





ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Keep windows, storm windows and doors closed during heating season.

Use space heaters and portable heaters wisely to save energy.

Lower your thermostat setting at bedtime in the winter.

Do not block radiators or heating vents with furniture or drapes.

Clean your household radiators and heating vents regularly.

Change changed air or hot water radiators usually or as needed.

Keep temperature setting on water heater at 120 deg. F (45 celsius).

Use fluorescent lighting where possible.

Turn off fans, lights, and extra appliances (refrigerator, freezers, etc.) when not needed.

Close off unused rooms and shut off heating/cooling in those rooms.

Use fans in place of or to supplement air conditioning.

Clean refrigerator condenser coils regularly.

Change/replace air conditioner filters usually or as needed.
