**INTERIM ORDER
SETTING CONFERENCE BETWEEN PARTIES**

On or about November 8, 2017, Adlen Gilmore Sr. ("Complainant") filed a complaint against Pennsylvania Electric Company ("Respondent"), at the above-captioned docket number. On or about December 4, 2017, Respondent filed an Answer to the complaint.

Based upon a review of the information contained in this material, the parties are hereby directed to discuss this matter to determine whether such discussion can result in a resolution of the complaint and, if so, whether Complainants want to withdraw the complaint. Respondent shall contact Complainants concerning a mutually convenient date and time for Respondent and Complainants to hold a conference. The conference shall take place on or before Tuesday, January 2, 2018 unless this is not possible.

Within ten (10) days following the conference, Respondent shall file a short report with Cynthia Lehman, Mediator ("Mediator"), setting forth:

- (a) The date of the conference;
- (b) Who participated for each party; and
- (c) A statement on the results of the conference.

If it is not possible to have the conference by the date set for that purpose, Respondent shall file a report with the Mediator, on or before ten (10) days following the conference due date, giving the reason(s) why the due date could not be met.


In either situation, a report must be filed with the Mediator by the applicable due date set forth above.

If the parties do not resolve the complaint on their own, they are entitled to a hearing. A hearing is a formal, adversarial proceeding which usually includes the presentation of oral testimony and other evidence before a Commission administrative law judge, who will then consider the case and make a written decision to resolve it. The Complainants must prove that the Respondent has violated the Public Utility Code, a regulation or an order of the Commission which would entitle the Complainants to the relief sought in the complaint.
