TO: METROPOLITAN EDISON COMPANY

TAKE NOTICE:

That a complaint in the above entitled matter, of which the attached is a true and correct copy, has been presented and filed of record with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. Section 702 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 702, requires the Commission to serve on each party named in a complaint a copy of the complaint and notice calling upon each party to satisfy the complaint, or to answer the same in writing within a specified time; THEREFORE,

1. You have twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served to either satisfy this complaint or to file with the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P. O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265, an answer (original and three copies), in writing, under oath, which, as required by Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61, either affirms or specifically denies the allegations in this complaint. You must also serve a copy of the answer upon the complainant. The date of service is the mailing date as indicated by the date at the top of this Notice. Section 1.56(a) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 1.56(a).

2. If you fail to either satisfy this complaint or to file answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days, you will be deemed to have admitted all the allegations in this complaint in accordance with Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61. In that event, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

3. If you elect to satisfy this complaint you must file, within twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served, affidavits executed by each complainant that this complaint has been satisfied. Such affidavits must describe the basis on which this complaint was satisfied, any settlement agreement between the parties must be reduced to writing and attached to the affidavit. Such affidavits are to be filed with the Secretary of the Commission at the address set forth in paragraph 1. Upon receipt of affidavits of satisfaction from all complainants, this complaint may be dismissed by the Commission in accordance with Section 703(a) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 703(a), unless the Commission determines that such dismissal would be contrary to the public interest, in which event the Commission may direct that hearings be held upon the complaint.

4. If you file an answer which admits the allegations in this complaint, or which fails to specifically deny the allegations in this complaint, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

5. If you file a timely answer which specifically denies the allegations in this complaint, or which raises material questions of law or fact, this matter shall be referred to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. If, after hearing on the issues raised by that answer, you are found to have committed any of the violations alleged in the complaint, the Administrative Law Judge may render a decision which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. In the imposition of a penalty after a hearing the Administrative Law Judge is not bound by the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

AND NOW, Pennsylvania Electric Company ("Penelec" or the "Company"), by and through its counsel, Alan Michael Seltzer, Jeffrey A. Franklin, Bridgid M. Good and Ryan, Russell, Ogden & Seltzer LLP, answers the above Complaint pursuant to Section 5.61 of this Commission's regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.61, as follows:

1. Admitted.
2. Admitted. It is admitted that the Complaint relates to Penelec and the Complainants are customers of Penelec with Account No. 100005951502.
3. For purposes of this Answer, the several sentences of this paragraph have been restated and answered as they appear as follows:

1) We had no electric for 37 hrs. 3.40 AM. 9-9-04 to 9-10-04

Admitted. Penelec incorporates herein the New Matter set forth below.

4. The allegations in this paragraph constitute a prayer for relief to which no responsive pleading is required.

5. Penelec incorporates herein its responses to paragraphs 1-4 above.

6. The extended service outage experienced by the Complainants was the direct result of Hurricane Frances that pummeled portions of Penelec's service territory from Wednesday, September 8, 2004 to Saturday, September 11, 2004.

7. The high winds, torrential rains, lightening and other adverse weather that resulted from Hurricane Frances affected over 51,000 customers in Penelec's service territory, including the Complainant. The areas impacted by the storm included the Erie, Corry, Meadville, Oil City and Mansfield portions of Penelec's service territory.

8. During the course of the storm, Penelec functioned on over 625 outage projects, with over a third of those projects involving outages and/or work performed in excess of six hours.

9. Penelec utilized all possible resources to address power restoration during and after Hurricane Frances, and at all times acted reasonably and prudently in its power restoration efforts to the Complainants and all other similarly situated customers.

10. The extended outage experienced by the Complainants was not caused by any act or omission of Penelec and could not have been reasonably prevented.

11. Given the unusual and unpredicted Act of God that caused the Complainants' outage, Penelec should not be held accountable or responsible for the Complainants' service outage or any alleged damages relating thereto.



MOTION TO DISMISS

TO THE PENNSYLVANIA PUBLIC UTILITY COMMISSION:

Pennsylvania Electric Company ("Penelec"), by and through its counsel Alan Michael Seltzer, Jeffrey A. Franklin, Bridgid M. Good and Ryan, Russell, Ogden & Seltzer LLP, pursuant to Section 5.101(a)(1) of this Commission's Regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.101(a)(1), hereby requests that the Commission dismiss the Complaint of Edward and Dolores E. Carr because the relief sought (i.e., money damages) is outside of the Commission's jurisdiction. In support of its Motion, Penelec states as follows:

I. Factual Background

1. Edward and Dolores E. Carr, Sr. ("Complainants") are Penelec residential electric service customers served at 42 Julia Drive, Lake City, Pennsylvania 16423.

2. The Complainants filed a Formal Complaint at Docket No. C-20043925 on or about November 3, 2004. In the Formal Complaint, the Complainants demand money damages for food that was spoiled as a result of an extended service interruption.

3. Penelec's Answer and New Matter are being filed contemporaneously herewith.

II. The Commission Lacks Jurisdiction Over Claims for Damages

4. The only relief sought by the Complainants is money damages resulting from an alleged service outage. No other relief has been averred. Formal Complaint, ¶ 4.

5. It is well settled that the Commission has only the powers, and can only consider such matters, as are expressly, or by necessary implication, given it by the legislature. Behrend v. Bell Telephone Co., 363 A.2d 1152 (Pa. Super 1976); Brockway Glass Company, Inc. v. West Penn Power Co., 54 Pa. P.U.C. 509 (1980). The Public Utility Code, 66 Pa.C.S. §101, et seq. (the "Code"), gives the Commission supervisory and regulatory power over the rates, service and facilities of public utilities. Brockway Glass Company, Inc. at 514. The Code does not give the Commission jurisdiction over claims for damages. Behrend v. Bell Telephone Co., 363 A.2d 1152 (Pa. Super 1976); Brockway Glass Company, Inc. v. West Penn Power Co., 54 Pa. P.U.C. 509 (1980); Bones v. Bates Taxi, Inc., 51 Pa. P.U.C. 346 (1977).

6. The Courts of Common Pleas retain original jurisdiction over suits for damages. Behrend v. Bell Telephone Co., 363 A.2d at 1158.

7. The Complainants are clearly seeking damages in the Formal Complaint in the amount of \$200 for the cost of food that was allegedly spoiled as a result of a service outage.

8. Since the Complainants are exclusively seeking money damages from Penelec, the Commission does not have jurisdiction over the subject matter of this Formal Complaint. The proper forum for the Complainants' dispute is the Courts of

Common Pleas. Therefore, the Formal Complaint of Edward and Dolores E. Carr, Sr. must be dismissed with prejudice.

WHEREFORE, Pennsylvania Electric Company respectfully requests that the Commission dismiss the Complaint of Edward and Dolores E. Carr, Sr. for lack of jurisdiction with prejudice.




