Dear Miss Chingetta:

I recently, October 4, 2017, 10 AM, had a meeting with Tucker-Arnsley, Attorney Farrell, attorney for Duquesne Light Company regarding a complaint for incorrect charges to my light bill statements.

I received a copy of Judge Sunderdale's Administration Law Judge with her date of draft, January 22, 2018. She after the meeting indicated her decision will be made within 90 days. She letter was addressed to my home address in West Mifflin, Penna.

I've been at my daughter's house since Oct, 22, 2017. Colleen Podwin, nurse practitioner, who had provide medical attention with pneumonia was in the Greenville, Pa., Hospital until Nov. 2, 2017, am getting strong enough to handle personal matters.

I had sent the mail card to West Mifflin Post Office on October 20 (c) with a hold mail tag until further notice. 3 different times since early November I called the post master to deliver my mail to my address in Sharon. On 2 occasions they sent me 2 mail deliveries totaling 5 items, I kept the items because between deliveries took 23 weeks. No mail. I called the County customer service who said I was supposed to send another official card which was sent to me. Another 2 weeks a new card had arrived confirming receipt. Another 3 weeks I received 4-1/2 x 14 size card board envelopes stack 18"-12" in height, each

envelope filled with Christmas cards with stamped dates and  
leaving on December 10, 2017; also in various envelopes,  
also, about 19 solicitations from Catholic, ministers, VFW, etc.  
all before Christmas plus Catholic newspapers, insurance lodge  
newspapers and booklets and about 10 personal envelopes  
re: business matters, one was the response from the law judge.  
By the time <sup>all</sup> this mail, plus others, I received then February 3,  
2018, and the envelope from the PUC judge.

Your letter of January 30, 2018 page 1 says I  
have 20 days to respond to the judge's letter and 10 days  
to reply to exceptions (within the 30 days)

With all due respect I have not been able to  
comply with these due dates for personal reasons of  
health and other recuperating guidelines, late mail arrivals,  
doctor's appointments, et al.. I'm asking also for an extension  
because it's been 2 weeks or so that D L C was to send me  
related billing and other information for my references.

I'm asking for a 30 day extension from the  
date of your response to my request, if permissible.

At my age of 88, each day is <sup>not</sup> the same as the  
the other days, if you bear with me.

There is so much for me to elaborate more  
acutely in my behalf.

Please use my address as given to the beginning  
of my response here in Sharon, Pa.
