
Dear Judge Jones:

I hope you are doing well. My name is Guang Hui Ren. I am writing in regards to my case against Philadelphia Gas Works. I just recently received a decision from PGW. The new amount that they are asking me to pay is \$1,732.93. Although it is significantly lower than the original price, I am still unable to accept this amount.

On the paper that contained all the months and total amount paid each month, I noticed that the highest total amount in a year that I paid before renting the house out was \$1,172.35 in 2011. At that time, there were a total of six people living at the house at that time, so six of us combined used \$1,172.35 of gas. The highest amount that the two tenants paid was \$1,293.22 in 2014. Considering that the two of them used more than a thousand dollars of gas one year, which is way more than what my family and I used combined, I find it hard to believe that they were stealing gas during that year. I believe that the problem occurs in 2015, from February to the beginning of September. And ever since the FBI raid, there were no one living in that house. Despite no one living in the house, I still continued paying the gas bills that was mailed out.

My wife and I was hoping the price would be less than a thousand dollars. Therefore, I wish Your Honor can look at the information again and come up with a reasonable decision. Thank you very much.
