Dear Secretary Chiavetta:

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 53.102, Duquesne Light Company (“Duquesne Light” or the “Company”) respectfully requests that the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (“Commission”) accept for filing the enclosed red-lined and final tariff pages updating the rates in Duquesne Light’s Tariff No. 3S – Electric Generation Supplier (“EGS”) Coordination Tariff, to become effective June 1, 2017 (“Supplement No. 25”). Supplement No. 25 is an addendum to the Company’s Default Service Plan VIII compliance tariff filing, which was filed April 28, 2017, and which the Commission initially accepted via Secretarial Letter issued May 15, 2017. Because the tariff updates in Supplement No. 25 are minor, and are designed only to maintain status quo, Duquesne Light respectfully requests that the Commission waive the notice requirements in 52 Pa. Code § 53.101, and allow the tariff updates in Supplement No. 25 to become effective June 1, 2017.

Supplement No. 25 would make tariff updates that were inadvertently omitted from the Company’s April 28, 2017, Default Service Plan VIII compliance filing. Specifically, Supplement No. 25 would excise language from Rule 5.3 that would sunset the Company’s ability to contract with Electric Generation Suppliers to provide Time-of-Use service, and would delete Rule 5.4.4, which pertains to a Time-of-Use reporting requirement that is already set to expire on May 31, 2017. Removal of this language is consistent with the Non-Unanimous Settlement (“Settlement”), filed on September 23, 2016, and approved in its entirety by the Commission, in the Company’s recent default service proceeding. *Petition of Duquesne Light Company for Approval of a Default Service Plan for the Period June 1, 2017, through May 31, 2021*, Docket No. P-2016-2543140, Order entered December 22, 2016.

The Company will accept inbound enrollment requests on accounts that are not yet active. However, the EGS is still responsible for submitting the enrollment request. The final component of this transaction will be to establish an estimated start date. The Company will establish the estimated start date for new service in its communication via the enrollment response sent back to the EGS.

The EGS must submit a drop request via EDI if it does not wish to supply service to the customer. However, the supplier must maintain supply service to this customer until a three-business day switch can occur under the Company's switching rules.

5.2.11 If the Company elects to change the supplier agreement identification number for a customer receiving generation service from an EGS, the Company will notify the EGS of the change in supplier agreement identification number at the same customer location, via electronic exchange.

5.3 PROVISIONS FOR CONTRACTING WITH AN EGS TO PROVIDE TOU SERVICE

5.3.1 The Company may contract with an EGS to provide Time-of-Use ("TOU") service ~~from June 1, 2016, to May 31, 2017. TOU rates will become effective June 1, 2016, with on-peak and off-peak rates in effect from June through September. The contracted EGS must submit an EDI transaction to enroll customers in the TOU program. Standard switching rules shall apply to customers enrolled in the TOU service program. Service under this rate will begin no sooner than June 1, 2016. Customers must be enrolled so that they take service under this rate by July 31, 2016, in order to participate.~~

5.4 PROVISIONS RELATING TO AN EGS'S CUSTOMERS

5.4.1 ARRANGEMENTS WITH EGS CUSTOMERS EGSs shall be solely responsible for having appropriate contractual or other arrangements with their customers necessary to implement direct access consistent with all applicable laws, Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission requirements, and this tariff. The Company shall not be responsible for monitoring, reviewing or enforcing such contracts or arrangements.

5.4.2 TRANSFER OF COST OBLIGATIONS BETWEEN EGSS AND CUSTOMERS Nothing in this tariff is intended to prevent an EGS and a customer from agreeing to reallocate between them any charges that this tariff imposes on the EGS, provided that any such agreement shall not change in any way the EGS's obligation to pay such charges to the Company, and that any such agreement shall not confer upon the Company any right to seek recourse directly from the EGS's customer for any charges owed to the Company by the EGS.

5.4.3 CUSTOMER OBLIGATIONS Customers of an EGS remain bound by the rules and requirements of the applicable EDC Tariff under which they receive service from the Company.

~~**5.4.4 CUSTOMER TOU PROGRAM PARTICIPATION** The Company may contract with EGSs to provide Time of Use ("TOU") service from June 1, 2016, to May 31, 2017. The Company is obligated to file periodic reports to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission on customer participation in and results of TOU programs. The EGSs contracted to provide TOU service will be required to provide data to the Company no later than October 14, 2016, for Company reporting purposes. Such data to be provided to the Company shall be related to the EGSs marketing efforts to enroll customers in the TOU program, customer participation in and response to the TOU program, and TOU program performance.~~





