1 THE COURT: Let's go on the record
2 now. I'm talking to -- the court reporter
3 is here, so we're on the record. This is
4 the matter of Sarangbe Keita versus PECO
5 Energy Company, Docket F-02019279. My name
6 is Herbert Smolen, Administrative Law Judge
7 assigned by the Commission to hear the
8 evidence in this case and to render a
9 decision in writing in due course.

13 This is a telephonic hearing. And on
14 the telephone we have the complainant,
15 Miss Keita.

16 Now, Miss Keita, how do you pronounce
17 your last name?

18 MS. KEITA: Keita.

19 THE COURT: Keita.

20 MS. KEITA: Yes.

21 THE COURT: All right. So Miss Keita
22 is present by telephone. And she represents
23 herself. On behalf of the respondent, PECO
24 Energy Company, is Michael Swerling,

1 Esquire.

2 Mr. Swerling, are you present?

3 MR. SWERLING: Yes, Your Honor.

4 THE COURT: And do you have witnesses
5 with you?

6 MR. SWERLING: I do. I have Miss Rene
7 Tarpley with me today.

8 THE COURT: All right. Then we're
9 ready to proceed with the taking of
10 testimony.

11 Now, Miss Keita, I'm first going to
12 place you under oath, ask you some
13 preliminary questions, and then ask you to
14 tell me what your complaint is all about.

15 MS. KEITA: Okay.

16 THE COURT: When you have completed
17 your testimony Mr. Swerling will have an
18 opportunity to cross-examine you based on
19 your testimony. After your testimony and
20 exhibits have been admitted and your
21 testimony has been completed Mr. Swerling
22 will have an opportunity to present his
23 witness and exhibits. And when that witness
24 has completed her testimony you'll have an

1 opportunity to ask her questions based on
2 her testimony. When all of the evidence is
3 in the parties will have an opportunity to
4 sum up their cases and I will then adjourn
5 the hearing, consider the evidence, and in
6 due course issue a written decision, which
7 will be served on the parties from our
8 Harrisburg office in the same manner as the
9 notice of this morning's hearing was served
10 on the parties.

11 Miss Keita, do you have any questions
12 concerning the procedure?

13 MS. KEITA: No.

14 THE COURT: All right. Now, I'm going
15 to place you under oath.

16 Do you solemnly swear or affirm that
17 the testimony you're about to give in this
18 proceeding will be the truth, the whole
19 truth, and nothing but the truth?

20 MS. KEITA: Yes, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: For the record, please
22 state your full name and address.

23 MS. KEITA: First name is Sarangbe,
24 and last name Keita. Address, 8 South

1 Bonsall Avenue, Glenolden, PA 19036.

2 THE COURT: All right. Now, you are
3 the person who filed the complaint in this
4 case, are you not?

5 MS. KEITA: Yes.

6 THE COURT: And you are the ratepayer
7 in the case?

8 MS. KEITA: Yes.

9 THE COURT: And what kind of service
10 do you receive from PECO Energy Company?

11 MS. KEITA: I didn't get good service
12 from them.

13 THE COURT: No. What my question is,
14 you get electric and gas service from them?

15 MS. KEITA: Yes.

16 THE COURT: All right. And when did
17 you first start your account with PECO
18 Energy?

19 MS. KEITA: You mean before I move
20 into the house or --

21 THE COURT: Well, approximately when
22 did you open your account with PECO?

23 MS. KEITA: Approximately I will
24 say --

1 THE COURT: Just give me the year.

2 MS. KEITA: I would say about 2004.

3 THE COURT: All right. Now, who
4 resides with you there?

5 MS. KEITA: My -- I have a son, a
6 six-month-old son and a ten-year-old
7 daughter.

8 THE COURT: So there're three people,
9 then, yourself, your six-month-old son and
10 your ten-year-old daughter.

11 MS. KEITA: Yes.

12 THE COURT: All right. Are you
13 employed?

14 MS. KEITA: Yes, I'm employed.

15 THE COURT: And where do you work?

16 MS. KEITA: I'm not working at the
17 moment.

18 THE COURT: Well, you said you're
19 employed, but you're not working at the
20 moment. I don't understand. What does that
21 mean?

22 MS. KEITA: I mean I'm not working at
23 the present moment. I'm on disability.

24 THE COURT: So you're not employed.

1 MS. KEITA: No. I'm not working at
2 the moment, no.

3 THE COURT: You're on disability.

4 MS. KEITA: Yes.

5 THE COURT: What kind of disability?

6 MS. KEITA: Yes.

7 THE COURT: What kind of disability?

8 MS. KEITA: I have back and neck
9 problem. I had a injury from work.

10 THE COURT: All right. Are you being
11 paid?

12 MS. KEITA: No. At the beginning of
13 the year -- I haven't been paid for like a
14 year, but I'm getting paid now.

15 THE COURT: And who pays you?

16 MS. KEITA: My job insurance --

17 THE COURT: Okay.

18 MS. KEITA: -- company.

19 THE COURT: And how much do you
20 receive now?

21 MS. KEITA: I receive about \$400 a
22 month. I mean, a week. Excuse me.

23 THE COURT: Do you have any other
24 income?

1 MS. KEITA: No.

2 THE COURT: All right.

3 Now, in your own words and in as
4 chronological a fashion as possible tell me
5 what your complaint is all about.

6 MS. KEITA: My complaint is about for
7 PECO. My complaint is basically about the
8 bill since I move into the house --

9 THE COURT: Well, wait a minute now.
10 Just go slowly, and tell me in orderly
11 fashion what the complaint is. What is the
12 amount that you're disputing?

13 MS. KEITA: The amount I'm disputing
14 is the amount that they send me for 1,000 --
15 hold on. It should be 1,300-something. I
16 don't have the full amount in front of me.
17 But it's about \$1300.

18 THE COURT: So you're disputing the --

19 MS. KEITA: \$1300. Excuse me.

20 THE COURT: What is it?

21 MS. KEITA: It's about -- over \$1300.

22 THE COURT: All right. Now, you're
23 disputing the entire amount?

24 MS. KEITA: Yes.

1 THE COURT: All right. Now, tell me
2 why.

3 MS. KEITA: Because on the time that I
4 move into my house -- as you can see, I send
5 a statement of the bill -- the bill was low
6 and all suddenly --

7 THE COURT: Stop. Stop.

8 MS. KEITA: All right.

9 THE COURT: Remember, you have to tell
10 me what your case is all about. So you have
11 to tell me as exactly or precisely as you
12 can. You say when I moved into the house as
13 I can see. Well, I don't know when you
14 moved into the house. You said 2004. You
15 have to tell me the case so that I
16 understand it. So now go back and start
17 from the beginning.

18 MS. KEITA: Okay. I moved into the
19 house February '04.

20 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead.

21 MS. KEITA: When I move into the house
22 I called PECO to let them know I was a
23 resident at the house now where I am. And
24 PECO started sending me bills. But at the

1 beginning of the time that I move into the
2 house the bills were pretty much low. But
3 what I want to --

4 THE COURT: Well, wait a minute now.
5 Stop. Low is not clear. When you say low
6 what do you mean?

7 MS. KEITA: Meaning that the bills
8 were in a low amount from I believe it
9 started from like \$40 and then it started
10 escalating.

11 THE COURT: And that was for both gas
12 and electric?

13 MS. KEITA: Yes.

14 THE COURT: All right. Then what
15 happened?

16 MS. KEITA: Then as it started
17 escalating I called PECO.

18 THE COURT: When? Approximately when?

19 MS. KEITA: Approximately June -- June
20 of '04. Around June or August of '04.

21 THE COURT: All right. And what did
22 you say to the PECO representative?

23 MS. KEITA: I explained to them that
24 the bills were low in the beginning but it

1 was going up. And they told me that they
2 billed according to the size of the house.

3 THE COURT: Go ahead. What happened
4 after that?

5 MS. KEITA: And after that I explained
6 it to them that then, well, the bills should
7 not be, you know, going up like that. And I
8 explained to them that I work excessive
9 amount of time, so therefore I shouldn't
10 be -- my bills should not be going up as
11 much, because most of the time I'm not home.

12 THE COURT: Well, who is home with
13 your daughter?

14 MS. KEITA: At the time my daughter
15 was not in the country. I sent my daughter
16 out of the country for six years.

17 THE COURT: Well, who lived at your
18 house?

19 MS. KEITA: At the time I live in the
20 house by myself.

21 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead.

22 MS. KEITA: Until '06. Then she came
23 back.

24 THE COURT: Go ahead.

1 MS. KEITA: Therefore, I'm wondering
2 why is the bill going up and I'm the only
3 person in the house, because, Your Honor, I
4 go out of the house 5:00 a.m. in the morning
5 and I return back home around midnight. And
6 I leave back again 5:00 a.m. As you can
7 see, I don't spend that much time at home.

8 THE COURT: Well, tell me what you
9 were doing from 5:00 a.m. to midnight.

10 MS. KEITA: 5:00 a.m. to midnight I
11 have three jobs. I would leave home
12 5:00 a.m. to get to my first job.

13 THE COURT: Where was that?

14 MS. KEITA: 6:00 a.m. --

15 THE COURT: Wait a minute. Where was
16 your first job?

17 MS. KEITA: First job was Elwyn.

18 THE COURT: Elwyn School?

19 MS. KEITA: Yes. Elwyn, Inc.

20 THE COURT: All right. And what were
21 your hours there?

22 MS. KEITA: My hours there were
23 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

24 THE COURT: And then what was your

1 second job?

2 MS. KEITA: My second job I would
3 leave here -- I would leave there 2:00 p.m.
4 It was from --

5 THE COURT: Where?

6 MS. KEITA: I'm sorry. Sterling Rehab
7 Center. At the time I was working at
8 Sterling.

9 THE COURT: And what were your hours
10 there?

11 MS. KEITA: From 3:00 p.m. to 11:00.

12 THE COURT: And where was the third
13 job?

14 MS. KEITA: And the third job was on
15 the weekend.

16 THE COURT: Oh, it was only on the
17 weekend.

18 MS. KEITA: I'm not going to say the
19 weekend. I didn't work at the other job I
20 will be going there from 12:00 midnight to
21 12:00 the next day. Then I would come home
22 and get prepared. That's LifePath. I would
23 come home and --

24 THE COURT: Wait a minute.

1 MS. KEITA: -- and get prepared and go
2 back to Elwyn to do overtime.

3 THE COURT: What was the name of the
4 third job?

5 MS. KEITA: It's LifePath.

6 THE COURT: Can you spell that?

7 MS. KEITA: Yes. Life, L-I-F-E.

8 THE COURT: Yes. I have that.

9 MS. KEITA: Path is P-A-T-H, Inc.

10 THE COURT: Oh, LifePath. Okay.

11 MS. KEITA: Yes.

12 THE COURT: But that was only a
13 weekend job, right?

14 MS. KEITA: Yeah, that was on the
15 weekends that I would not be working on the
16 other jobs. So basically on the weekend I
17 was not even here.

18 THE COURT: When did you stop your job
19 at Elwyn School?

20 MS. KEITA: I stopped when I had my
21 injury at 1/1/06.

22 THE COURT: So you worked there till
23 1/1/06.

24 MS. KEITA: Yes.

1 THE COURT: And what about the
2 Sterling Rehab Center?

3 MS. KEITA: Sterling, I stopped
4 there -- I'm not sure. I believe it was
5 in -- I believe it was in the end of '05.
6 Then I started another job.

7 THE COURT: Wait. Stop. Let's get
8 that straight first.

9 MS. KEITA: Another third job.

10 THE COURT: Wait a minute. When did
11 you stop at Sterling Rehab? You said the
12 end of '05. Is that November? December?

13 MS. KEITA: Should have been around --
14 yeah, should have been around
15 October/November.

16 THE COURT: '05, right?

17 MS. KEITA: Yes.

18 THE COURT: Now, what about LifePath?

19 MS. KEITA: Then I started another
20 third job, which was -- which is called
21 Devereux.

22 THE COURT: No. Wait. Before we get
23 to that, when did you stop LifePath?

24 MS. KEITA: I stop actually LifePath

1 after -- at one time I was working four
2 jobs. I stopped LifePath when I finished
3 the training for Devereux.

4 THE COURT: That's not telling me when
5 you stopped.

6 MS. KEITA: Okay.

7 THE COURT: Give me a date. A date.

8 MS. KEITA: Oh, you mean LifePath?

9 THE COURT: Yes.

10 MS. KEITA: I'm sorry. LifePath I
11 stopped at the same time as Elwyn.

12 THE COURT: January '06?

13 MS. KEITA: Yes.

14 THE COURT: Now, when did you start
15 the other job?

16 MS. KEITA: The other job I started --

17 THE COURT: Where?

18 MS. KEITA: That was Devereux.

19 Devereux Foundation.

20 THE COURT: And when did you start
21 there?

22 MS. KEITA: I did the training there
23 at the same time I was at Sterling. I
24 started there around November, the same time

1 I left Sterling.

2 THE COURT: November '05?

3 MS. KEITA: Yes.

4 THE COURT: What do you do there?

5 MS. KEITA: I do the same type of job
6 as I do --

7 THE COURT: That's not telling me what
8 you did.

9 MS. KEITA: Okay. I work as a
10 counselor there.

11 THE COURT: Counselor. Okay.

12 MS. KEITA: As in Elwyn and LifePath.

13 THE COURT: Okay.

14 MS. KEITA: We take care of mentally
15 disabled people.

16 THE COURT: Yes.

17 Okay. Now, you stopped working you
18 say when you were injured.

19 MS. KEITA: Yes.

20 THE COURT: And when were you injured?

21 MS. KEITA: 1/1/06.

22 THE COURT: So that's when you stopped
23 the Elwyn School and you stopped LifePath.

24 MS. KEITA: LifePath and Devereux, all

1 three.

2 THE COURT: So you stopped Elwyn,
3 LifePath, and Devereux.

4 MS. KEITA: Yes.

5 THE COURT: And when did your daughter
6 return?

7 MS. KEITA: She return here -- she
8 came about '06.

9 THE COURT: Yes. When in '06?

10 MS. KEITA: Just before school started
11 '06.

12 THE COURT: Do you mean in -- I can't
13 hear you.

14 MS. KEITA: September. Excuse me.

15 THE COURT: She's with you there now?

16 MS. KEITA: Yes.

17 THE COURT: And you say you have a
18 six-month-old son?

19 MS. KEITA: Yes, I do.

20 THE COURT: Do you receive any income
21 for him from the father?

22 MS. KEITA: No.

23 THE COURT: How about for the
24 daughter?

1 MS. KEITA: No, no income.

2 THE COURT: All right.

3 Now, I want to get back to the bill
4 that you complained of. You said in June
5 or August of '04 you complained about the
6 bills going up. Is that right?

7 MS. KEITA: Yes. Approximately about
8 that time.

9 THE COURT: All right. And you also
10 said that PECO told you that they sent their
11 bills according to the type of house.

12 MS. KEITA: The size of the house,
13 they told me.

14 THE COURT: All right. Now, what
15 happened after that?

16 MS. KEITA: After that I remember I
17 called them back during the winter --

18 THE COURT: Of --

19 MS. KEITA: -- time of '05, and I
20 still insisted for them to bring -- what do
21 you call them -- technician to come and see
22 the meter. I continued calling, even '04 to
23 '05, to bring in a technician to come and
24 see the meter in the house, because I told

1 them the amount I'm paying is not normal.

2 THE COURT: Were you making payments?

3 MS. KEITA: Yes, I was making
4 payments.

5 THE COURT: When was your last --

6 MS. KEITA: There was times I was late
7 on my payments, but I was making payments.

8 THE COURT: When was the last -- date
9 of your last payment?

10 MS. KEITA: The date of my last
11 payment?

12 THE COURT: Yes.

13 MS. KEITA: I don't really recall
14 that.

15 THE COURT: Did you make any payments
16 in 2007?

17 MS. KEITA: '07, no. Because I didn't
18 work the whole of '06. I didn't have any
19 income.

20 THE COURT: Did you make any payments
21 in '06?

22 MS. KEITA: No. Because I didn't have
23 no income at all.

24 THE COURT: So you made no payments in

1 the whole year of '06?

2 MS. KEITA: Yes.

3 THE COURT: And now what about '05?
4 Did you make payments in '05?

5 MS. KEITA: '05, yes, I did make some
6 payment, yes.

7 THE COURT: Do you know what your
8 total bill is now?

9 MS. KEITA: I believe my total bill
10 now is around over 1300, if I'm not
11 mistaken.

12 THE COURT: So even though you made no
13 payments in '06 and no payments in '07 and
14 your total bill now is 1300 and you've used
15 gas and electricity during that period of
16 time, you're disputing the entire bill of
17 1300? Is that what you're telling me?

18 MS. KEITA: I am disputing the bill --
19 okay, probably didn't put it in good
20 perspective. I know I was home the whole
21 time of '06, but I'm mainly disputing the
22 bill because, Your Honor, the bill is high.

23 THE COURT: Wait a minute.

24 MS. KEITA: Actually, from '05. Till

1 '05, because I was not home most of the
2 time.

3 THE COURT: I hear what you're saying.
4 But listen to what my question is.

5 MS. KEITA: Yes.

6 THE COURT: If you made no payments
7 during the year 2006 and nothing now in 2007
8 and you say your balance is approximately
9 \$1300 and you're disputing that entire
10 balance, are you saying that you did not use
11 gas and electricity in '06 and '07 totalling
12 \$1300 for the 12 months in '06 and the three
13 months in '07? Is that what you're telling
14 me?

15 MS. KEITA: No. I did not say that.

16 THE COURT: Well, what are you telling
17 me?

18 MS. KEITA: I probably didn't make
19 myself clear. I did use electricity in '07
20 and '06.

21 THE COURT: Well, why didn't you make
22 payments?

23 MS. KEITA: I couldn't make no payment
24 because I was receiving welfare, and I still

1 am now.

2 THE COURT: Wait a minute. You didn't
3 tell me that. You said you're getting
4 insurance payments.

5 MS. KEITA: No. That just starting
6 now.

7 THE COURT: Well, are you receiving
8 welfare also?

9 MS. KEITA: Yes.

10 THE COURT: And how much do you get?

11 MS. KEITA: I get only \$77.

12 THE COURT: 77, what, a week?

13 MS. KEITA: No. For the month. For
14 food stamps.

15 THE COURT: And that's all you get?

16 MS. KEITA: Yes. Before I was
17 getting -- in '06 I was getting welfare, I
18 was getting 403 for cash and 402 for food
19 stamps.

20 THE COURT: So now you're getting 400
21 a week?

22 MS. KEITA: No. Now I'm getting \$77.

23 THE COURT: Yeah. But you said you
24 were getting 400 a week from insurance.

1 MS. KEITA: Yes. I'm getting that
2 now. That just started not too long ago.

3 THE COURT: Plus 77 a month for food
4 stamps.

5 MS. KEITA: Yes.

6 THE COURT: Okay. And in '06 what
7 were you getting?

8 MS. KEITA: '06 I was not getting any
9 income at all, from anywhere. I was just
10 getting welfare.

11 THE COURT: Well, that's income. How
12 much was the income?

13 MS. KEITA: It was \$403 cash.

14 THE COURT: A month?

15 MS. KEITA: 403 in cash.

16 THE COURT: Yes. Was that a month or
17 what?

18 MS. KEITA: That was a month. Excuse
19 me.

20 THE COURT: And were you getting food
21 stamps also?

22 MS. KEITA: Yes.

23 THE COURT: And how much in food
24 stamps?

1 MS. KEITA: Food stamps was about
2 \$402. I think \$402 a month.

3 THE COURT: Food stamps?

4 MS. KEITA: Yes.

5 THE COURT: That was your income in
6 '06?

7 MS. KEITA: Yes.

8 THE COURT: And what about '07? You
9 just told me what you were getting in '06.

10 MS. KEITA: '07 I just started --
11 because they just approved the case I just
12 started getting checks from them.

13 THE COURT: Okay. So you're saying in
14 '06 of the \$403 cash you made no payments to
15 PECO for gas and electric?

16 MS. KEITA: No, I couldn't, Your
17 Honor.

18 THE COURT: Okay. All right. So now
19 what do you -- what are you asking the
20 Public Utility Commission to do?

21 MS. KEITA: Your Honor, I'm asking the
22 Public Utility to have PECO reimburse me.

23 THE COURT: For what?

24 MS. KEITA: For '05 -- '05 and '04.

1 THE COURT: And how much do you want
2 reimbursement?

3 Do you hear me?

4 MS. KEITA: \$2000.

5 THE COURT: And why?

6 MS. KEITA: Because as you can see, in
7 the bill and the amount of hours I was
8 working I was not in the house. There is no
9 way that I would have had been consuming all
10 this energy that they're stating. And I
11 have called numerous of time to ask PECO to
12 please send a technician to the house to
13 come and see the meter.

14 THE COURT: Do you have an automatic
15 reading meter there?

16 MS. KEITA: Yes.

17 THE COURT: So you have what they call
18 an AMR there. An individual meter reader
19 does not come to your house monthly; is that
20 right?

21 MS. KEITA: Yes.

22 THE COURT: So it's an AMR there.

23 MS. KEITA: Right.

24 THE COURT: All right. Anything else

1 you want to tell me, Miss Keita?

2 MS. KEITA: I just want to say that,
3 Your Honor, I work. I'm not the type of
4 person to not work. I have been injured on
5 the job and that's what is causing me to
6 stay home. But I was working three jobs for
7 ten years. So, therefore, I just feel that
8 PECO has to reimburse me, because there's no
9 way -- I have reviewed their bills. There
10 is no way I could have consumed this amount
11 of energy. I was working almost 24 hour,
12 you know, a day. Because there was a time I
13 worked 24 hour, I didn't even come home. So
14 I don't see how could I have consumed all
15 this energy that it's stating I have
16 consumed.

17 And I have called numerous of times,
18 they have not fixed the problem, and also
19 even the time I was disabled from -- from
20 the time I started being disabled in last
21 year I have -- I mean, I didn't know
22 anything about CAP rate or LIHEAP, because
23 I never been on this type of program
24 before. It was so difficult, they gave me

1 a hard time to have them done. They had me
2 send paper to my doctor to have this
3 signed, and those paper where you have to
4 pay 20 dollar for each paperwork. I didn't
5 have no money and they had me write a
6 letter stating my income. I did that. I
7 went to have it notarized. I didn't even
8 have 6 dollars to notarize. I had to go
9 beg the people there to do it for me for 3
10 dollar, to send it there. And they did
11 that to me twice. I had to pay for all
12 that money. Then I send them the
13 paperwork, they told me they never received
14 it. And then they have to send me back --
15 I mean, it just was a juggling back and
16 forth. You know, the situation with my
17 health. It's just I can't believe that I
18 was treated this way.

19 THE COURT: All right. Now --

20 MS. KEITA: For all the time that I
21 have been with them I just don't see how I
22 consumed this energy. I just -- I just
23 can't see it.

24 THE COURT: We'll see if we can --

1 MS. KEITA: As a working citizen.

2 THE COURT: We'll see if they can
3 explain.

4 Now, you sent in to me some
5 photocopies from Devereux Foundation.

6 MS. KEITA: Yes.

7 THE COURT: And from Elwyn and from
8 Sterling Healthcare.

9 MS. KEITA: Yes.

10 THE COURT: Mr. Swerling, did you
11 receive them?

12 MR. SWERLING: I did, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: All right. I'm going to
14 ask Miss Keita, do you want to make these
15 documents exhibits in your case?

16 MS. KEITA: Yes.

17 THE COURT: All right. So then for
18 the record I'm going to mark for
19 identification as Complainant Exhibit Number
20 1 a statement. Well, it's a document,
21 multipage document, containing a statement
22 of earnings from the Devereux Foundation,
23 from Elwyn, Inc., and a PECO monthly bill
24 for August 12, 2005. That will be

1 Complainant Exhibit 1. We'll call that C-1.

2 We're going to mark for
3 identification as C-2 a multipage exhibit
4 showing apparently paystubs from Sterling
5 Healthcare, from LifePath, from Devereux,
6 from Elwyn, and a PECO bill -- I'm looking
7 for the date on it. All right. PECO bill
8 from April 13, 2005 to May 13, 2005. That
9 will be Complainant Number 2 that's C,
10 dash, 2.

11 I'm also going to mark for
12 identification a multipage document as
13 Complainant Number 3, C, dash, 3, which
14 contains paystubs from Sterling Healthcare,
15 Elwyn, LifePath, and a PECO bill dated
16 March 17, 2005. And that will be C-3.

17 I'm also marking for identification
18 as Complainant's Exhibit 4, that's C, dash,
19 4, a multipage exhibit containing paystubs
20 from Sterling, Elwyn, LifePath, and a PECO
21 bill dated February 15, 2005. That will be
22 C-4.

23 And, finally, as Complainant Number
24 Exhibit 5, that'll be C, dash, 5, a

1 multipage document containing paystubs from
2 Sterling, Elwyn, LifePath, and a PECO bill
3 for the period of time January 13, 2005 to
4 February 11, 2005. That is C, dash, 5.

5 All right. They have been identified
6 for the record.

7 Mr. Sterling, I'm going to admit
8 them. And you have no objection, do you?

9 MR. SWERLING: No objection, Your
10 Honor.

11 THE COURT: All right. Then they are
12 received in evidence.

13 Mr. Sterling, you can now ask Miss
14 Keita any questions you may have based on
15 her testimony and exhibits.

16 * * *

17 DIRECT-EXAMINATION

18 * * *

19 BY MR. SWERLING:

20 Q. Miss Keita, are you married?

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. How long have you been married, ma'am?

23 A. For three years with my son's father.

24 Q. Okay. And does he live with you?

1 A. No.

2 Q. Where does he live?

3 A. He's in Africa. He comes and go.

4 Q. Okay. So he spent some time at your house?

5 A. Yes. He come -- he came this year
6 just before the baby was born, I believe, with some
7 family member. I believe it was around like July.

8 Q. Okay. And could I ask you how old he is?

9 A. He is 34.

10 Q. And what does he do for work?

11 A. Well, he's in Africa right now.
12 There is no job there. There's corruption going on.
13 That's in Guinea.

14 Q. Okay.

15 A. They're killing people there.

16 Q. Okay. So what's he doing in Africa?

17 A. Well, he's living with his family
18 member. There's no job there at the moment.

19 Q. Okay. So I mean if I could just ask, why
20 did he go to Africa to live with a family if he has
21 no job instead of staying here and helping you out
22 or? You know, you're getting some income, so why
23 did he go to Africa?

24 A. He -- I went to Africa around two

1 thousand -- about 2005.

2 Q. Okay.

3 A. And we got married there. And I
4 can't -- I think it was the end of 2004 like, and I
5 came back here. But he cannot be here, because he's
6 not a resident here. He does not have no paper.

7 Q. Okay.

8 A. That is the reason why he's not here.

9 Q. That makes sense. So he's never worked or
10 had a job in the United States?

11 A. No. He can't even come here without
12 a visa.

13 Q. Okay. That makes sense.

14 A. They allowed him to come because I
15 was giving birth.

16 Q. Okay. Do you have any family, other than
17 your husband that lives outside the country?

18 A. No. I don't have no family.

19 THE COURT: When did you say you were
20 married? What year? The end of 2004 or
21 2005?

22 MS. KEITA: Yes, it was end of 2004.

23 THE COURT: Four, okay. Go ahead,

24 Mr. Swerling.

1 BY MR. SWERLING:

2 Q. Okay. So you said your daughter was out of
3 the country. What was she doing when she was out of
4 the country?

5 A. She was with my mother, her grandmom.

6 Q. Okay. So you have family outside of the
7 country, then, correct?

8 A. 'Cause I was working so much there
9 was no way for me to like watch her and I had an
10 objective to get a house, and at the time I was in
11 school. I had to let my schooling go for a little
12 while to work harder to get the house.

13 THE COURT: The question was, where
14 was your daughter with your mother? Where?

15 MS. KEITA: I'm sorry. She was in the
16 Ivory Coast.

17 BY MR. SWERLING:

18 Q. Okay. Do you have any pets at your house?

19 A. No pets.

20 Q. You ever had any?

21 A. No.

22 Q. Okay. Do you own the house that you live in
23 right now?

24 A. Yes.

1 Q. Do you pay mortgage payments on it?

2 A. Yes, I do.

3 Q. Could you tell me what your mortgage
4 payments are a month?

5 A. Mortgage payment is \$1,477.

6 Q. Okay. And could you tell me what
7 you paid --

8 A. And 36 cents. A month.

9 Q. Can you tell me what the purchase price of
10 the house was?

11 A. It was a hundred and thirty-four
12 thousand, five.

13 Q. And when did you purchase the house?

14 A. '04. February of '04.

15 Q. Could you tell me how many rooms there are
16 in the house?

17 A. It's three rooms.

18 Q. A single level, or does it have a second
19 floor on it?

20 A. It has a second floor.

21 Q. Okay. And a basement?

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Do you have any space heaters at the house?

24 A. Yeah. I had a space heater one time.

1 Q. You have just one space heater, or do you
2 have more than one?

3 A. No, no, no, no. Just one at one
4 time, but I don't have it anymore. That was the
5 time my heater was not working and I was calling
6 PECO.

7 Q. Okay. What happened to your heat? Why was
8 it not working?

9 A. I don't -- I don't have no idea.

10 Q. Well, can you explain the circumstances. I
11 mean, was the heat just not working at all, or was
12 it --

13 A. It just was not working at all.

14 Q. Okay.

15 A. It was not working at all.

16 Q. And did you get it fixed?

17 A. That was when I was working. Yes, I
18 did get it fixed.

19 Q. And who fixed it for you?

20 A. It was a gentleman that came from
21 public -- I believe public -- what was it? What was
22 it? Public -- that was the time actually I was
23 pregnant. I remember, it was a gentleman that came
24 from Public Weatherization (sic) or something like

1 that.

2 Q. Okay.

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Do you know when the heating was broken in
5 the house, or not working?

6 A. I can't remember.

7 Q. Do you know how long it wasn't working for?

8 A. I'm sorry?

9 Q. Do you know how long? Like a month? Two
10 months? Three months? A year? Do you know how
11 long the heating was not working in your house?

12 A. I don't remember. But I know this, I
13 came to the house it was not working properly.
14 There's sometimes the house will be a little warm
15 and sometimes there's no heat at all. It's just --
16 it was so cold in there.

17 THE COURT: Over what period of time?

18 MS. KEITA: Yes.

19 THE COURT: My question is, over what
20 period of time was your heater not working?

21 MS. KEITA: Since I came into the
22 house it hasn't been working. It has not
23 been working.

24 THE COURT: So you're telling me that

1 from February '04 when you came in --

2 MS. KEITA: Right.

3 THE COURT: -- until when did it start
4 working?

5 MS. KEITA: It's when they came to fix
6 the heater.

7 THE COURT: I understand. But when
8 did they come?

9 MS. KEITA: It was 2005 they came in.
10 They fixed it.

11 THE COURT: And what month?

12 MS. KEITA: That was the month --
13 because I had two injury. That was the time
14 I had the first injury.

15 THE COURT: But that's not --

16 MS. KEITA: I had an automobile
17 accident.

18 THE COURT: That's not telling --

19 MS. KEITA: In September '05.

20 THE COURT: When was it? You say
21 September '05?

22 MS. KEITA: Yes, September '05.

23 THE COURT: So you're saying that the
24 heater was not working from February '04

1 until September '05. Is that what your
2 testimony is?

3 MS. KEITA: Yes.

4 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead,
5 Mr. Swerling.

6 BY MR. SWERLING:

7 Q. Okay.

8 One more question about your
9 daughter, if I could take you back to that.

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Was it continuous that she was out of the
12 country with your grandmother, or did she maybe come
13 back here and there to visit?

14 A. No. She never came here to visit.
15 She was there for six year total, and then she came
16 back.

17 Q. How old was she when she came back, if I
18 could ask?

19 A. She was, I believe, nine. Yes, she
20 was nine years old. Yes.

21 Q. Okay. So you sent your daughter when she
22 was three to go live with your mother?

23 A. Yes.

24 Q. Okay. I'm going to take you to more current

1 times now.

2 Do you remember PECO trying to set
3 up an appointment to come out and check your meter
4 at your house recently?

5 A. Yes.

6 Q. And do you remember that you had to cancel
7 the appointment because you weren't feeling well?

8 A. No. I didn't -- they didn't make no
9 appointment with me. There was a lady who called
10 me, I think it's Mary, said that -- there was a lady
11 before that, I think it's Mary, I can't remember the
12 last name. I believe it's the first name, Mary,
13 stated that she will send me a letter stating what
14 the person gonna do when they come look at the
15 meter. That was on the 23rd.

16 THE COURT: Of what?

17 MS. KEITA: Of February. Of this
18 year. And our agreement was I'll wait till
19 I receive her letter stating everything that
20 they're going to be checking in the house,
21 because I cannot be moving around. So I
22 can't get somebody to follow them around.

23 BY MR. SWERLING:

24 Q. Okay.

1 A. And she told me to wait till I
2 receive her letter. But at my surprise somebody
3 else called right after her wanting to come in, so I
4 was kind of confused. I didn't know what PECO
5 wanted. Because I had an agreement with your lady
6 stating she's going to send this letter, and I'm
7 supposed to wait for the letter to come. Then they
8 will call me to make the appointment.

9 Q. Was the woman you spoke on the phone with,
10 do you remember was her name Renee Tarpley?

11 A. I don't recall that.

12 THE COURT: Well, I'm interested in
13 you said you got a second call that someone
14 wanted to come out and make an appointment
15 even though you did not get a letter. Is
16 that right?

17 MS. KEITA: Yes.

18 THE COURT: And what did you tell that
19 second person who wanted to make an
20 appointment with you to check your meter?

21 MS. KEITA: Well, I explain -- that
22 was early in morning, I believe.

23 THE COURT: No, no, no. Listen to my
24 question.

1 MS. KEITA: Yes.

2 THE COURT: What did you tell the
3 person on the telephone when they called to
4 make an appointment?

5 MS. KEITA: I told them I will call
6 them back.

7 THE COURT: Did you ever call them
8 back?

9 MS. KEITA: On the 27th. No, because
10 I didn't receive the letter.

11 THE COURT: So you did not call back.
12 Because you didn't get the letter.

13 MS. KEITA: Yes. The lady told me to
14 wait till I get the letter.

15 THE COURT: Go ahead, Mr. Swerling.

16 MS. KEITA: And also after that I
17 received a shutoff notice.

18 BY MR. SWERLING:

19 Q. Okay, Miss Keita. You testified earlier
20 that you had no income in the year 2006, correct?

21 A. Yes. The whole of 2006.

22 Q. You had no income from any source
23 whatsoever?

24 A. No.

1 Q. Okay. How did you survive? How did you
2 live? How did you get by day to day?

3 A. Welfare, and I applied for the
4 welfare. I got welfare, food stamps, the cash. And
5 that's how I been surviving.

6 THE COURT: All right. Miss Keita,
7 you keep saying you had no income on the one
8 hand in 2006, and then on the other hand you
9 say you got \$403 a month from welfare and
10 \$402 a month from stamps. Isn't that right?

11 MS. KEITA: Yes.

12 THE COURT: Well, isn't that income?

13 MS. KEITA: Yes, that's income.

14 THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead,

15 Mr. Swerling.

16 BY MR. SWERLING:

17 Q. Could you explain what your injury was,
18 Miss Keita, that made you not be able to work?

19 A. My injury was I was assaulted at
20 work, so therefore -- and then also I was pregnant
21 at the time.

22 Q. Okay. So you don't have a permanent injury?

23 THE COURT: Now, wait just a second.

24 You were assaulted at work. That's in

1 January of '06?

2 MS. KEITA: Yes.

3 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead.

4 Just wanted to make sure when. Go ahead.

5 BY MR. SWERLING:

6 Q. So your injury is not permanent, correct?

7 A. At the moment I'm not well. So the
8 doctor have -- is retaining me to stay out of work.

9 Q. Are you not well because of the assault or
10 because of the pregnancy, complications from the
11 pregnancy?

12 A. No, no. It's from the assault from
13 the injury I received from work.

14 Q. Okay. So did the doctor think that you may
15 be able to work and get some income at some point in
16 the future?

17 A. At the present moment, no.

18 Q. Okay. What other bills do you have right
19 now, Miss Keita?

20 A. I have credit card bills, water
21 bills, mortgage.

22 Q. Do you have phone bills?

23 A. Yes, I have phone bill.

24 Q. Do you have a cellphone bill?

1 A. No cellphone.

2 Q. Do you have a cable bill?

3 A. Yes.

4 THE COURT: Let me jump in here. How
5 much is your cable per month?

6 MS. KEITA: My cable per month is a
7 hundred and seven dollars.

8 THE COURT: A hundred and seven
9 dollars a month?

10 MS. KEITA: Not including the tax.
11 Yes, a hundred and seven dollars.

12 THE COURT: What about your telephone?

13 MS. KEITA: Telephone is included in
14 it.

15 THE COURT: What about your -- well,
16 your monthly mortgage you told us was 1477;
17 is that right?

18 MS. KEITA: Yes. 36 cents. Yes.

19 THE COURT: What about your credit
20 card bill?

21 MS. KEITA: Credit card bills right
22 now because I'm behind of over a year I'm
23 either waiting for some of them to call
24 me -- send me a letter. I'm trying to make

1 arrangement, but right now I'm over like
2 1500 of payments each month.

3 THE COURT: Are you making those
4 payments?

5 MS. KEITA: I couldn't, because I
6 didn't have no income last year.

7 THE COURT: Tell me what credit cards
8 you have.

9 MS. KEITA: I have seven.

10 THE COURT: Well, just tell me what
11 they are.

12 MS. KEITA: Each one? I know I have a
13 Home Depot.

14 THE COURT: How much is your balance
15 with Home Depot?

16 MS. KEITA: I don't have them in front
17 of me. I'm sorry, Your Honor.

18 THE COURT: Okay. What's the next
19 credit card that you have?

20 MS. KEITA: I have Orchard Bank.

21 THE COURT: What bank?

22 MS. KEITA: Orchard Bank.

23 THE COURT: Can you spell that?

24 MS. KEITA: I'm sorry?

1 THE COURT: Can you spell it for me?

2 MS. KEITA: O-R-C-H-A-R-D.

3 THE COURT: Orchard Bank.

4 MS. KEITA: Yes.

5 THE COURT: What is that? A
6 MasterCard? A Visa? What is it?

7 MS. KEITA: I believe it's a Visa
8 card.

9 THE COURT: All right. What's the --

10 MS. KEITA: Some Visa, some are
11 Mastercard.

12 THE COURT: Well, what's the next one
13 after Orchard?

14 MS. KEITA: Household Bank.

15 THE COURT: And what do you have with
16 Household? What kind of card? Visa?
17 Mastercard? What is it?

18 MS. KEITA: I can't remember. I
19 haven't used it for over a year.

20 THE COURT: All right. And what's the
21 next one?

22 MS. KEITA: The next one is Bank of
23 America.

24 THE COURT: And what's the next one?

1 MS. KEITA: Home Design.

2 THE COURT: And what's the next one?

3 MS. KEITA: I don't remember the
4 others.

5 THE COURT: You said you had -- you
6 said you had seven?

7 MS. KEITA: Yeah, I have seven of
8 them.

9 THE COURT: But you've given me five.
10 So there's two others that you don't recall.
11 Is that it?

12 MS. KEITA: Yeah. Because I don't
13 have the paper in front of me.

14 THE COURT: All right. But you have
15 seven in all, is that it?

16 MS. KEITA: Yes, seven. Yes.

17 THE COURT: All right. Now, your best
18 estimate, how much do you owe in total on
19 all seven?

20 MS. KEITA: Before --

21 THE COURT: Not before, right now.
22 Right now what is the total. That's the
23 question, what is the total right now.

24 MS. KEITA: Right now the total should

1 be about \$12,000.

2 THE COURT: Are you making any
3 payments? How much do you pay on all this
4 \$12,000 total debt? How much do you pay
5 each month?

6 MS. KEITA: Some of them have been
7 closed out and since it's just now I started
8 receiving money I'll call some of them.

9 THE COURT: Stop. Stop, Miss Keita.
10 I have a question. And the question is to
11 you, how much do you pay on your credit card
12 bills each month?

13 MS. KEITA: Okay. None right now.

14 THE COURT: So you pay nothing?

15 MS. KEITA: No. Nothing.

16 THE COURT: Okay. You have a total of
17 12,000 and you pay zero per month.

18 MS. KEITA: Yes.

19 THE COURT: Now, what is your water
20 bill per month?

21 MS. KEITA: It's \$37.

22 THE COURT: I'm listening to you. I'm
23 making notes.

24 You have a phone and cable bill; is

1 that right?

2 MS. KEITA: Yes, I do.

3 THE COURT: Do you have a computer?

4 MS. KEITA: Yes, I do have a computer.

5 THE COURT: Do you have to pay a
6 monthly charge for internet access?

7 MS. KEITA: No. That's including with
8 the --

9 THE COURT: With the 107?

10 MS. KEITA: Yes. The Comcast, yes.

11 THE COURT: Okay. So you have the
12 phone, the cable, and the computer at 107 a
13 month to Comcast.

14 MS. KEITA: Yes.

15 THE COURT: Any other monthly bills?

16 MS. KEITA: I have also student loan.

17 THE COURT: And how much do you pay
18 them?

19 MS. KEITA: Nothing right now.

20 THE COURT: How much is the balance
21 there?

22 MS. KEITA: The balance right now is
23 about \$15,000.

24 THE COURT: 15,000.

1 Mr. Swerling, you want to continue?

2 MR. SWERLING: Yes, Your Honor.

3 BY MR. SWERLING:

4 Q. All the exhibits that you submitted for all
5 of your paystubs I wanted to ask you a couple
6 questions about that, if I could, Miss Keita.

7 So these cover about six months in
8 total from January 2005 basically all the way down
9 to July 29th of 2005, correct?

10 A. Yes.

11 Q. Okay. I don't know if you have, but I went
12 through and added up each of them to get your total
13 amount of money that you made for each exhibit, and
14 on adding 'em up my calculation came to in about six
15 months you made \$21,149.89 from -

16 THE COURT: Give me the period of
17 time.

18 MR. SWERLING: From January 30th of
19 2005 to July 29th of 2005.

20 MS. KEITA: I have more paystubs, but
21 I couldn't send all of them. I just sent
22 some of them so you can have an idea how I
23 was working.

24 BY MR. SWERLING:

1 Q. Okay. But if you take the \$21,149.89 from
2 the information you provided and you divide it by
3 the amount of months in that period, which are six,
4 that leaves you with an average income per month of
5 \$3,524.98. That's a pretty steep amount of money.

6 THE COURT: Give me that number again.

7 MR. SWERLING: \$3,524.98.

8 BY MR. SWERLING:

9 Q. In going on the expenses you have it sounds
10 like you still should have had some money left over
11 saved. Did you save any money? Do you have a bank
12 account containing any of the money?

13 A. No. Because I have so much bill I
14 have to pay.

15 Q. Well, I mean, you know, I'm not trying to be
16 rude here, but, I mean, that's more money than I
17 make and I have similar bills to which you have. I
18 mean, it just seems that, you know, average person
19 could save some of that and, you know, put it in a
20 bank account. You know, I'm not trying to be rude.
21 I don't understand where the money went.

22 A. I had also car loan that my car had
23 been repossessed because of the process I haven't
24 been working. But I had also car payments. I meant

1 to say that. I was paying 400 and -- 457 dollar a
2 month for the car payment also.

3 THE COURT: When was it repossessed?

4 MS. KEITA: That was repossessed right
5 after Christmas.

6 THE COURT: Of what year?

7 MS. KEITA: Of '06.

8 THE COURT: What about insurance?

9 MS. KEITA: What insurance?

10 THE COURT: Your car insurance.

11 MS. KEITA: Yes. Yes. I do have car
12 insurance. I had car insurance on it. It's
13 GEICO.

14 THE COURT: And how much?

15 MS. KEITA: That I was paying -- I was
16 paying like a hundred and two dollars a
17 month on that. When I was working.

18 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead,
19 Mr. Swerling.

20 MR. SWERLING: I have no further
21 questions for Miss Keita, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: Let me ask, Mr. Swerling,
23 is this customer on a CAP Program?

24 MR. SWERLING: Yes, she is, Your

1 Honor.

2 THE COURT: Currently?

3 MR. SWERLING: Yes.

4 THE COURT: Okay.

5 All right, now, Miss Keita, based on
6 the questions that Mr. Swerling asked
7 you -- and please don't repeat anything,
8 'cause I understand your case -- is there
9 anything else you want to tell me based on
10 the questions that Mr. Swerling asked you?

11 MS. KEITA: Only thing I want to say
12 that, Your Honor, I'm a hard working person
13 and the type of job I do is to help people.
14 I work with disabled people. I'm not the
15 type of person to sit and not work. I have
16 been working like this for ten years. I was
17 also sending money to Africa, which I didn't
18 even tell you. I couldn't even -- you know,
19 there's so much paper that I couldn't even
20 include in here. I was sending money home
21 monthly.

22 THE COURT: To whom?

23 MS. KEITA: To my mother to take care
24 of my daughter.

1 THE COURT: You mean to the Ivory
2 Coast?

3 MS. KEITA: Yes.

4 THE COURT: And how much --

5 MS. KEITA: For her schooling and
6 everything. I was sending \$300 every month.
7 So that is why I took all these multiple
8 jobs, you know, to take care of all these
9 different things. I was just working and
10 working and also to save money to get a
11 house so we can have a better life.

12 THE COURT: Okay. Let me ask you
13 this, how much do you think you can afford
14 to pay for your gas and electric each month?

15 MS. KEITA: With the bills I have now
16 after paying my mortgage and --

17 THE COURT: Just give me an answer.
18 How much do you think you can pay for your
19 gas and electric each month?

20 MS. KEITA: Each month I can pay, Your
21 Honor, \$50.

22 THE COURT: That's for both, gas and
23 electric? Is that it?

24 MS. KEITA: Yes. That's correct.

1 If my income does improve in the
2 future I will be more than willing to pay
3 more.

4 THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Swerling, you
5 have anything else you want to ask her?

6 MR. SWERLING: No, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: All right. Why don't you
8 put on your witness. Call your witness.

9 MR. SWERLING: I call Miss Renee
10 Tarpley to the stand.

11 THE COURT: Miss Tarpley, do you
12 solemnly swear or affirm that the testimony
13 you're about to give in this proceeding will
14 be the truth, the whole truth, and nothing
15 but the truth?

16 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

17 THE COURT: For the record state your
18 full name and address.

19 THE WITNESS: Renee Tarpley, 2301
20 Market Street, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania
21 19101.

22 THE COURT: All right. Mr. Swerling,
23 proceed, please.

24 * * *

DIRECT-EXAMINATION

3 BY MR. SWERLING:

4 Q. How long have you been employed with PECC?

5 A. Approximately 21 and a half years.

6 Q. And what's your job title?

7 A. I'm a regulatory assessor.

8 Q. Could you describe your duties as a
9 regulatory assessor.

10 A. I'm responsible for reviewing
11 informal and formal complaints filed with the Bureau
12 of Consumer Services.

13 Q. In the course of your employment at PECO
14 have you become familiar with the account of Miss
15 Keita?

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. Can I now refer you to what's been marked as
18 PECO Exhibit Number 1.

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. And could you explain what this exhibit is
21 for the record.

22 THE COURT: Before you start. Miss
23 Keita, you have these papers?

24 MS. KEITA: Yes, I do.

1 THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead, Miss
2 Tarpley.

3 THE WITNESS: Exhibit Number 1 is a
4 four-page document of the account history
5 for Miss Keita at 8 South Bonsall Avenue in
6 Glenolden, Pennsylvania. It covers the
7 period when the service was initiated in
8 February 2004, last billed that was issued
9 on the account in February 2007.

10 BY MR. SWERLING:

11 Q. Do you notice any seasonal usage patterns
12 according to your account statement?

13 MS. KEITA: I'm sorry?

14 THE WITNESS: According to the --

15 THE COURT: Wait a minute. Repeat the
16 question. Miss Keita didn't get it.

17 BY MR. SWERLING:

18 Q. Do you notice any seasonal usage patterns
19 according to the account statement?

20 A. Well, in my review I see a seasonal
21 high volume normally during the winter period.

22 Q. And what is complainant's payment history
23 like on the account?

24 A. The payments were consistent until

1 around September 2005, and then the payments were
2 sporadic.

3 Q. Aside from any LIHEAP or any other grants
4 when was the last time complainant made any kind of
5 payment on this account?

6 A. Well, the last payment was actually
7 received August the 16th, 2005.

8 Q. And can you explain the circumstances
9 surrounding complainant's CAP participation.

10 A. Miss Keita was enrolled in the CAP
11 rate program January 31st, 2006. And she received a
12 discount on her -- both of her rates of usage. At
13 the time her balance was \$1,160.24. This amount was
14 set aside for possible forgiveness if she complied
15 with the program.

16 Q. And did she comply with the program?

17 A. Well, as far as payments, no. But
18 she has not been dismissed from the program. We
19 have received -- she did apply for a few grants as
20 she was supposed to and they haven't applied to her
21 account.

22 Q. And do you know what her discounted CAP rate
23 is?

24 A. Yes. She received, it's about a 85

1 percent discount on the electrical usage. And the
2 amount over that is a 30 percent discount on the
3 electric usage.

4 THE COURT: Wait. Slow down for a
5 minute. I want to mark this down.

6 So under the CAP program that she's
7 on now she receives an 85 percent discount
8 on electric usage?

9 THE WITNESS: On the first 500
10 kilowatt hours of electric usage. I must
11 correct myself.

12 THE COURT: The first 500 kilowatt
13 hours. And then above that?

14 THE WITNESS: For the next 100 is 30
15 percent, and then over 600 is the regular
16 rate.

17 THE COURT: All right. That's on
18 electric.

19 THE WITNESS: Right. That's on the
20 electric.

21 THE COURT: What about on gas?

22 THE WITNESS: All the gas usage is
23 discounted at approximately ten percent.

24 THE COURT: Okay. And while you're

1 there give me the current balance.

2 THE WITNESS: The current balance is
3 \$2,620.55.

4 THE COURT: That's the CAP rate
5 balance?

6 THE WITNESS: No, sir. The CAP rate
7 balance is \$691.24. That's the set aside
8 amount for CAP rate.

9 THE COURT: Wait. I'm making some
10 notes here. The CAP rate balance is what?

11 THE WITNESS: \$691.24. That's the set
12 aside amount for forgiveness.

13 THE COURT: And the actual balance,
14 then?

15 THE WITNESS: \$26020.55.

16 THE COURT: So that's the actual
17 balance.

18 THE WITNESS: Total balance of the
19 account.

20 THE COURT: And that's as of --

21 THE WITNESS: That's as of the billing
22 February the 12th, 2007.

23 THE COURT: Is there some kind of -- I
24 know that she said she's on -- still a CAP

1 rate customer. Is there some kind of
2 monthly budget that she pays?

3 THE WITNESS: No. She was paying a
4 budget in the beginning of the program, but
5 after missing two consecutive payments the
6 budget was systematically cancelled.

7 THE COURT: But she's still a CAP rate
8 customer?

9 THE WITNESS: Yes, sir.

10 THE COURT: What is she supposed to
11 pay each month as a CAP rate customer?

12 THE WITNESS: She's supposed to pay
13 the bill as rendered.

14 THE COURT: Actual bill, then.

15 That's an actual CAP rate bill?

16 THE WITNESS: Yes. With the
17 discounted rates.

18 THE COURT: All right, Mr. Swerling,
19 go ahead.

20 BY MR. SWERLING:

21 Q. (Inaudible) -- for the record.

22 THE COURT: I didn't get that. Is
23 there a question?

24 BY MR. SWERLING:

1 Q. And now I refer you to what has been marked
2 as PECO Exhibit Number 2.

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. Can I explain -- can you explain what this
5 exhibit is for the record.

6 A. PECO Exhibit 2 is a letter entitled
7 Customer's Informal Complaint that she filed with
8 the Bureau of Consumer Services at BCS number
9 2019279. It's detailing the information that was
10 rebilled when the customer had filed the complaint
11 and the representative sent out a letter to her.

12 Q. What does it say about her bills during the
13 winter of 2004?

14 A. It indicated the average range of the
15 bills that were issued for her gas bills from
16 December 2004 to April 2005, and also indicated that
17 Miss Keita had mentioned in a conversation with the
18 representative that she was using space heaters in
19 conjunction with her gas heating. And it also
20 indicated that the potential for her use during the
21 winter period of 413 KW during the winter month, and
22 it also explains as of November 30th, 2005 what her
23 balance was, and it was due to an accumulation of
24 unpaid charges. And it also indicated that they

1 were looking for income verification to see if she
2 was eligible for CAP rate, and that she was billed a
3 deposit, two deposit installments at that time and
4 gave her energy balance.

5 THE COURT: Now, wait. Before you go
6 on. You mentioned two -- that she was
7 billed two deposit installments totalling
8 226.50; is that right?

9 THE WITNESS: Yes. Prior to her
10 income verification she was billed deposits
11 due to delinquency status.

12 THE COURT: All right. Now, is it
13 226.50 each deposit, or the total for the
14 two?

15 THE WITNESS: It's a total for the
16 two. It was the first installment of the
17 deposit, which was \$151, plus the second
18 installment of 75.50.

19 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead,
20 Mr. Swerling.

21 BY MR. SWERLING:

22 Q. You explained that we were able to verify
23 there was a potential for use at the property. Can
24 you explain how we were able to do that?

1 A. According to company records, and
2 when I was reviewing Miss Keita's account she did
3 contact us July 26th, 2005 in reference to her usage
4 from December 2004 to April --

5 THE COURT: Wait. Stop. I'm sorry to
6 interrupt you for a minute. I'm going
7 through the exhibits. With PECO Exhibit 1
8 it says at the top page one of four, page
9 two of four, page three of four, and then it
10 says page four of three. Is that supposed
11 to mean -- is that supposed to be four of
12 four? Look at the top right.

13 MR. SWERLING: Yeah.

14 THE WITNESS: One of two, three of
15 four.

16 MR. SWERLING: It looks like the one I
17 sent you out it had an error, Your Honor. I
18 apologize for that. It should be four.

19 THE COURT: So it should be four of
20 four.

21 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

22 THE COURT: Okay. PECO Exhibit 1 is
23 four pages?

24 THE WITNESS: That's correct, Your

1 Honor.

2 THE COURT: And now you're referring
3 to PECO Exhibit 2, which is that letter
4 dated December 30, 2005, about which you
5 just testified.

6 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: All right. Now, go ahead.
8 I interrupted you in the middle of your
9 answer. I don't know whether you remember
10 the question. I don't.

11 THE WITNESS: Your Honor, he was
12 asking about the potential for bill usage --

13 THE COURT: Okay.

14 THE WITNESS: -- and when did we have
15 discussion on that with Miss Keita. And
16 that occurred July 26th, 2005 when she first
17 inquired about her usage. And what they
18 determined they indicated that she -- well,
19 she informed us there was just one person at
20 the property at the time and she had a
21 television, refrigerator, freezer, a washer,
22 lighting, electric space heater. And that's
23 how we determine the potential for a bill of
24 use of 413 kilowatts per month.

1 THE COURT: Well, are they the only
2 things, the TV, refrigerator, washer,
3 lighting?

4 THE WITNESS: That's the only
5 information that was communicated to us.

6 THE COURT: And that was -- you're
7 talking now the potential this is for
8 electric use?

9 THE WITNESS: Yes.

10 THE COURT: No computer or anything
11 like that?

12 THE WITNESS: There was no mention of
13 that at all, because the customer's concern
14 was about the gas bill. But she indicated
15 about the space heater and that she was
16 still using the gas heater in conjunction
17 with it. But the gas heater is not working
18 properly.

19 THE COURT: Well, let's -- this
20 potential we're talking about, now let's
21 keep it for electric right now.

22 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

23 THE COURT: And so in coming up with
24 your estimate or potential for electric

1 usage you considered one person with a TV, a
2 refrigerator, a washer, and lighting.
3 Anything else electrical that you considered
4 in coming up with your potential for usage?

5 THE WITNESS: Not during that
6 conversation nothing else listed.

7 THE COURT: All right. Now, what was
8 the potential, monthly potential for usage
9 that you came up with based on those
10 factors?

11 THE WITNESS: 413 kilowatt hours per
12 month.

13 THE COURT: And how did you arrive at
14 that?

15 THE WITNESS: Television estimated 48
16 kilowatt hours per month,
17 refrigerator/freezer usage 200, the washer,
18 10, the lighting 65, the electric space
19 heater was gauged at 90, and that's with
20 approximately two hours per use per day for
21 30 days to bring it to 90.

22 THE COURT: Okay. So that's the
23 electric potential?

24 THE WITNESS: Yes.

1 THE COURT: Did you do one for gas?

2 THE WITNESS: No.

3 THE COURT: Okay.

4 THE WITNESS: They did not do one for
5 gas at that time.

6 THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead,
7 Mr. Swerling.

8 BY MR. SWERLING:

9 Q. Can you tell me what attempts were made to
10 do a field visit of the property to test the meter
11 and to perform an appliance analysis?

12 A. I spoke with Miss Keita on February
13 the 23rd and explained my position and why I was
14 calling in reference to her formal complaint to see
15 if there's anything else we need to address, and she
16 expressed concern that she wanted someone out to the
17 property.

18 THE COURT: February 23rd of this
19 year?

20 THE WITNESS: 2007. And I explained
21 to her the process and what they normally
22 would do, and she requested the information
23 in writing. And I explained to her that I
24 will have somebody contact her later on that

1 day, because I wanted the appointment
2 secure. In the interim I was going to send
3 out the document to her, which I did mail on
4 February the 23rd, 2007, along with the
5 confirmation booklet. I haven't received a
6 return bill that it was undeliverable, but
7 they made attempts to schedule the
8 appointment.

9 On February the 23rd someone did
10 contact her or made an attempt at 9:18 in
11 the morning and left a message, February
12 the 27th at 12:43 in the afternoon, and
13 left a message.

14 THE COURT: Wait. Slow down.
15 February 23, '07 at 9:18 and left a message.

16 THE WITNESS: Yes.

17 THE COURT: What was the next date?

18 THE WITNESS: February the 27th, 2007
19 at 12:43.

20 THE COURT: 12:43 p.m?

21 THE WITNESS: Yes.

22 THE COURT: And what happened?

23 THE WITNESS: Left a message. There
24 was no answer. They didn't contact the

1 customer.

2 March 1st someone did make an early
3 morning attempt to contact the customer at
4 6:14 a.m. And on March 2nd they did speak
5 with Miss Keita, and she indicated she was
6 not feeling well and that she would call
7 back to schedule the field visit so we can
8 try to satisfy her.

9 THE COURT: On the March 1, the
10 6:14 a.m. call, was there an answer?

11 THE WITNESS: No.

12 THE COURT: Was a message left?

13 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: All right. Go ahead,
15 Mr. Swerling.

16 BY MR. SWERLING:

17 Q. I'm now referring to what has been marked as
18 PECO Exhibit Number 3.

19 A. Yes.

20 Q. What was the BCS decision at the informal
21 level?

22 A. At the informal level for the case,
23 the case was closed, because indicating that the
24 bills were correct as rendered the customer was to

1 continue to pay the CAP rate in full on or before
2 the due date of each month.

3 Q. Now, Miss Keita testified that in 2005 she
4 basically was the only person living in the house.
5 Do you have any information or records around May of
6 2005 for any information regarding that, that she
7 provided to you, about people that were in the
8 house?

9 A. Yes. May 25th, 2005 Miss Keita did
10 contact the company in reference to payment
11 arrangements and she gave us income information of
12 one adult and one child and the income of \$3,033 per
13 month.

14 Q. And do you have any similar type of
15 information for around August of 2005?

16 A. August the 30th, 2005 the customer
17 contacted us for payment arrangements and gave
18 information that there were two adults occupying the
19 property and one child, and the income supplied was
20 \$2,037 monthly. And we requested that she send a
21 verification of income in order to determine if new
22 payment terms were warranted.

23 Q. If, actually, I could take you back to when
24 you testified you sent this letter, the letter dated

1 February 23rd, 2007, to Miss Keita explaining
2 what -- the appliance analysis and what would be
3 performed at her property during the field visit,
4 did you ever tell her to wait until she received the
5 letter to call to make an appointment?

6 A. No. Because I was hoping that we
7 would secure the appointment and at least have -- go
8 out there and explain the potential for bill use and
9 hopefully satisfy the customer prior to the hearing
10 date.

11 THE COURT: All right. Now, stop.
12 You said you did send the letter?

13 THE WITNESS: I did send the letter
14 February the 23rd, 2007.

15 THE COURT: And you said that that was
16 returned?

17 THE WITNESS: It was not returned.

18 THE COURT: Not returned.

19 Okay. Go ahead, Mr. Swerling.

20 BY MR. SWERLING:

21 Q. Mr. Keita testified earlier that her house
22 had only three rooms. Do you have any information
23 in your business records that would support or
24 refute that?

1 A. Well, on July 26th, 2005 in order to
2 determine the lighting potential if there were six
3 rooms in the house it didn't indicate whether it was
4 three bedrooms and a living room and kitchen, or --
5 it just said six rooms at a potential of 65
6 kilowatts per hour of lighting to run six rooms.

7 Q. Do you notice any times according to let's
8 say Exhibit 1, your account statement, when gas
9 usage decreased and at the same time electric use
10 increased?

11 A. It appeared the gas usage, the gas
12 usage always around the winter period was very low
13 for gas heating, but the electric seemed to
14 increase.

15 THE COURT: All right. Now --

16 THE WITNESS: What that tells me, when
17 I'm looking at an account like this, that an
18 alternative heating supply may be used, and
19 that was confirmed with the conversation
20 that was takin' place on July 2005.

21 THE COURT: All right, now, stop for a
22 second. I'm looking at -- and this is for
23 the record for your PECO Exhibit Number 1.
24 Let's just take the first entry in February

1 of '04. Now, under the fourth column, usage
2 column, the first number there is 112. Now,
3 what is that?

4 THE WITNESS: The top portion -- the
5 top number on the account statement
6 represents the electric usage.

7 THE COURT: So --

8 THE WITNESS: The bottom number
9 represents the gas usage throughout the
10 entire exhibit.

11 THE COURT: Okay. Now, 112 is
12 kilowatt hours?

13 THE WITNESS: Yes, it is, Your Honor.

14 THE COURT: Now, what's the 27?

15 THE WITNESS: Twenty-seven is the gas
16 at CCF, cubic feet.

17 THE COURT: CCF.

18 THE WITNESS: Yes.

19 THE COURT: Okay. And now that's true
20 on each month's billing that the top figure
21 is electric and the second figure is gas.

22 THE WITNESS: That's correct.

23 THE COURT: And that's the same with
24 respect to the bill amount in the next

1 column.

2 THE WITNESS: That's correct.

3 THE COURT: And that's throughout
4 these four pages of PECO Exhibit 1. Is that
5 correct?

6 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

7 THE COURT: All right.

8 Go ahead, Mr. Swerling.

9 Well, let me interrupt this just for
10 the record. Miss Keita, are you still
11 there?

12 MS. KEITA: Yes, Your Honor.

13 THE COURT: How many rooms in your
14 house?

15 MS. KEITA: I have three bedroom in my
16 house.

17 THE COURT: Is that on the second
18 floor?

19 MS. KEITA: Yes. On the second floor
20 there's three bedrooms.

21 THE COURT: And what's on the first
22 floor?

23 MS. KEITA: First floor there's a
24 living room, dining room, and kitchen. And

1 one powder bathroom. Which we don't use,
2 because there's a problem of leakage.

3 THE COURT: And on the second floor
4 with the three bedrooms how many bathrooms
5 are there?

6 MS. KEITA: One bathroom.

7 THE COURT: And you say you have a
8 basement?

9 MS. KEITA: Yes. Basement is
10 unfinished, so when it rains the water comes
11 in through the basement.

12 THE COURT: How many TVs in your
13 house?

14 MS. KEITA: One TV.

15 THE COURT: How many computers?

16 MS. KEITA: One computer.

17 THE COURT: All right, Mr. Swerling,
18 go ahead.

19 BY MR. SWERLING:

20 Q. Miss Tarpley, now, you just testified that
21 in winter periods the electric use increased while
22 gas usage decreased. Now, compare that with the
23 testimony that Miss Keita gave you about her gas
24 being broken and using an electric space heater.

1 What does that indicate to you about her usage?

2 A. Well, it indicates like she -- it's
3 most definitely believable if her gas heating was
4 down and you're using space heaters it's most
5 definitely going to impact your electrical side of
6 your usage. And it shows that -- that it was quite
7 low as far as -- it took a reverse effect as far as
8 like it would've evened out if both units were
9 working properly. If the gas unit was working
10 properly it may have evened out for her, but you're
11 seeing an increase in the electric usage when the
12 gas is not being used.

13 THE COURT: What dates are you looking
14 at?

15 THE WITNESS: I was looking at the
16 time period, actually, it appeared to be
17 around -- it's seasonal. It's seasonal that
18 around -- if we look between October, always
19 between October and February of the years.

20 THE COURT: What do you observe?

21 THE WITNESS: I'm observing that her
22 usage, her daily average usage for her gas
23 heating always goes -- it goes into a single
24 digit daily average use. For instance,

1 let's refer to --

2 THE COURT: Wait. Stop. Stop for a
3 minute. Let me frame a question so I have
4 it clear.

5 You said that from October through
6 February of the years gas usage goes in
7 what direction, up or down?

8 THE WITNESS: It goes up.

9 THE COURT: Oh.

10 THE WITNESS: The gas usage was going
11 up.

12 THE COURT: Okay.

13 THE WITNESS: But what I noticed is
14 that for one particular season it appeared
15 that the gas usage was higher.

16 THE COURT: What season?

17 THE WITNESS: In 2006. If we look at
18 November 2005 to --

19 THE COURT: No, no. Stop for a
20 minute. From 10/06 to when?

21 THE WITNESS: No, Your Honor.
22 November 2005.

23 THE COURT: From November '05 to when?

24 THE WITNESS: March 2006.

1 THE COURT: What do you observe?

2 THE WITNESS: I'm observing that her
3 gas usage was much higher, was much higher
4 than her previous year's usage. So I'm
5 not -- it appears to me that maybe what
6 the -- with the gas heating it may have
7 occurred around that time as far as like a
8 problem with her heater.

9 THE COURT: Wait. Wait. Stop for a
10 minute. I'm trying to get this straight.
11 You said that when her gas heater in the
12 house was broken you observed that her
13 electricity was higher; is that correct?

14 THE WITNESS: Yes, Your Honor.

15 THE COURT: That's what I'm looking
16 for. What dates in this PECO Exhibit 1 do
17 you observe that?

18 THE WITNESS: Your Honor, November 11,
19 2005.

20 THE COURT: To when?

21 THE WITNESS: To -- if you look at the
22 usage from November 11, 2005 until like
23 January 13th, 2006 her electrical usage
24 practically doubled even with the gas being

1 used if you compare it to her previous year,
2 when she was like -- let's go back to -- the
3 previous year her usage was not that high
4 for her electrical usage even with her gas
5 running. So something does lead me to
6 believe that something was not working right
7 where she was using a supplemental heating
8 device along with malfunctioning equipment.

9 THE COURT: All right. So what
10 you're -- just to sum up your testimony so
11 that I have it understood, that generally
12 from October through February of the years,
13 you consider those to be winter months, gas
14 usage went up?

15 THE WITNESS: Yes.

16 THE COURT: But from November '05 to
17 January 13 electric usage went up when
18 compared to the prior months -- compared to
19 prior years?

20 THE WITNESS: Right. Exactly, Your
21 Honor, she usually -- according to her
22 pattern normally this is -- the electric is
23 usually a little break for her during that
24 time, but it climbs just as well as with the

1 gas usage at the same time.

2 THE COURT: All right. Now, let me
3 ask you. From that period of time, November
4 '05 to January '06, when the electric usage
5 went up when compared to prior years, what
6 was the effect on gas usage during that
7 period of time?

8 THE WITNESS: The gas had increased
9 also. Just like the customer was
10 indicating, she had a problem with her gas
11 heating, gas heat. I don't know exactly
12 when she got it fixed, but it shows that
13 something was going on with the gas heating
14 or the equipment there, because the increase
15 was on both rates simultaneously, when it's
16 normally during the heating season that one
17 would -- the gas heating was -- the electric
18 would at least decrease and the gas would be
19 consistent with the prior year.

20 THE COURT: Okay. Go ahead,
21 Mr. Swerling.

22 BY MR. SWERLING:

23 Q. What is PECO's final position regarding Miss
24 Keita's account?

1 A. We would like Miss Keita to continue
2 paying the CAP rate bill and pay the bills as
3 rendered, and the company is most definitely willing
4 to investigate in her billing concerns upon her
5 cooperation and her availability.

6 Q. I think I missed one question about the BCS.
7 What was the financial decision with the BCS at the
8 informal level?

9 A. The decision was that the bills were
10 correct as rendered and the customer was to pay the
11 CAP rate bills on or before the due date.

12 THE COURT: And your position on
13 Miss Keita's claim for a refund of some
14 \$2,000.

15 THE WITNESS: Your Honor, according to
16 my analysis I do not believe that refund is
17 warranted.

18 THE COURT: Okay. Anything else,
19 Mr. Swerling?

20 MR. SWERLING: No, Your Honor.

21 THE COURT: And you're moving those
22 exhibits?

23 MR. SWERLING: Yes, Your Honor. I
24 would like to move them into the record.

1 THE COURT: All right. They're
2 received.

3 MR. SWERLING: PECO Exhibits 1 through
4 3.

5 THE COURT: They are received.
6 Miss Keita, anything else you want to
7 say?

8 MS. KEITA: Yes, Your Honor. I just
9 want to know why --

10 THE COURT: Or question. Excuse me.
11 Any questions that you have of Miss Tarpley.

12 MS. KEITA: Yes.

13 THE COURT: Go ahead.

14 * * *

15 CROSS-EXAMINATION

16 * * *

17 BY MS. KEITA:

18 Q. I wanted to know why in all this time period
19 when I consistently call them come to send a
20 technician here to check the meter why nobody came
21 out and checked it.

22 A. My records are not showing customer
23 contact requesting the information. July 26th, 2005
24 is when you inquired about the bill. And a detailed

1 bill explanation was provided for you at that
2 particular time. The next attempt was made by you
3 on August the 30th, and you were calling for payment
4 arrangements, not about a billing inquiry or
5 disputing the accuracy of the bill.

6 Q. I did call the office several time
7 requesting for someone to come out to the property
8 to check the meter because --

9 THE COURT: Now, Miss Keita, you told
10 me that three or four times and you also
11 told me that PECO didn't come out. Is there
12 anything new that you want to tell me or ask
13 her?

14 MS. KEITA: This's okay. No. No,
15 Your Honor. That's it.

16 THE COURT: All right. Now,
17 Mr. Swerling, anything you want to add
18 before we adjourn this hearing?

19 MR. SWERLING: Just one quick question
20 for Miss Tarpley.

21 * * *

22 REDIRECT EXAMINATION

23 * * *

24 BY MR. SWERLING:

1 Q. According to your records how many times did
2 Miss Keita call to request someone to come out to
3 the property for a meter test or analysis?

4 A. There was no actual request for it.
5 On July 26th --

6 THE COURT: What year?

7 THE WITNESS: July 26th, 2005, Your
8 Honor, was the only inquiry regarding the
9 billing accuracy, and according to our
10 records it was resolved with a bill
11 explanation in determination that her usage
12 increased with space heater used in
13 conjunction with her gas appliance, her gas
14 heating.

15 THE COURT: Anything else?

16 MR. SWERLING: Just to sum up, Your
17 Honor, PECO doesn't believe that she should
18 be entitled to any kind of a refund. But,
19 you know, after talking with her and getting
20 some details we understand what her
21 circumstances are. And, you know, we can
22 try another payment arrangement with her if
23 that's what she is interested in, you know,
24 we can try to work something out. But

1 that's all we can do.

2 THE COURT: Well, I have these facts
3 before me from the testimony and exhibits
4 and I have to, as you know, prepare an
5 initial -- review the facts and prepare an
6 initial decision. Now, if you're going to

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

In response to your Informal Complaint filed with the Public Utility Commission, (PUC) on 12/14/05, the results of the investigation are as follows:

- On 7/26/05, it was explained to you that your gas bills from December 2004 through April 2005 ranged from \$129.13 to \$228.44 during the peak winter season. It was determined during the conversation you used an electric space heater in conjunction with the gas heating. A cost estimate was obtained, which indicated you had the potential to use 413 kWh per month during the winter and was in line, (cost estimate is a bit low, dependent on the hours the space heater was in use). The cost for operating the appliances and gas heating this past winter were explained.
- There have been no recent inquiries from you regarding your bills.
- On 11/30/05, it was explained the past due amount of \$700.09 was an accumulation of unpaid charges. The last payment made toward the account was on 8/16/05, which went toward the June 2005 billing. It was explained you still owed the bills from July 2005 through November 2005. It was explained you were also billed a deposit due to the delinquency of the account.
- There was no change in your financial status and you were advised to remit proof of no income for possible CAP Rate enrollment. You were provided with PECO Energy's fax number and mailing address.
- During the periods from 2/2004 through 9/2005, your usage was consistent and you were billed on actual readings.
- You were billed 2-deposit installments totaling \$226.50, which remains unpaid.

Your energy charges are \$780.49 due 1/9/06.

A report, which includes this information, will be sent to the PUC and they will render and notify you of their decision. In the meantime, please pay your monthly charges by the due date on your bill.


