Dear Mr. Warner,

Based on your assertion that MSI Utilities, Inc ("MSI") is applying with the State of Pennsylvania to operate as a natural gas broker/marketer, UGI Utilities Inc. ("UGIU") has concluded that MSI will not need to post security with UGI-Central Penn Gas ("CPG"), UGI-Penn Natural Gas ("PNG") or UGI Utilities Gas Division ("UGI"). This is based on the declaration that MSI will not be taking title to gas or directly serving end use customers. This also assumes that MSI will be acting in conjunction with a licensed Natural Gas Supplier who has been approved by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to serve in the applicable UGIU service territories and who has posted the required financial security as specified in the respective UGIU tariffs. If MSI wishes to directly serve Choice customers in the service territories of UGI, PNG and/or CPG in the future as a natural gas supplier, it will have to post security as specified in the respective UGI tariffs prior to the commencement of the service. National Fuel Gas Distribution Corporation ("NFGDC") is aware MSI Utilities, Inc. (MSI) has filed an application with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to supply natural gas service to the public in Pennsylvania and specifically within the service territory of NFGDC.

As you know, in making such an application, MSI must furnish acceptable security to each utility where MSI will do business. As such, under its tariff, NFGDC could require MSI to provide a bond or other financial security instrument in an amount that NFGDC determines to be appropriate.

However, you have indicated, and it is NFGDC's understanding that MSI intends only to provide natural gas aggregating, brokering and consulting services at this time. You have stated that, in performing these services, MSI will never take title to any delivered natural gas.

Based upon your representations, NFGDC has determined that, at this time, MSI does not need to post a bond or other form of security to operate in its service territory. However, if the services provided by MSI change in the future, NFGDC reserves the right to require security from MSI as it deems appropriate.

We are pleased that MSI Utilities, Inc. has applied for a license to provide Natural Gas Broker/Marketer Services on the distribution system of Columbia Gas of Pennsylvania, Inc. ("Columbia Gas").



I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

1. By this Order, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("Commission") grants licenses to MSI Utilities, Inc. ("MSI" or "Applicant") to function as an electricity and natural gas supplier in the District of Columbia. The licenses for MSI Utilities, Inc. are effective upon issuance of this Order.

II. BACKGROUND

2. On November 18, 2014, MSI filed its license applications.² Specifically, MSI indicates that it intends to operate as a broker of electricity pursuant to Section 34-1505 of the "Retail Electric Competition and Consumer Protection Act of 1999" ("Act")³ and as a broker of natural gas pursuant to the Commission's licensing requirements as set forth in GT 96-3, Order Nos. 12709 and 12903.⁴ In both filings, the Applicant represents that it intends to serve commercial and industrial customers in the District of Columbia.

D.C. Code § 34-1501(17) (2001) defines, in part, an electricity supplier as "a person, including an aggregator, broker, or marketer, who generates electricity; sells electricity; or purchases, brokers, arranges or markets electricity for sale to customers." D.C. Code § 34-1671.02(12) (2001) defines a natural gas supplier as "a person including an aggregator, broker, or marketer, who sell natural gas or purchases, brokers, arranges or, markets natural gas for sale to customers."

MSI provided the following information in compliance with the Commission's licensing requirements:⁵

- a) Proof of technical and managerial competence;
- b) Affidavits certifying compliance with applicable Federal and District of Columbia environmental laws and regulations;
- c) Proof of financial integrity to include financial statements;
- d) Proof that MSI has registered with the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs to do business in the District of Columbia;
- e) Affidavits certifying that MSI is subject to all applicable taxes;
- f) Affidavits certifying that MSI will comply with all the requirements of all orders and regulations of the Commission; and
- g) Applicant's website address: http://www.msiutilities.com.

MSI filed supplemental information on January 8, 2015.6

III. <u>DISCUSSION</u>

3. Our review of the information contained in MSI's applications, demonstrate that it has met all the prescribed licensing requirements and that the Applicant has the ability and the financial integrity to serve electricity and natural gas customers in the District of Columbia. The Commission also finds that granting MSI's applications will serve the public interest by fostering competition in the District's energy market. Accordingly, MSI Utilities, Inc.'s applications are approved.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

4. The applications of MSI Utilities, Inc. for licenses to conduct business in the District of Columbia as a broker of electricity and natural gas are hereby **GRANTED**. The licenses for MSI Utilities, Inc. are effective upon issuance of this Order.

ORDER

By the Commission:

I. PRELIMINARY MATTERS

On May 4, 2011, MSI Utilities, Inc. ("Applicant") filed a verified application with the Illinois Commerce Commission ("Commission") requesting a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant ("ABC") in Illinois pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Public Utilities Act ("Act"), 220 ILCS 5/1-101 et seq., and 83 Ill. Adm. Code 454 ("Part 454"). Applicant requests authority to offer services as an ABC for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

II. REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL APPLICANTS UNDER SECTION 16-115C OF THE ACT

Applicant is a business organized under the laws of Ohio and licensed to transact business in Illinois. Applicant has certified that it will comply with all applicable regulations; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements established by Commission rule; that it will comply with informational and reporting requirements pursuant to Section 16-115C of the Act; and that it will comply with all other applicable laws, regulations, terms, and conditions required to the extent they have application to the services being offered by an ABC. Applicant has agreed to ensure that any person who acts on its behalf will comply with all applicable sections of Part 454. Applicant agrees that it will remain in compliance with the provisions of the Act and Part 454, and will ensure that authorizations received from customers, and all other applicable records are retained for a period of not less than three calendar years after the calendar year in which they were created. Applicant has agreed to adopt and follow rules and procedures to preserve the confidentiality of its customers' data.

III. FINANCIAL, TECHNICAL, AND MANAGERIAL REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 16-115C

Pursuant to the requirements of Section 454.80 of Part 454, Applicant provided a surety bond in the amount of \$5,000 issued by a qualifying surety authorized to transact

business in Illinois. Applicant submitted an original surety bond in satisfaction of Section 454.80.

Applicant is required by Part 454.60 to demonstrate that it meets the managerial qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant must further provide an organizational chart that indicates the position of persons which satisfy the managerial qualification. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the managerial qualifications set forth in Part 454.60, as demonstrated in Attachment A. Attachment A includes an exhibit containing a corporate organizational chart and identifying the persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.60(a). Attachment B includes an exhibit containing occupational background information on the person or persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.60(a).

Applicant is required by Part 454.70 to demonstrate that it meets the technical qualifications necessary to provide services as an ABC. Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the technical qualifications set forth in Part 454.70 with the information provided, including the information included in Attachment B. Attachment B includes an exhibit containing occupational background information on the person or persons who are being used to meet the requirements of Part 454.70(a).

The Applicant indicates in its application that it is not licensed in any other jurisdictions as an ABC, and that it has not had any complaints filed against it for its provision of services in the gas or electric industry.

Applicant further agrees to comply with the Code of Conduct for ABCs contained in Section 454.90.

IV. COMMISSION CONCLUSION AND CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

The Commission has reviewed the application and attachments along with the supplementary information provided by Applicant regarding the technical and managerial requirements and all other requirements of the Act and Part 454 and finds that the Applicant sufficiently demonstrates compliance with the requirements.

The Commission concludes, therefore, that Applicant's request for a certificate of service authority to operate as an ABC in Illinois should be granted and should include the following authority:

CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE AUTHORITY

IT IS CERTIFIED that MSI Utilities, Inc. is granted service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply for third parties in the State of Illinois.

V. FINDINGS AND ORDERING PARAGRAPHS

The Commission, having reviewed the entire record, is of the opinion and finds that:

- (1) MSI Utilities, Inc., a business organized under the laws of Ohio, seeks a certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant under Section 16-115C of the Act;
- (2) the Commission has jurisdiction over the party hereto and the subject matter hereof;
- (3) the recitals of fact and conclusions reached in the prefatory portion of this Order are supported by the record and are hereby adopted as findings of fact;
- (4) Applicant has demonstrated that it possesses sufficient financial, managerial and technical resources and abilities to provide services as an agent, broker or consultant for the procurement or sale of retail electricity supply to third parties in the State of Illinois;
- (5) Applicant has complied with Section 16-115C of the Act and Part 454; and
- (6) MSI Utilities, Inc. should be granted the certificate of service authority to operate as an agent, broker or consultant as specified in this Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Illinois Commerce Commission that MSI Utilities, Inc. is hereby granted a Certificate of Service Authority authorizing it to operate as an agent, broker or consultant; said Certificate of Service Authority shall read as that set forth in Section IV of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that MSI Utilities, Inc. shall comply with all applicable Commission rules and orders now and as hereafter amended.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, subject to the provisions of Section 10-113 of the Public Utilities Act and 83 III. Adm. Code 200.880, this Order is final; it is not subject to the Administrative Review Law.

I. SUMMARY

In this Order, we license MSI Utilities, Inc. (MSI) to operate as a competitive electricity provider furnishing aggregator/broker services to the non-residential customer classes throughout Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's service territories pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

II. APPLICATION AND DECISION

On October 8, 2014, MSI applied to the Commission to operate in Maine as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305. MSI proposes to provide aggregator/broker service to the non-residential customer classes throughout Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's service territories and has met all the Chapter 305 filing requirements.

As a licensed competitive electricity provider, MSI is required to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations, including all conditions of licensing, customer protection rules, and the filing of annual reports. To the extent that a licensed competitive electricity provider uses third-parties to assist in obtaining customers during the course of its business, Chapter 305 § 4(C) of the Commission's rules places the responsibility on the competitive electricity provider for violations of the provisions of this section by representatives or agents acting on the CEP's behalf. Chapter 305 § 2(C)(3) also requires a competitive electricity provider to use reasonable efforts not to conduct business with any entity acting as a competitive electricity provider in Maine without a license from the Commission. Therefore, if MSI uses a third party to market its services, it is responsible to ensure that the third party has met any licensing requirements of the Commission.

Pursuant to a Delegation Order dated April 23, 2008 in Docket No. 2008-185, PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION, Delegation of Authority to License Competitive Electricity Providers, the Commission delegated to the Director of Technical Analysis the authority under 35-A M.R.S.A., § 3203 (1)(2) and Chapter 305, §2 to license competitive electricity providers. On September 12, 2009, in Docket No. 2009-260, statutory changes took effect that changed the title of this position. P.L. 2009, ch. 122. The Director of Technical Analysis is now the Director of Electric and Gas Utility Industries. All existing delegation orders that delegate Commission authority to the

Director of Technical Analysis will now read that we delegate our authority to the Director of Electric and Gas Utility Industries.

Accordingly, it is

ORDERED

- 1. That MSI Utilities, Inc. is hereby issued a license to operate as a competitive electricity provider pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules, to provide aggregator/broker services to the non-residential customer classes throughout Central Maine Power Company and Emera Maine's service territories pursuant to Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules; and
- 2. That this license is effective on the date of this Order and valid until revoked or suspended by the Commission pursuant to section 3(A)(4) of Chapter 305, or abandoned by the licensee pursuant to sections 2(D)(10) and 2(D)(11) of Chapter 305 of the Commission's Rules.

ORDER

BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 22, 2013, MSI Utilities, Inc. (MSI) filed an application seeking to become a licensed electric generation supplier (EGS) as a broker/marketer in the electric distribution company ("EDC") service territories throughout the entire Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The application was filed pursuant to the Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code §§54.31-54.43, which became effective on August 8, 1998, and which were established under Section 2809 of the Public Utility Code, 66 Pa. C.S. §2809.

§2809 provides in pertinent part that:

License Requirement.--No person or corporation, including municipal corporations which choose to provide service outside their municipal limits except to the extent

An electric generation supplier cannot physically disconnect a residential customer from the electricity grid; therefore, the rules relating to residential service termination are not applicable to electric generation suppliers. An electric generation supplier may seek to terminate its generation service through an appropriate written notice to the customer and the distribution company. The residential customer can then attempt to repair their relationship with the supplier, seek a new supplier, or return to utility service at default service rates in accordance with the utility's obligations under Section 2807(e), 66 Pa. C.S. §2807(e). The customer would only be disconnected from the electricity grid pursuant to appropriate regulations if the customer failed to meet its obligations to the utility or the electric generation supplier that has been designated by the Commission as the provider of last resort.

Additionally, we specifically note that the licensee must comply with, and ensure that its employees, agents, representatives and independent contractors comply with the standards of conduct and disclosure for licensees set out in Commission regulations at 52 Pa. Code §54.43 that were enacted to protect consumers of this Commonwealth. These standards include, *inter alia*, the provision of timely and accurate information about the services offered by the licensee, the practice of nondiscrimination in service in regard to race, color, religion, national origin, marital status, etc., the safeguarding of a consumer's personal information, and compliance with applicable state and federal consumer protection laws. Also, we take this opportunity to remind the licensee of its agreement to abide by, and to ensure that its employees, representatives, agents and independent contractors abide by all applicable federal and state laws, and Commission regulations, procedures and orders, including Emergency Orders, which may be issued verbally or in writing during any emergency situations that may unexpectedly develop from time to time in the course of doing business in Pennsylvania.

MSI has provided proof of publication in the Pennsylvania newspapers, and proofs of service to the interested parties as required by the Commission.

consulting services. Premier intended to utilize the information to help its customers reduce their overall spending for electricity. Premier also stated that it will not take title to power.

The Commission believes that MSI operates in a similar manner and therefore should be granted similar relief and be permitted to provide a bond or other approved security in the reduced amount of \$10,000. However, MSI's bonding level is contingent upon the company's business model as described in this Order. If MSI takes title to generation supply for its customers, and/or charges customers directly for that generation supply, a \$10,000 level of bonding may not be appropriate. Therefore, we will direct MSI to notify the Commission 45 days prior to a change in its business model, whereby MSI takes title to generation supply and/or bills its customers directly for that generation supply. This will provide the Commission with an opportunity to review and adjust MSI's approved bonding level prior to MSI implementing those changes.

As of September 17, 2013 no protests have been filed.

We find that the applicant:

- Is fit, willing and able to properly perform the service proposed in conformance with applicable provisions of the Public Utility Code and lawful Commission orders and regulations, specifically including 52 Pa. Code Chapter 56 (relating to Standards and Billing Practices for Residential Utility Service).
- 2. Has agreed to lawfully abide by all Commission regulations, procedures and orders, including Emergency Orders, which may be issued verbally or in writing during any emergency situations that may unexpectedly develop from time to time in the course of doing business in Pennsylvania.

5. That if MSI Utilities, Inc. proposes to change its business model as described in Ordering Paragraph No. 3, it must notify the Commission at least 45 days prior to the changes. With the notice, the Company must provide an update to the nature and scope of business information that was required by Pa. Code § 54.40(c) to justify the modification granted in Ordering Paragraph No. 3. This will provide the Commission the opportunity to review MSI Utilities, Inc.'s bonding level and adjust as appropriate, prior to MSI Utilities, Inc. implementing the proposed changes to its business model.

6. That if MSI Utilities, Inc. changes its business model without providing to the Commission the notice and information required in Ordering Paragraph No. 5, then the reduced bonding level permitted by Ordering Paragraph No. 2 shall cease effective with the date of the change in the business model. The level of bonding effective at that time shall be \$250,000 or the level required by 52 Pa. Code § 54.40, whichever is greater.

7. That this proceeding at Docket No. A-2013-2365828 be closed.


