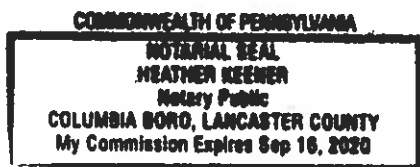

Notice of Proposed Rate Changes

To Our Customers:

This notice amends the notice that was sent to our Marietta Division customers on June 30, 2017. The Columbia Water Company filed a request with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) to consolidate and increase rates for the service divisions formerly known as the Columbia Division and Marietta Division on June 27, 2017. The PUC has suspended the effective date of the increase until March 29, 2018. This notice describes the company's rate request, the PUC's role, and what actions you can take.

The Columbia Water Company has requested an overall rate increase of \$923,668 per year. The notice sent by Columbia Water Company on June 30, 2017 indicated that the bill for a typical residential customer using 3,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$28.76 to \$32.55 per month, or by 13.18%. **However, if the Company's entire request is approved, the total bill for a Marietta Division typical metered residential customer using 3,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$23.33 to \$39.50 per month (including a \$6.95 per month Pennvest surcharge per EDU) or by 69.3%.** The total bill for a typical metered commercial customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$14.15 to \$17.91 per month or by 26.57%. The total bill for a typical metered industrial customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$14.15 to \$17.91 per month or by 26.57%. The total bill for a typical metered public customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$61.76 to \$92.16 per month or by 49.22%. Additionally, commercial, industrial and public customers would pay a monthly Pennvest surcharge of \$6.95 per EDU under the Company's proposal.

To find out your customer class or how the requested increase may affect your water bill, contact The Columbia Water Company at (717) 684-2188. The rates requested by the Company may be found in Supplement No. 86 to Tariff – Water Pa. P.U.C. No. 7. You may examine the material filed with the PUC which explains the increase and the reasons for it. A copy of this material is kept at The Columbia Water Company's office.

The State agency which approves rates for public utilities is the PUC. The PUC will examine the requested rate increase and can prevent existing rates from changing until it investigates and/or holds hearings on the request. The company must prove that the requested rates are reasonable. After examining the evidence, the PUC may grant all, some, or none of the request or may reduce existing rates.

The PUC may change the amount of the rate increase or decrease requested by the utility for each customer class. As a result, the rate charged to you may be different than the rate requested by the company and shown above.

There are three ways to challenge a company's request to change its rates:

1. You can file a formal complaint. If you want a hearing before a judge, you must file a formal complaint. By filing a formal complaint, you assure

yourself the opportunity to take part in hearings about the rate increase request. If no formal complaints are filed, the Commission may grant all, some, or none of the request without holding a hearing before a judge.

2. You can send us a letter telling why you object to the requested rate increase. Sometimes there is information in these letters that makes us aware of problems with the company's service or management. This information can be helpful when we investigate the rate request.

Send your letter or request for a formal complaint to the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, Post Office Box 3265, Harrisburg, PA 17105-3265.

3. You can be a witness at a public input hearing. Public input hearings are held if the Commission opens an investigation of the company's rate increase request and if there is a large number of customers interested in the case. At these hearings you have the opportunity to present your views in person to the PUC judge hearing the case and the company representatives. All testimony given "under oath" become part of the official rate case record. These hearings are held in the service areas of the company.

Amended Notice of filing for a Rate Increase for The Columbia Water Company was delivered to the local newspapers "Intelligencer Journal" and the "Lancaster New Era" by a representative of the Company on August 24, 2017 2017.

The amended news release is as follows:

Columbia, PA – This is an amended news release affecting only the Columbia Water Company's Marietta Division customers. On June 27, 2017, The Columbia Water Company (Columbia or Company) filed to consolidate and increase its rates for the service divisions formerly known as the Columbia Division and Marietta Division. The Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) has suspended the effective date of the increase until March 29, 2018.

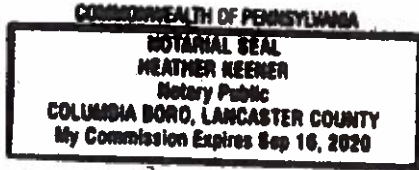
The total increase in rates is \$923,668 per year which is 17.80%. The last rate increase filings for the former Columbia Division customers was in 2013 and for the Marietta Division customers in 2005. The Company's existing rates are based on costs and capital expenditures for each division, and in this filing the divisions have been combined. Since the last increases referenced above, the Company has continued to make investments to maintain the quality and reliability of its water. The proposed increase is needed to recover the costs of these improvements and to reflect the increased costs of providing quality service.

The original news release indicated that the bill for a typical residential customer using 3,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$28.76 to \$32.55 per month. However, if the Company's entire request is approved, the total bill for a Marietta Division typical metered residential customer using 3,000 gallons of water a month would increase from \$23.33 to \$39.50 (including a \$6.95 per month PennVest surcharge per EDU). The total bill for a typical commercial customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$14.15 to \$17.91 per month. The total bill for a typical industrial customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$14.15 to \$17.91 per month. The total bill for a typical metered public customer using 1,000 gallons of water per month would increase from \$61.76 to \$92.16 per month. Additionally, commercial, industrial and public customers would pay a monthly PennVest surcharge of \$6.95 per EDU under the Company's proposal.
