 cab number, but you could miswrite the mileage?

5 A. It could be, ma'am, but I don't see that
6 happening, because we usually know what cab we give to
7 everybody before they leave.

8 Q. Okay. And then on September 25th, same kind of
9 deal, cab number 99 started out at 40,559 miles and on
10 the same day at another time it's listed as 409,062.

11 ATTORNEY FOSTER:
12 Which number cab?

13 MS. MOORE:
14 99.

15 A. That's another operator, ma'am. Maybe he just
16 called in his mileage twice or something. I'm not
17 sure, but we don't have that vehicle.

18 BY MS. MOORE:

19 Q. So that was written down incorrectly also?

20 A. I have no idea, ma'am. I can't speak on what the
21 dispatcher wrote.

22 Q. Okay.

23 A. You've got to question that dispatcher.

24 Q. Okay. Then on --- let's go back to 9/25, cab
25 number eight goes 185,343 at 5:39 and then on 9/26,

1 which is 24 hours later got 195,475, over 10,000 miles
2 on it. Now I don't know, but he's driving pretty
3 fast.

4 A. I don't know what to tell you, ma'am. I'm not the
5 dispatcher. I don't know why they write the wrong
6 numbers but it happens to everybody, but not the cabs.

7 Q. But not on the cab numbers. I see.

8 A. The cab numbers we can't make a mistake. They
9 have to come get the keys from us. There's a list of
10 who gets what cab. So I don't see them making a
11 mistake on what cab somebody is in.

12 Q. Yeah, that probably happens, too. And on the shop
13 sheet it says cab number 38, you said you don't
14 miswrite the cab numbers?

15 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

16 Which shop sheet is this?

17 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

18 Which exhibit number?

19 MS. MOORE:

20 Both of them, 9/23 and 9/25.

21 A. Actually the shop sheets, the managers fill them
22 out for the driver, they don't fill them out
23 themselves.

24 BY MS. MOORE:

25 Q. So the cab number 38 is not A38 or it is A38?

1 A. It's the only 38 cab that we have. It's the same
2 cab. We just use the 38. We just don't use the A in
3 them our office because there's no need for us, but
4 for the public there is because there's more than one
5 cab company.

6 Q. Okay. Well, I'm not going to sit and argue about
7 it. But my next question is, on the Carlisle Auto and
8 Truck you say Mr. Kaufmann has the original?

9 A. Yes, I believe so.

10 Q. I think that would be interesting to see because I
11 put a call in to Carlisle Auto because at the top
12 right-hand corner it's stamped September 26th, 2002.
13 There's no reference number, no date, no time the
14 receipt was run through the computer. Now, the owner
15 told me that all the receipts are computerized. There
16 is a reference number to type to, so if --- how they
17 would get it by their reference number. So can you
18 explain why there's a stamped on date?

19 A. No, I don't. I can't.

20 Q. You can?

21 A. No, I can't.

22 MS. MOORE:

23 I don't have any further questions.

24 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

25 Just to make this point, the two

1 questions I have. There's --- none of these entries
2 on the logs show where the passenger was picked up and
3 dropped off.

4 A. This one was just the mileage ---

5 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

6 All right.

7 A. --- sheets for the dates. That's what she asked
8 for.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 Okay. Where are these --- were these
11 repairs supposedly done that are shown on the shop
12 sheets?

13 A. They're done at Capital City Cab.

14 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

15 In other words, this is not an
16 independent garage or anything like that?

17 A. Excuse me?

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 Not an independent garage?

20 A. No.

21 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

22 And the mechanics' names, it's something
23 how?

24 A. The first one is Dwight Holiday. And he actually
25 looked at the cab and he didn't do anything with it.

1 And actually Donald's here. Donald is the one that
2 fixed the cab.

3 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

4 All right. Mr. Foster, do you have any
5 Redirect?

6 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 No, Your Honor. But to qualify the next
8 witness, who would be Donald Hodges, I'd like to ask
9 Ms. Moore one question.

10 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

11 Well, hold on a second. Do you move for
12 admission of your exhibits?

13 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

14 Yes.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 Do you object to the admission of the
17 exhibits, Ms. Moore?

18 MS. MOORE:

19 Yes, we do.

20 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

21 On what grounds?

22 MS. MOORE:

23 Well, I believe that the Carlisle Auto
24 has been altered, which the owner has clarified that
25 for me. And then on the mileage logs, in the first

1 hearing the owner of Capital City Cab told us they do
2 not keep logs on mileage or anything that the drivers
3 do.

4 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

5 I'm going to overrule those objections,
6 but I'll take your comments into account when writing
7 the decision.

8 MS. MOORE:

9 Okay.

10 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

11 The exhibits are admitted. Mr. Foster,
12 you wanted to ask Ms. Moore a question?

13 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

14 Ms. Moore, you received my recent Federal
15 Express packet; is that correct?

16 MS. MOORE:

17 I received one where you asked to have a
18 mechanic subpoenaed. That's the last one I received.

19 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

20 All right. So there's an indication that
21 I want to call Donald Hodges as a mechanic.

22 MS. MOORE:

23 Like I said, the last thing I got was
24 asking the Judge to subpoena him for you.

25 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

1 Donald Hodges?

2 MS. MOORE:

3 Yes.

4 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

5 Your Honor, I am not introducing him
6 pursuant to a subpoena. He is here voluntarily. But
7 I would like to call him in connection with this case.

8 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

9 That's fine. Ms. Mohn, you can just sit
10 in the back now if you like. Please raise your right
11 hand.

12 -----

16 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

17 Please be seated. Mr. Foster?

18 DIRECT EXAMINATION

19 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

20 Q. Please speak up. State your full name, please,
21 for the record.

22 A. Donald A. Hodges.

23 Q. Okay. Mr. Hodges, what kind of work do you do?

24 A. I'm a technician.

25 Q. Okay. Could that be referred to as a mechanic?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Speak up now, please. In September of 2002, were
3 you working as an mechanic?

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. Okay. Now, did you have a number of jobs as a
6 mechanic?

7 A. Yes.

8 Q. In September of 2002 was one of your jobs as a
9 mechanic for Capital City Cab Company?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. And that was done at 362 South Front
12 Street, Steelton?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. That's the main headquarters now and at that time
15 for Capital City Cab Company; is that correct?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Okay. And are there garages and service bays to
18 service these mechanics to do work down there as well
19 as the cabs?

20 A. Yes, sir.

21 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

22 Mr. Hodges, I should have asked you this
23 before, would you spell your last name for the record?

24 A. H-O-D-G-E-S.

25 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

1 Thank you.

2 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

3 Q. All right. Now, Mr. Hodges, speak up, please.
4 I'm showing you what's marked Respondent's Exhibit
5 Number Two, which is the shop sheet with what date on
6 it?

7 A. The date is 9/25/02.

8 Q. 2002. Is there a reference to a cab number on
9 there?

10 A. Yes, there is, 38.

11 Q. Okay. And what other writing appears on that
12 exhibit?

13 A. That it needs a transmission and that the
14 transmission is ordered from Carlisle Salvage.

15 Q. Okay. Now, it has a notation of transmission on
16 there; is that right?

17 A. Yes, it does.

18 Q. And what does it say beside transmission? Beside
19 transmission.

20 A. Transmission is not shifting, never did if you're
21 driving. It's going to overheat if you got about one
22 mile or less.

23 Q. Does it say it needs a transmission?

24 A. It definitely needs one.

25 Q. And down at the bottom there's a mechanic's name;

1 is that right?

2 A. Yes, my signature.

3 Q. Is that document familiar to you?

4 A. Yes. I wrote this up.

5 Q. Okay. Now I'll show you what's marked

6 Respondent's Exhibit Number Three, which is what?

7 A. It's a shop sheet.

8 Q. Okay. Do you have any familiarity with that

9 document? Have you seen it before?

10 A. Yes, I have.

11 Q. Okay. Do you recognize the name at the bottom?

12 A. Yes, sir.

13 Q. Okay. What's that name?

14 A. Holiday.

15 Q. Okay. What duties did he have with Capital City

16 in September of 2002?

17 A. He would be the one that would be replacing the

18 transmission and replacing engines.

19 Q. What's the date on that exhibit?

20 A. The date on this exhibit is 9/23/02.

21 Q. All right. And this is reference to cab 38; is

22 that right?

23 A. Yes, sir.

24 Q. And there's a check for transmission; is that

25 correct?

1 A. Yes, sir.

2 Q. What does that mean?

3 A. That means that the transmission needs to be
4 checked and there's something wrong with it.

5 Q. Okay. You've checked the calendar as to what day
6 September 25, 2002 is; is that right?

7 A. That's right.

8 Q. What day of the week was that?

9 A. Wednesday.

10 Q. So you would have come in for your job and worked
11 for Capital City on that date?

12 A. Yes, sir. They called me to come in and check the
13 transmission on this vehicle.

14 Q. All right. Do you know anything at all about
15 ordering the transmission for that vehicle?

16 A. I knew about it after he ordered it because he
17 told me he ordered it, that's why I seen this work
18 order.

19 Q. Who's he?

20 A. The owner.

21 Q. What's his name?

22 A. Daniel Salon.

23 Q. Seated right beside you?

24 A. Yes, sir.

25 Q. Did he tell you where he ordered that transmission

1 from?

2 A. Yes, sir.

3 Q. Where?

4 A. Carlisle Salvage.

5 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

6 All right. Cross examine.

7 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

8 Ms. Moore, do you have any questions
9 you'd like to ask Mr. Hodges?

10 MS. MOORE:

11 Yeah, I do.

12 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

13 Go ahead.

14 CROSS EXAMINATION

15 BY MS. MOORE:

16 Q. One of my questions is on the shop sheet. You say
17 the owner is there, too.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 We missed your last word.

20 BY MS. MOORE:

21 Q. You say the owner was there to okay --- did he
22 tell you to do these?

23 A. Ma'am, whenever I order --- I check out a vehicle
24 I go to the owner and I let him know what it needs.

25 Q. Okay. So can you clarify why Shirley stated

1 earlier that he was out of town in September?

2 A. I have his home phone, his pager and his cell
3 phone.

4 Q. Well, he was out of the country?

5 A. Don't matter to me. I still called him. He told
6 me whenever I needed something to call him.

7 Q. This is high terror.

8 MS. MOORE:

9 No further questions.

10 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

11 Mr. Hodges, I've got a couple of
12 questions I'd like to ask you. I take it from your
13 testimony you work --- you have another job besides
14 working for Capital City Cab?

15 A. Yes, sir, L.B. Smith.

16 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

17 Is it also a mechanic's job?

18 A. Yes, sir.

19 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

20 Okay. And do you still do work for
21 Capital City Cab Company?

22 A. Yes, sir.

23 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

24 Now, after the transmission was bought,
25 who would have put it in?

1 A. John.

2 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

3 Would that be Holiday?

4 A. Yes, sir.

5 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

6 When he put it in would there have been
7 one of these created?

8 A. I've been trying to get them to create them after
9 they do them. Sometimes they don't. A lot of times
10 they just write down on a note or something and let me
11 know if it's done.

12 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

13 All right. To your knowledge does
14 Capital City Cab --- this is something I'm just
15 curious about. Does Capital City Cab own the cabs
16 themselves?

17 A. Yes, sir.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 All right. Mr. Foster, Redirect?

20 REDIRECT EXAMINATION

21 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

22 Q. Mr. Holiday no longer works for Capital City;
23 correct?

24 A. Yes, sir.

25 Q. When you say yes, do you mean he does not work

1 there at Capital City?

2 A. Yes. He does not work for Capital City.

3 Q. Do you know where he is?

4 A. Not offhand.

5 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

6 That's all I have.

7 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

8 All right. Anything more, Ms. Moore?

9 MS. MOORE:

10 No, that's it.

11 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

12 All right. Mr. Hodges, are you working

13 for Capital City today or at L.B. Smith?

14 A. Right now I'm at L.B. Smith.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 Do you still need him here?

17 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

18 I'd like to clarify that question if I

19 could, Judge.

20 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

21 Q. I would like to excuse you, but you still work for
22 Capital City; is that right?

23 A. I work for Capital City when ---.

24 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

25 I understood that. But I just want to

1 know whose payroll he was on.

2 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

3 Yes. I would like to excuse him.

4 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

5 All right. Mr. Hodges you may go back to
6 L.B. Smith. Thank you.

7 A. Thank you.

8 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

9 Mr. Foster?

10 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

11 Judge, I'd like to ask Ms. Moore a
12 question.

13 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

14 Go ahead.

15 MS. MOORE:

16 Okay.

17 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

18 All right. Ms. Moore, this cab that you
19 were riding in on September 25th, 2002, is the subject
20 of your complaint ---

21 MS. MOORE:

22 Uh-huh (yes).

23 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

24 --- do you recall what color it was?

25 MS. MOORE:

1 Yes, it was white with blue writing.

2 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

3 You're sure it wasn't yellow?

4 MS. MOORE:

5 I'm positive it wasn't yellow. The
6 second cab that picked us up was a yellow cab. The
7 first one was white with blue writing. It's not
8 something I'm going to forget.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 Mr. Foster, you want to take a recess?

11 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

12 If I could just have a short break.

13 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

14 All right. We're going to have a ten-
15 minute recess and then we'll start in again.

16 MS. MOORE:

17 Okay.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 Ms. Moore, just stand by. He wants to
20 talk to his client for a minute off the record.

21 MS. MOORE:

22 Okay.

23 SHORT BREAK TAKEN

24 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

25 All right. We're back on the record.

1 Mr. Foster?

2 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

3 Judge, I ask the court's indulgence to
4 recall Shirley Mohn, the record keeper, office
5 manager ---

6 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

7 That's fine.

8 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

9 --- to identify the color of the cab in
10 question.

11 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

12 All right. Fine. Recall her. Ms. Mohn,
13 you're still under oath in the proceeding.

14 -----
15 SHIRLEY MOHN, PREVIOUSLY SWORN, RECALLED TO TESTIFY:

16 -----
17 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

18 Mr. Foster.

19 REDIRECT EXAMINATION

20 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

21 Q. Ms. Mohn, again, you were the office manager at
22 Capital City Cab in September of 2002; is that right?

23 A. Yes, sir.

24 Q. And you are currently office manager?

25 A. Yes, sir.

1 Q. You're familiar with this case; is that correct?

2 A. Yes, sir.

3 Q. Are you familiar with cab 38, which is sometimes
4 referred to as A38?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. Have you seen it?

7 A. Many a times. It was having a lot of mechanical
8 problems.

9 Q. Could you observe it in 2002?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. And have you observed it recently?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Do you know what the color of that cab was in
14 September of 2002?

15 A. It is a goldish like tan --- like a golden color,
16 like maybe between gold --- you know, like a darker
17 gold, something sort of what you have on but it's
18 lighter.

19 Q. You're going to have to explain it, Ms. Mohn, for
20 the record.

21 A. It's a goldish color, like a brown.

22 Q. Tan?

23 A. Yeah. It's a gold car. It's like a gold.

24 Q. Does it have lettering on it?

25 A. Yes, sir.

1 Q. What is the color of the lettering?

2 A. White.

3 Q. Was that the color of the cab in September of
4 2002?

5 A. Yes, sir.

6 Q. Have you seen that cab recently?

7 A. Yes, sir.

8 Q. What's the color of the cab and the lettering now?

9 A. The same as it was before.

10 Q. Which is what?

11 A. The goldish color with the white lettering.

12 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

13 Your Honor, we're going to request the
14 court's indulgence. We're in the process right now of
15 taking photographs of that cab. And we'd ask for a
16 two-hour delay where we could submit into the record
17 the photographs of that cab with a witness to Ms. Mohn
18 to testimony regarding it.

19 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

20 Well, let's hold on. I want to hear her
21 cross examination first and I've got a couple of
22 questions. Ms. Moore, do you have any questions of
23 this witness now?

24 MS. MOORE:

25 Yes, I have.

1 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

2 Go ahead.

3 RECROSS EXAMINATION

4 BY MS. MOORE:

5 Q. Shirley, how many cabs does the company have?

6 A. We have about 50.

7 Q. About 50. And you know exactly the color of cab

8 A38?

9 A. I know every cab just about.

10 Q. Do you ever switch numbers?

11 A. No, we do not.

12 Q. Okay. My next question is, when did you start
13 working for Capital City?

14 A. I started working for Capital City about three
15 years ago, ma'am.

16 Q. Okay. And then you've never painted any of your
17 cars?

18 A. I'm sorry?

19 Q. Have you ever painted any of the cabs?

20 A. We haven't painted any of the vehicles unless they
21 were a really dark color. If they were black we would
22 try to change them to white for a makeover. We never
23 changed anything other than black or white.

24 Q. So there is a possibility that there is a white
25 cab with blue writing?

1 A. Excuse me?

2 Q. There is a possibility that you have a cab that's
3 white with blue writing?

4 A. No, ma'am, we do not use blue with our colors
5 whatsoever. The lettering unit, it's from black or
6 white only.

7 Q. So ---.

8 A. And I can get that verified through Fesson,
9 (phonetic). That's where we order our lettering kit.

10 Q. My question is, so the sticker that was in the
11 window of the car that we were in that said A38 and it
12 was white, and you're saying there was no way it was
13 you guys?

14 A. No, ma'am. And I didn't bring the driver that
15 rode in a car a year ago and tell you when he was
16 having problems with the car he switched to a
17 different cab. And he's going to tell the same thing,
18 what color the car is, everything. It has never
19 changed. It's still sitting in the garage.

20 Q. The driver we had did not speak English.

21 A. Okay.

22 Q. And we know what cab we were in, what color it
23 was. You can bring in pictures, but --- you know,
24 but ---.

25 A. There was other companies that use blue lettering,

1 ma'am.

2 Q. We got your phone number from the window. I mean,
3 we got all of our information on the window of that
4 cab. And that's when we went to.

5 A. There is other cab companies that use the letter A
6 as well, ma'am. It's not just our vehicles.

7 MS. MOORE:

8 No further questions.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 Ms. Mohn, on these sheets does Capital
11 City Cab keep logs that show the origin and
12 destination of each trip?

13 A. Yes, sir.

14 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

15 And does Capital City own all of its
16 cabs?

17 A. Capital City and there are some drivers that work
18 for us that own their vehicles through Capital City,
19 but he owns all the vehicles.

20 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

21 Well, what do you mean by the last thing?

22 A. There's like the contracts on them. Somebody can
23 buy the cab to own it, but it's in Capital City's
24 name, so technically he owns all the vehicles.

25 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

1 And does Capital City Cab furnish meters
2 for all the vehicles?

3 A. Yes, sir. He provides the meters, the lettering,
4 the radio, every kit for the cabs.

5 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

6 And if repairs have to be done on one of
7 these cabs that's one of the driver's bought, they are
8 also done at the cab company?

9 A. Most of the time. Yes, sir.

10 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

11 And does Capital City Cab have to
12 receive --- do they receive a --- some sort of
13 approval from the airport to wait there for
14 passengers?

15 A. Yes, sir.

16 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

17 If you didn't have that approval what
18 would happen?

19 A. The cab driver just wouldn't work the airport.

20 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

21 The airport wouldn't let them sit there?

22 A. They would work technically like generally what we
23 do now.

24 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

25 In other words if somebody --- if I were

1 to paint my car like a cab and drive up in front of
2 the airport, the airport police would throw me out?

3 A. Yes, sir.

4 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

5 Do you know what cab companies are ---
6 have that kind of permission?

7 A. At the present or before?

8 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

9 Before, not ---.

10 A. At the present West Shore Yellow Cab, Capital
11 City, Penn Central, Keystone.

12 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

13 All have that authorization?

14 A. They all have the permission to work there.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 And do you know if that was true in
17 September of 2002?

18 A. Yes, sir.

19 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

20 All right. Mr. Foster, any Redirect?

21 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

22 No, Your Honor.

23 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

24 Ms. Moore, the cab you were in, did it
25 have a meter in it?

1 MS. MOORE:

2 Yes, it did.

3 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

4 All right. Mr. Foster, if you want
5 to --- you want to recess for two hours and offer a
6 picture of the cab?

7 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

8 Yes, sir.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 Well, let me ask. Are all the cabs
11 painted the same color?

12 A. No. Usually when they check them --- they get
13 them from the dealer and we just check and make sure
14 that there's nothing wrong with the car. We install
15 the radio, the meter and put lettering on them. We
16 don't usually change the colors unless it's abnormal
17 color that just doesn't look right as a cab.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 All right. Let's see. Tell you what.
20 Ms. Moore, are you going to be around this afternoocn?

21 MS. MOORE:

22 Yes, I will.

23 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

24 All right. We'll --- let me ask. You
25 don't have an afternoon thing?

1 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

2 I do have to be at a hearing at 2:30.

3 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

4 Well, what time are you planning on doing
5 this?

6 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 I should be able to ---.

8 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

9 All right. We're off the record. We're
10 off the record for a minute.

11 OFF RECORD DISCUSSION

12 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

13 We'll recess until 1:00. And we'll
14 reconvene at 1:00. Ms. Moore, do you have a fax
15 machine?

16 MS. MOORE:

17 Yes, I do.

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 Can you give Mr. Foster your fax number?
20 It won't --- what you'll get won't be in color now,
21 but at least it will be --- you'll be able to see what
22 they're putting in to evidence.

23 MS. MOORE:

24 Are we going to have the cab number for
25 the record so we can see it on the pictures?

1 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

2 Pardon me?

3 MS. MOORE:

4 On the picture, if you can, is there
5 going to be a legible ---?

6 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 Yes. We're going to take two to three
8 pictures of the entire cab.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 I'm not admitting anything yet, but I
11 want him to be able to send you a copy, so ---.

12 MS. MOORE:

13 Okay. I'm just saying color of cab has
14 changed.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 Hold on. We're off the record.

17 SHORT RECESS TAKEN

18 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

19 We are back on the record. Mr. Foster?

20 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

21 Judge, the initial photographs, can I
22 mark them as RG Exhibit Number Five?

23 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

24 Yes, Respondent.

25 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

1 Okay. Respondent's Five.

2 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

3 RG Five.

4 (Respondent's Exhibit Number Five marked
5 for identification.)

6 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

7 All right. Judge, I would now like to
8 call the witness who took the photographs.

9 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

10 All right. Please stand and raise your
11 right hand.

12 -----

13 LINDA LOU BELLE, HAVING FIRST BEEN DULY SWORN,
14 TESTIFIED AS FOLLOWS:

15 -----

16 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

17 And you'll have to keep your voice up,
18 please. You may be seated. Mr. Foster?

19 DIRECT EXAMINATION

20 BY ATTORNEY FOSTER:

21 Q. You're going to have to speak up loud, because the
22 court reporter is having trouble hearing the
23 witnesses. Okay? Very loudly state your full name,
24 please, for the record. Spell your last name.

25 A. Linda Lou Belle, B-E-L-L-E.

1 Q. Nice and loud.

2 A. Linda Lou Belle, B-E-L-L-E.

3 Q. All right. Now, what is your position with
4 Capital City Cab? You do actual work dispatching work
5 for Capital City Cab?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Today you took photographs of certain substance;
8 is that right?

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. What did you take photographs of?

11 A. 38 cab.

12 Q. 38 cab?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Speak up. And do you have four photographs in
15 front of you marked Group Exhibit Five?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Those are the original photographs?

18 A. Yes. I just took them.

19 Q. Did you take them?

20 A. Yes.

21 Q. All right. Now, how long have you worked for
22 Capital City?

23 A. Three years, no more than three years.

24 Q. And have you seen that particular cab, cab 38, on
25 previous occasions?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. What is the color of it?

3 A. Like a silverish gray.

4 Q. And does it have lettering on it?

5 A. It has white lettering.

6 Q. Those photographs --- did you look at it as you
7 took those photographs today?

8 A. Yes.

9 Q. All right. On the original photographs they
10 appear to be bluish; is that right?

11 A. Like a bluish gray.

12 Q. So it's slightly distorted; is that right?

13 A. Yes.

14 Q. Can you explain that? Does it have anything to do
15 with the lighting?

16 A. It might have been the lighting, because we were
17 in a small part of the garage. And I opened up the
18 door. There wasn't a lot of light to see.

19 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

20 Cross examine.

21 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

22 Ms. Moore, do you have any questions
23 you'd like to ask the witness?

24 MS. MOORE:

25 Yes, I have one question.

1 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

2 Go ahead.

3 CROSS EXAMINATION

4 BY MS. MOORE:

5 Q. You said the color of the car in the picture --- I
6 can't see it, the pictures, because they come out
7 black. I mean, all I see --- you said the color is
8 silverish gray?

9 A. Yeah, like a silver gray.

10 Q. So do you know why Shirley would have said it was
11 a golden brown color?

12 A. I'm sorry?

13 Q. Shirley testified earlier that A38 was a goldish
14 brown color.

15 A. It's a silverish gray. It's like --- it's an
16 older --- like a darker gray color like, like silver
17 and white.

18 MS. MOORE:

19 Okay. I have no further questions.

20 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

21 All right. Ms. Moore, would you want the
22 company to send you copies, color copies of the
23 pictures?

24 MS. MOORE:

25 You know what, Judge, it really has no

1 relevance to me. I know what cab we were in.

2 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

3 All right. Mr. Foster, anything further?

4 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

5 I'd offer Group Exhibit Five into
6 evidence, Your Honor.

7 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

8 Any objection to Group Exhibit Five?

9 MS. MOORE:

10 Just what I stated earlier.

11 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

12 All right. It's admitted and I'll take
13 that --- your position into account.

14 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

15 We rest, Your Honor.

16 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

17 All right. Ms. Moore, do you have any
18 further testimony you want to put on at this time?

19 MS. MOORE:

20 No more testimony.

21 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

22 All right.

23 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

24 I have decided not to submit a brief,
25 Your Honor.

1 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

2 Okay. All right. Let me explain, Ms.
3 Mocre, what happens at this point. If you'd like to
4 you can submit a brief, although it's not necessary.
5 And since the --- Capital City Cab doesn't want to
6 file a brief I'd recommend against it.

7 I have to write a decision. And the
8 decision will be served on both sides by the
9 Commission's Secretary. And it's sent out with a
10 letter. And it's important to read the letter,
11 because essentially what the letter --- if either side
12 is unhappy with the decision they have a right to
13 appeal it to the Commission. And you do that by
14 filing exceptions. And the exceptions are not ---
15 don't have to be in any particular form, they just
16 have to state where you disagree with the decision.
17 And the letter will tell you that you have so many
18 days within which to file the exceptions.

19 So if you decide you don't like what
20 I've --- don't like the decision and you want to
21 appeal it, you have to file the exceptions within the
22 time period set forth in the letter. And if you file
23 exceptions you have to send a copy to Mr. Foster as
24 well as the copies that you send to the Commission.
25 And if Mr. Foster files exceptions he has to send a

1 copy to you as well as the copies he sends to the
2 Commission.

3 Now, if either side files exceptions the
4 other side has a right to file a reply. And again, it
5 doesn't have to be in any particular form, but it's
6 got to be a written statement of where you essentially
7 disagree with what the other side said. And again,
8 it's got to be served on the other side as well as
9 copies sent to the Commission. And that also has to
10 be done within the time frame set forth in the letter.

11 Now, that's quite a bit of information.
12 Do you understand that?

13 MS. MOORE:

14 Yes, I do.

15 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

16 Okay. And if exceptions are not filed,
17 generally speaking, the ALJ's order becomes final as a
18 matter of law. Because the Commission does not have
19 to review these cases, and generally speaking, they
20 don't review cases of this magnitude. So the bottom
21 line on all of that is that if you want the Commission
22 to look at it you file exceptions, if you're unhappy
23 with the Judge's decision. And the same goes for
24 Capital City Cab. And I'm sure that Mr. Foster is
25 aware of that.

1 Is there anything further we need to
2 discuss, Ms. Moore?

3 MS. MOORE:

4 No. Thank you.

5 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

6 Mr. Foster?

7 ATTORNEY FOSTER:

8 No, Your Honor. Thank you for your
9 patience.

10 JUDGE SCHNIERLE:

11 You're welcome. This hearing is
12 adjourned. Thank you both very much and have a good
13 day.





