P R O C E E D I N G S

2 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE HERBERT SMOLEN: This is the
3 matter of Mary S. Neilson versus PECO Energy Company at Docket
4 No. F-02019690. My name is Herbert Smolen and I am the Administrative
5 Law Judge assigned by the Commission to hear the evidence in this case
6 and to render an initial decision in writing in due course.

7 I note from the appearance sheet that appearances have been
8 entered as follows. The complainant, Mary S. Neilson who is appearing on
9 behalf of herself and the Respondent, PECO Energy Company has entered
10 appearance by it's counsel, Lisa Lutz, Esquire, who has one witness with
11 her.

12 Before proceeding with the taking of the testimony, I will ask the
13 parties whether they would desire an opportunity to further discuss the
14 matter between themselves with a view to some kind of amicable
15 resolution?

16 MS. LUTZ: Yes, Your Honor.

17 JUDGE SMOLEN: Under those circumstances, we will stand in brief
18 recess and give the parties an opportunity to discuss the matter. I will
19 step out of the hearing room and when the conference has concluded,
20 someone can call me and we can discuss the results of the conference.
21 Okay, so we will stand in brief recess.

22 MS. LUTZ: Thank you, Your Honor.

23 (Recess.)

24 JUDGE SMOLEN: We are back on the record.

25 I am going to ask the parties whether or not they have been able

1 to resolve any of the issues in this case during the brief recess? Lets go to
2 Ms. Lutz first.

3 MS. LUTZ: Yes, Your Honor. The parties have reached a
4 settlement in which they have agreed to a new payment arrangement. The
5 customer, beginning with her bill due in May, she is going to pay her
6 current bill plus \$15 towards the arrears. She is also going to complete the
7 CAP application and it will be processed.

8 JUDGE SMOLEN: Did you hear the proposal that Ms. Lutz put on
9 the record?

10 MS. NEILSON: Yes.

11 JUDGE SMOLEN: And did you understand it?

12 MS. NEILSON: Yes.

13 JUDGE SMOLEN: Do you agree with it?

14 MS. NEILSON: Yes.

15 JUDGE SMOLEN: Anything further?

16 MS. LUTZ: Nothing further, Your Honor.

17 JUDGE SMOLEN: So you will send in a Certificate of Satisfaction
18 with a copy to the Claimant?

19 MS. LUTZ: Yes, Your Honor.

20 JUDGE SMOLEN: That is a letter which tells the Commission that
21 the case has been settled.

22 MS. NEILSON: Okay.

23 JUDGE SMOLEN: Thank you very much for appearing and resolving
24 this matter in an amicable fashion and this hearing is adjourned.

25 MS. NEILSON: Thank you, sir.

1 MS. LUTZ: Thank you, Your Honor.

2 (Whereupon, at 10:05 a.m., the proceedings were concluded.)
