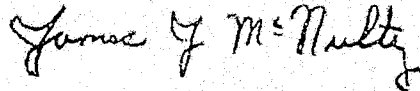

TO: PECO ENERGY COMPANY

TAKE NOTICE:

That a complaint in the above entitled matter, of which the attached is a true and correct copy, has been presented and filed of record with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. Section 702 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 702, requires the Commission to serve on each party named in a complaint a copy of the complaint and notice calling upon each party to satisfy the complaint, or to answer the same in writing within a specified time; THEREFORE,

1. You have twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served to either satisfy this complaint or to file with the **Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P. O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265**, an answer (original and three copies), in writing, under oath, which, as required by Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61, either affirms or specifically denies the allegations in this complaint. You must also serve a copy of the answer upon the complainant. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated by the date at the top of this Notice. Section 1.56(a) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 1.56(a).

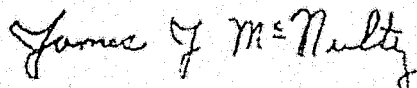
2. If you fail to either satisfy this complaint or to file answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days, you will be deemed to have admitted all the allegations in this complaint in accordance with Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61. In that event, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if

you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

3. If you elect to satisfy this complaint you must file, within twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served, affidavits executed by each complainant that this complaint has been satisfied. Such affidavits must describe the basis on which this complaint was satisfied; any settlement agreement between the parties must be reduced to writing and attached to the affidavit. Such affidavits are to be filed with the Secretary of the Commission at the address set forth in paragraph 1. Upon receipt of affidavits of satisfaction from all complainants, this complaint may be dismissed by the Commission in accordance with Section 703(a) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 703(a), unless the Commission determines that such dismissal would be contrary to the public interest, in which event the Commission may direct that hearings be held upon the complaint.

4. If you file an answer which admits the allegations in this complaint, or which fails to specifically deny the allegations in this complaint, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

5. If you file a timely answer which specifically denies the allegations in this complaint, or which raises material questions of law or fact, this matter shall be referred to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. If, after hearing on the issues raised by that answer, you are found to have committed any of the violations alleged in the complaint, the Administrative Law Judge may render a decision which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. In the imposition of a penalty after a hearing the Administrative Law Judge is not bound by the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

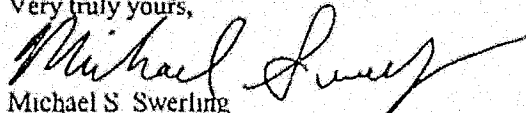

ANSWER OF RESPONDENT, PECO ENERGY COMPANY

PECO Energy Company ("PECO Energy"), pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §5.61, responds to the Complaint and states:

1. Admitted.
2. Admitted.

4. Denied. PECO Energy denies that Complainant is unable to pay her gas and

electric bill and strict proof thereof is hereby demanded at time of hearing. PECO Energy avers that Complainant's account balance is \$1,819.18. Complainant's calculated monthly budget bill amount is \$31.00. Since inception of Complainant's most recent account at this address on or about April 21, 2006, Complainant has made one payment on her account in the amount of \$9.21.

PECO Energy admits that the Complainant had a fire at 615 Jeffrey Street in Chester on January 08, 2006. PECO Energy further admits that service (at account 50-17-19-476548) was discontinued as of January 08, 2006. Service was later turned back on by the Complainant on April 21, 2006 (at account 50-17-19-476555).

PECO Energy specifically denies Complainant's statement saying that "[t]he records will show that I did not break my arrangement until I have the fire." The payment agreement that Complainant is referencing was one set up by the Commission on August 05, 2004. The terms of that agreement required the Complainant to pay \$255.00 upfront by August 25, 2004 and, thereafter, she was required to pay a monthly budget amount of \$255.00 plus \$15.00 toward the arrears every month beginning with her September, 2004 bill (case no. 1471010). The Complainant failed to keep this agreement from the beginning. Her first payment in the amount of \$300.00 was received on October 28, 2004. From then on, the Complainant had many missed and late payments.

Back in 2003, the Complainant had a previous informal complaint with the BCS (case 1670692) in which she was given a payment agreement including her monthly budget amount plus \$100.00 toward arrears each month. The Complainant failed to keep that agreement current as well and, thereafter, the Commission gave her a second chance by awarding her the newly revised payment arrangement in 2004, as detailed above, at case no. 1471010.

A decision of the Bureau of Consumer Services ("BCS") issued on or about August 24, 2006 determined that the Complainant broke her payment agreement prior to June 28, 2005 and that no significant change in circumstance was warranted. The BCS dismissed the instant action for failure to keep a prior agreement with the Commission under 66 Pa. Code §1405(d), which explains that the Commission will not set another payment arrangement after a customer defaults on a prior agreement, unless there is a change in income. In this case, the Complainant broke her agreement years before the fire occurred and she never alleged a change in income until after the fire occurred in 2006. Therefore, the reason that the Complainant broke

her payment agreement was unrelated to a change in income caused by her house fire. A copy of the BCS decision is attached as Exhibit A.

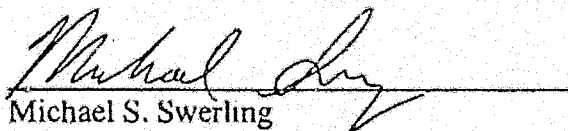
It is unclear whether the Complainant is arguing a change in income under 66 Pa. Code §1405(d) or whether she is arguing a change in circumstance under 66 Pa. Code §1405(e). However, the logic is the same for denying her request under both Sections. The Complainant broke her 2003 and 2004 payment agreements ordered by the PUC long before the 2006 event that she pleads in her complaint as the alleged cause of change in either income or circumstance.

The Complainant broke her two PUC ordered payment agreements long before the January 08, 2006 fire. Therefore, the argument that her house fire was a significant change in income or circumstance, causing her to break her payment agreement, is without merit.

5. This paragraph is a request for relief and no answer is required.

WHEREFORE, PECO Energy Company respectfully requests that your Honorable Commission dismiss the instant Complaint.

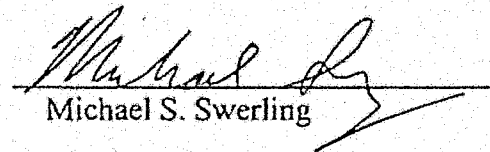

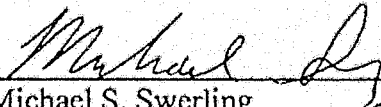
