Dear Judge Cheskis:

In response to the Companies' letter of February 15, 2017, the OCA submits the following. The Commission's January 17, 2017 Order does not preclude the admission of additional testimony. Rather, the Order states that "ALJ Cheskis has the authority and discretion under Section 331(d) of the Code to permit further development of the record if it is determined to be necessary to make a decision on the DSIC calculation in light of Act 40." Order at 39.

The OCA agrees that whether Act 40 requires inclusion of ADIT in the DSIC calculation is a legal issue. The OCA submits, however, that further development of the record is necessary to address how state income tax deductions and credits should be reflected in the DSIC calculation if the OCA prevails with regard to ADIT (federal income tax deductions and credits). This corollary was not addressed in the context of the base rate case, which was focused on the calculation of federal income taxes for base rate and DSIC purposes in light of the Act's elimination of the consolidated tax adjustment. In the interest of administrative efficiency, the impact of Act 40 on state income taxes in the DSIC calculation should be addressed in the record of the DSIC proceeding.

The OCA submits that there are alternatives ways to proceed. For example, the parties could stipulate how the result of the Commission's decision on ADIT applies to state income taxes in the DSIC calculation. Or the OCA's Formal Complaints could be bifurcated from the DSIC Petition dockets and the state income tax issue could be addressed in a consolidated complaint proceeding.

The OCA will work the Presiding Officer and parties to determine the most appropriate and efficient means to address the state income tax issue.
