Ms. McCrey contacted me from telephone number (202) 817-7877 and requested a continuance of the Wednesday, October 26th hearing until Friday, October 28th at 10:00 a.m. or Thursday, November 3rd at 10:00 a.m. The reason for her request is that she had to evacuate her home due to a gas explosion on her block. She claims that her electric service had to be turned off for 5 hours while PGW dealt with the explosion. As a result, her medical equipment did not work and caused her illness.

She is now back in her home but cannot proceed today.


Dear Judge Vero,

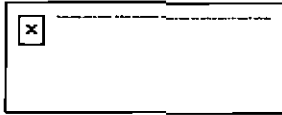
