

STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF SETTLEMENT

The County of Lehigh concurs with the other parties that the Joint Stipulation of Settlement ("Settlement") is in the public interest. The Settlement addresses all the issues involved in the litigation, *i.e.*, the allocation of costs attributed to the repairs and rehabilitation of the South Lehigh Avenue Retaining Wall, including repairs to the South Lehigh Avenue drainage system, and the assignment of future maintenance responsibilities for the Retaining Wall. All repairs were performed by the Department pursuant to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission's ("Commission") July 26, 2007 Order and, as such, all safety issues involving the Retaining Wall have been resolved. The settlement will serve to protect the public safety.



Code § 5.231(a). The settlement is an efficient use of the resources of the Commission and the parties hereto.
