District attorney: Opioid crisis ‘tears families apart’ in Fayette County

after a court appearance that reflected the opioid crisis’ impact on even the most innocent people.

A Fayette County woman accused in the near-fatal fentanyl overdose of her daughter when she was around 3 months old was released on bond in Uniontown. Crystal Dawn Cumberland, 27, of North Union Township, wept as District Judge Richard Kasunic II set \$25,000 straight bond and forbade her contact with her daughter.

“It is a very emotional situation for her,” said her attorney, David Lint. He declined to discuss the specifics of the case. “The baby, to the best of my knowledge, seems to be doing well.”

Ms. Cumberland and her family left without comment, other than to say the baby is doing “great.”

Ms. Cumberland’s preliminary hearing, which had

been scheduled for today, will be rescheduled.

Fayette County District Attorney Richard Bower, who personally conducted the negotiations leading to the release, declined comment on the case, but said the opioid problem in the

area underlies a huge part of his office’s workload.

“Things have gone nuts over this kind of stuff,” he said. “It obviously tears families apart. ... We have to start educating our children at home and taking them to church. Teach morals.

Teach right and wrong. Teach responsibility.”

According to an affidavit by the state police, medics responded on Nov. 14 to a call about an unresponsive infant. Police wrote that Ms. Cumberland then asked, “Are you going to give her Narcan?” referring to the opioid-reversing drug. Medics gave the infant two doses of Narcan, then transported her to Children’s Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC.

Police wrote that the infant tested positive for fentanyl, a powerful opioid, and that Ms. Cumberland admitted to snorting “a white powder to get high.”

It is not clear whether, how or when the county’s Children and Youth Services was involved with her family.

Fayette County’s Children and Youth Services faces a turnover rate of around 90 percent, said Auditor General Eugene DePasquale, at the legisla-

tive hearing. The challenges it faces in dealing with the surge in opioid-affected families and babies born in withdrawal are mirrored throughout the state, he said.

“When [caseworkers] are going to the homes now, the environment they are walking into is dramatically more dangerous for the child,” he said, citing the State of the Child report issued by his office in September. “The kids are left to fend for themselves, and there’s no parent involved. That’s what they’re seeing more and more, and it’s directly tied to opioids.”

“We’re not ready, and it’s a horrifying situation,” he said. “I think it’s going to get worse before it gets better.”

He said that in the spring, his office will introduce a plan to address the needs of children and families agencies, including better cooperation between hospitals and caseworkers,

plus better recruiting and higher pay for workers at family agencies.

The committee’s chairman, Kerry Benninghoff, R-Bellefonte, called the opioid epidemic “a long-term problem that now has a second generation of issues.” The population of children affected by addiction “is a whole new chapter in this fight. We have to be ready for them.”

“If you see mom and dad doing it at home, you’re going to be more likely to experiment or start using,” said Rep. Matt Dowling, R-Uniontown. He predicted that schools are going to be asked to help meet their needs with evidence-based drug prevention programs, but it won’t be easy.

“It’s hard on our educators. We have so many mandates right now,” he said. When they look to add extensive drug prevention programming, he said, they may have to “figure out what they’re going to cut.”

larger development in the future.

Maronda did not respond to multiple attempts to contact the company.

It’s hard to formulate an opinion on a pipeline that you knew nothing about, Mr. Cilli said. First he thought of his three kids and how his wife would react when he delivered the news. He was used to reading about pipelines in the news, he said.

“Now, I’m like, ‘Oh, OK. This is in my backyard.’”

Western Pennsylvania isn’t exactly virgin territory for pipelines. Many who buy property here likely aren’t aware of the vast network of high-pressure transmission lines that crisscross the area.

If there is an easement or right of way for a pipeline, sellers are supposed to disclose that. But the protocol is less clear for known oil and gas infrastructure that’s close by but not within the property lines.

The West Penn Multi-List Inc., a listing service that covers 17 counties, has several forms for sellers to fill out disclosing the state of oil, gas, coal and mineral developments, as well as easements and pipelines.

“People purchasing property want to know — is an oil and gas well going to block my view” or create a noisy environment, said Barbara Kohl, chief operating officer for the listing service.

One question on the disclosure asks if the seller is aware of any drilling — past or planned — near the property. But there is no such question for pipeline construction in the vicinity of the property being sold.

And disclosure about pipeline easements doesn’t apply when homes such as those in the Maronda development have been placed on subdivided lots.

The two most common concerns that landowners tend to have about pipelines locating in their area revolve around safety — what if the pipeline ruptures? — and property values.

Many say they just want to be aware of it when making what is likely the most significant financial decision of their lives. Homes in the Maronda Farms development start at \$256,000, according to the company’s website.

Jesus Rodriguez moved there a year ago and said knowing about the ethane pipeline wouldn’t have changed his decision.

“[It] doesn’t look terribly intrusive,” he said after seeing the route. But he questioned why Maronda didn’t mention anything about it.

The Clinton example also raises questions about what happens as oil and gas development and infrastructure moves closer to population centers or even precedes them.

When Shell’s land agents were knocking on doors two years ago, the pipeline came up several times at Findlay’s township meetings — brought up by a township resident concerned about the planned route for the pipeline. At a planning commission meeting in June 2016, township officials said Shell approached them “years ago, but no alignment had been selected.”

“At that time, the township did request that Shell consider only alignments that were as far away from residences as possible,” according to the minutes.

In its permit documents, Shell wrote that it rerouted some of its pipeline “to avoid most of the housing sites” of a “very large housing development” that Maronda was planning in Clinton.

Population density also informs how pipeline companies build and monitor

their lines.

Ray Fisher, a spokesman for Shell, said the pipeline company regularly monitors changes in land use and incorporates new developments into its “damage prevention and public awareness plans.” It considered the population of the area when determining where shut-off valves would be located and how far apart. “Valves will be used to help in emergency response should there be a loss of containment event to minimize impacts to populations and sensitive resources,” he said.

South of Maronda Farms, the pipeline cuts through another development, the Findlay Industrial Park. Owned by Imperial Land Corp., the 400-acre business park began taking shape in 2009 and has expanded through several phases, bringing in Alro Steel Corp., Gordon Food Service and the Findlay Commerce Center.

More buildings are planned, said Jerry Bunda, president of Imperial Land Corp.

Imperial was mindful of its planned expansion when it granted Shell an easement to build the pipeline along the outskirts of a waste coal pile some 800 feet away and down the hill from an existing building. There, the pipeline will be buried about 80 feet under ground, instead of the usual 3 or 4.

In other places — including a separate area in Washington County where Imperial has also granted easements for the pipeline — the development company identified some areas where it plans to build roads and asked Shell to bury the pipeline deeper there.

Mr. Fisher said Shell “worked closely with the developers of both properties” — Maronda and Imperial —

and considered their input for a preferred route.

“For future development, Shell works with landowners to keep permanent structures off of the [right of way],” which is typically 50 feet wide. “We try to get a decent size easement to help us with this.”

What that means for Maronda’s future homeowners in Findlay remains to be seen.

When a map of the company’s planned subdivisions overlays the pipeline route, there are dozens of homes slated to be built within a few hundred feet of the pipeline, some as close as 100 feet.
