
**NOTICE TO PLEAD**

**MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT**

NOW COMES the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission’s (“Commission”) Bureau of Investigation and Enforcement (“I&E”), by its prosecuting attorneys, and files this Motion for Default Judgment against T & S Limousines, Inc. (“Respondent”) pursuant to Section 5.103 of the Commission’s regulations, 52 Pa. Code § 5.103. In support thereof, I&E respectfully represents as follows:

1. I&E commenced this action on December 14, 2017 by filing a Complaint.
2. On December 15, 2017, the Complaint was served by certified mail to Respondent at 1362 Randy Drive, Pottstown, PA 19464.
3. On March 23, 2018, the complaint was again served to Respondent by certified mail at 1362 Randy Drive, Pottstown, PA 19464.
4. Attached to the Complaint was a Notice advising Respondent that it must file an Answer within twenty (20) days of service of the Complaint.
5. The Notice also advised Respondent that if it failed to answer the Complaint, I&E would request that the Commission issue an Order imposing the penalty set forth in the Complaint.

6. On March 26, 2018, Respondent received the Complaint. A true and correct copy of proof of delivery of the Complaint is attached as Exhibit 1.
7. The twenty (20) days to file an Answer to the Complaint expired on April 12, 2018.
8. Respondent did not file an Answer to the Complaint.
9. Pursuant to Section 5.61(c) of the Commission's regulations, a Respondent who fails to file an Answer to a Complaint within the 20-day response period may be deemed in default, and the relevant facts stated in the Complaint may be deemed admitted. 52 Pa. Code § 5.61(c).
10. The Commonwealth Court has upheld the Commission's authority to sustain complaints that are not answered within twenty days. *See Fusaro v. Pa. Pub. Util. Comm'n*, 382 A.2d 794, 797 (Pa. Cmwlth. 1978).
11. Subsequent to the filing of I&E's Complaint in this matter, the Commission cancelled Respondent's Certificate of Public Convenience by Secretarial Letter dated April 18, 2018 at Docket Nos. C-2018-2643390 and A-00121625.<sup>1</sup>

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<sup>1</sup> I&E notes that its requested relief regarding revocation of Respondent's operating authority, which is set forth in I&E's Complaint, has already been addressed.

12. Respondent did not pay the outstanding assessment balance of \$530 for the July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 Fiscal Year (“2016-2017 Fiscal Year”) or the total civil penalty of \$580<sup>2</sup> that was sought in the Complaint for Respondent’s failure to timely pay the assessment and file an assessment report demonstrating revenues earned during the 2015 calendar year.

13. I&E respectfully requests that the Commission enter a Default Order against Respondent that:


- a. Directs Respondent to pay a total of \$1,110, which consists of its outstanding assessment of \$530 for the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year and the requested civil penalty of \$580, within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission’s Order;
- b. Notifies Respondent that a copy of this Order will be sent to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the suspension or revocation of vehicle registrations that were used under Respondent’s operating authority if Respondent fails to pay the total set forth in subparagraph (a), above, within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission’s Order; and

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<sup>2</sup> This civil penalty is based on a review of Respondent’s history of compliance with the Public Utility Code and Commission regulations and orders for three years prior to the date that I&E filed its Complaint in this matter, the need to deter future violations, and prior Commission decisions in similar situations pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§ 69.1201(c)(6), (8), and (9). Due to Respondent’s acceptable compliance history, I&E requested that Respondent pay a total civil penalty of \$580, which is 15% of Respondent’s outstanding assessment related to the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year or \$80 and \$500 regarding Respondent’s failure to file an assessment report for the 2015 calendar year.

- c. Directs the Bureau of Administrative Services, Assessment Section, to refer the matter to the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General for collection of the total set forth in subparagraph (a), above, if Respondent fails to pay that total within thirty (30) days of the entry date of the Commission's Order.




