Thank you for the letter concerning my dispute with Columbia Gas of Pa.

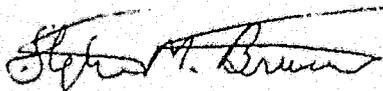
Unfortunately, you did not address my main dispute about the gouging that occurred last year between October, 2005 – March, 2006. The price of the product jumped from .66748 with the highest amount being 1.20011 in a five month period. My real concern is that Columbia Gas missed meter readings for a four month period that they finally did a reading on March 30, 2006 that happen to be the highest usage of 181 at a price of 1.08636, and ironically the price of gas went down the very next day to a price of 0.62535 after the highest meter reading of the year. See attached.

This is wrong, and it is gouging.

I did bring my concern with a representative with Columbia Gas of PA, and I was informed that it was coincidence. I replied that it was gouging.

I challenge you to do the right thing and stop this type of gouging to consumers.

DEAR STEPHEN BRUNNER:

On 8/11/2006, you contacted the Public Utility Commission (PUC) with a dispute "CU STATES HE TRIED TO WORK OUT WITH CO BUT THE REP WAS RUDE TO HIM AND HUNG UP ON HIM.. CU ALSO STATES IN SEPT. '05 HIS BUDGET WAS \$38 AND IS NOW \$150."

COLUMBIA GAS OF PA records indicate that service was placed in your name at the above address effective 09/09/2005. Until that time the property had been vacant from 08/16/2004 to 09/09/2005, therefore, your budget was projected low. The utility company promotes a budget to all customers in August of each year and existing budget customers have their budget amount revised based on the average monthly bills for the previous August through July usage. The budget also reflects the rate fluctuation during that period. The utility company presents this budget every August as the monthly amount necessary to cover consumption from August through July of the next year plus the company revises the August promoted budget three times yearly in November, January and March to reflect weather condition and rate differences from the previous year. This is done to ensure that the pay off amount due at the end of the budget season is not excessive. In July of each year, at the end of the budget season, the utility company requests that all budget customers pay their total account balance in order to bring their account to a zero balance. This is the explanation for your budget going from \$38.00 to \$150.00 and your pay off amount being \$289.00.

If you feel that the company representative you interacted with was rude, you should contact the utility company, ATTN: Personnel Manager/Director with your concerns as the PUC has no jurisdiction over company employees.

COLUMBIA GAS OF PA records are documented that you contacted them on 08/08/2005 concerning the \$289.72 termination amount and were advised by a Customer Service Representative (CSR) that the amount was an arrears that was due to avoid termination of your service. The records show that you informed the CRS that you would pay \$150.00. You were also informed you could be removed from the budget and your budget could be amortized in a payment agreement but the records indicate this was declined.

COLUMBIA GAS OF PA has advised the PUC that as of 09/25/2006 your account balance was \$57.03 with a billing due date of 09/22/2006. The utility company also informed the PUC that you are no longer on a budget plan but that if you were to be placed on one your monthly budget would be \$111.00.

You should contact COLUMBIA GAS OF PA concerning payment of the \$57.03 that was due on 09/22/2006 if payment has not been made.

At this time, our office will take no further action and I will close your complaint

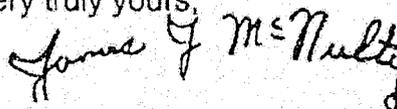

That a complaint in the above entitled matter, of which the attached is a true and correct copy, has been presented and filed of record with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. Section 702 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 702, requires the Commission to serve on each party named in a complaint a copy of the complaint and notice calling upon each party to satisfy the complaint, or to answer the same in writing within a specified time; THEREFORE,

1. You have twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served to either satisfy this complaint or to file with the **Secretary of the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, P. O. Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265**, an answer (original and three copies), in writing, under oath, which, as required by Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61, either affirms or specifically denies the allegations in this complaint. You must also serve a copy of the answer upon the complainant. 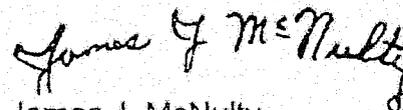
2. If you fail to either satisfy this complaint or to file answer or other responsive pleading within twenty (20) days, you will be deemed to have admitted all the allegations in this complaint in accordance with Section 5.61 of the Commission's Rules of Administrative Practice and Procedure, 52 Pa. Code Section 5.61. In that event, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if

you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

3. If you elect to satisfy this complaint you must file, within twenty (20) days from the date on which this complaint is served, affidavits executed by each complainant that this complaint has been satisfied. Such affidavits must describe the basis on which this complaint was satisfied; any settlement agreement between the parties must be reduced to writing and attached to the affidavit. Such affidavits are to be filed with the Secretary of the Commission at the address set forth in paragraph 1. Upon receipt of affidavits of satisfaction from all complainants, this complaint may be dismissed by the Commission in accordance with Section 703(a) of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. Section 703(a), unless the Commission determines that such dismissal would be contrary to the public interest, in which event the Commission may direct that hearings be held upon the complaint.

4. If you file an answer which admits the allegations in this complaint, or which fails to specifically deny the allegations in this complaint, the Commission may, without hearing, enter an order which either revokes or suspends any certificate held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. The Commission is not limited to the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

5. If you file a timely answer which specifically denies the allegations in this complaint, or which raises material questions of law or fact, this matter shall be referred to the Office of Administrative Law Judge for hearing and decision. If, after hearing on the issues raised by that answer, you are found to have committed any of the violations alleged in the complaint, the Administrative Law Judge may render a decision which either revokes or suspends any certificate or permit held by you or which imposes a fine or any other appropriate penalty or remedy authorized by the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C. S. Section 101, et seq.; and, if you are a customer of a utility, an order may be entered which prescribes a payment schedule or which authorizes termination of utility services. In the imposition of a penalty after a hearing the Administrative Law Judge is not bound by the relief sought by the complainant in paragraph 4 of the attached complaint.

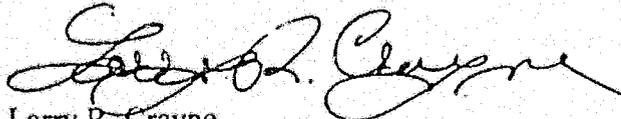

AND NOW comes Respondent, Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc. (Columbia Gas), and states and avers as follows:

4.A. Admitted that Complainant has expressed a desire to "oppose the company's proposed rate increase." However, Complainant has merely checked the box in Paragraph 4. A. and has made no specific factual averments in Paragraph 4. B. regarding any specific rates of Columbia Gas. Paragraph 4. B. requires Complainant to state the facts of his complaint. Since Paragraph 4. B. contains no factual averments regarding rates, no response is required. Nevertheless, Complainant appears to be objecting to the quarterly adjustments in gas supply charges. The quarterly filing procedure requires purchased gas costs to be increased or decreased quarterly and is designed to reduce the impact on Complainant of increases during the year in the cost to purchase natural gas to serve Complainant. Likewise, if the cost to purchase gas to serve Complainant decreases, Complainant will receive the benefit of the decreases and see a reduction in gas supply charges.

4.B. Denied that Columbia Gas has in any way engaged in "gouging". To the contrary, all the prices charged Complainant have been duly filed with and approved by the Commission. Further, the quarterly purchased gas costs adjustments are designed to provide a benefit to Complainant when the cost to purchase gas to supply Complainant decreases. Last winter, the Columbia Gas supply charges were increased to reflect the increased prices that Columbia Gas was required to pay for natural gas to provide service to Complainant. Recently, the cost to purchase gas to supply Complainant has decreased and the decreases have been reflected in the gas supply costs billed Complainant. The price that Columbia Gas pays for natural gas to serve Complainant is passed through to Complainant on a dollar for dollar basis. There is no mark-up

and no profit on the sale of this natural gas to Complainant. Further, the Public Utility Commission closely scrutinizes all gas supply purchases by Columbia Gas. If the natural gas purchases are determined by the Commission to be imprudent, ratepayers such as Complainant are not required to pay the excess cost of the purchases. Denied that Columbia Gas did not read Complainant's meter for the period of November 29, 2005 to March 30, 2006. The January 31, 2006 adjusted bill rendered Complainant was based on an actual meter reading. Further monthly bills are based on rates in effect for the period of time covered by the bill, whether based on an estimated or actual meter reading. Therefore, there is no detriment to Complainant by reason of bi-monthly estimated meter readings.

5. Paragraph 5 is a prayer for relief and no answer is required. Nevertheless, Columbia Gas denies that Complainant and other customers are being "gouged" in any way. Complainant has been charged rates reviewed by the Public Utility Commission, found to be just and reasonable and in conformity with regulations or orders of the Commission.

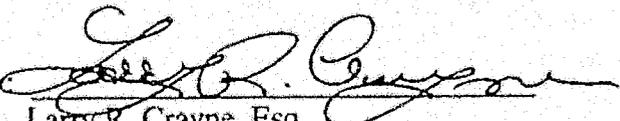

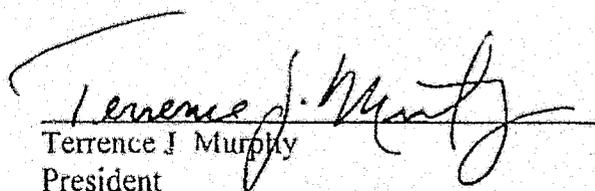

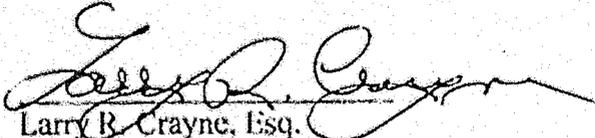
