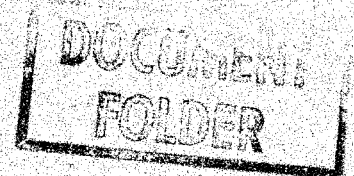
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To Whom It May Concern:

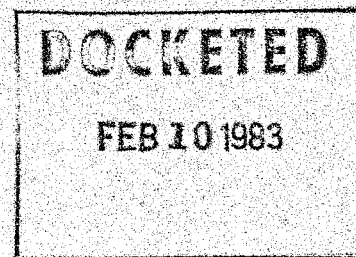

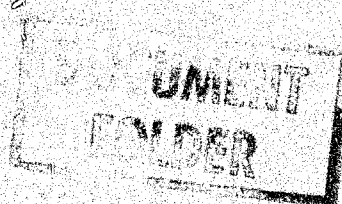
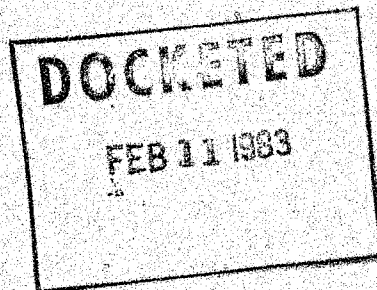
Chairman Shanaman moved that the Law Bureau be instructed to prepare, for the Commission's approval, proposed rules and/or a policy statement which will establish procedures for future public input hearings; that in addition, the Law Bureau should study the necessity for legislation which could be proposed to further our stated purpose; that the Law Bureau's proposal shall include provisions which will:

- (1) Encourage all Administrative Law Judges to hold as many public input hearings as is practicable in category 1 rate filings.
- (2) Insure that an official transcript of the testimony submitted at public input hearings will be made.
- (3) Insure that to the extent possible all testimony offered at those meetings is sworn testimony, and (to the extent it is relevant) it shall be considered as evidence by the Administrative Law Judge.
- (4) Insure that all parties to the rate filing are afforded due process of law.;

that pending development and publication of this policy, Judge Mindlin's Order of January 31, 1983 in Pa. P.U.C., et al v. Pennsylvania Power and Light Company Docket No. R-822169, etc., is hereby reversed, except to the extent that any public input hearings already scheduled shall be conducted as scheduled; and that the Commission shall take under consideration the scheduling of additional public input hearings and will announce times and locations forthwith.

(b) On November 22, 1982, Pennsylvania Power & Light Company filed Supplement No. 2 to Electric-Pa. P.U.C. No. 199 to become effective January 22, 1983, increasing base rates to produce a net increase of \$315,226,489 in additional annual revenues which results in an approximate 25 percent increase over existing revenues for the future test year ended July 31, 1983.

(c) The Bureau of Rates with the concurrence of the Law Bureau recommends:

1. That the Commission institute a formal investigation concerning the justness and reasonableness of the proposed rate increase.
2. That the Commission permit the proposed rate increase to become suspended by operation of law.

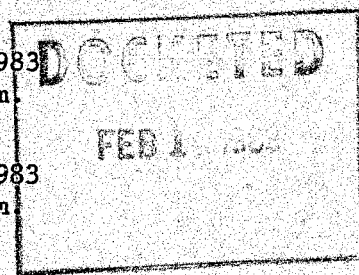

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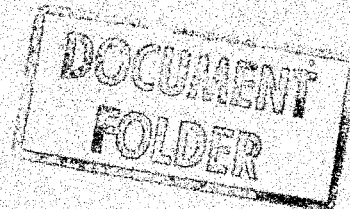

Dear Secretary Rich:

Pursuant to Section 3.271 of the Commission's regulations (52 Pa. Code Section 3.271) there are enclosed for filing in the above-referenced docket, eight (8) copies of a document entitled "Pennsylvania Power & Light Company, Electric Operations - Comparison of Actual to Budget for the Three Months Ended December 31, 1982 and Five Months Ended December 31, 1982." It has been marked for identification as Exhibit MJB 9B.

Section 3.271 of the Commission's regulations provides, in relevant part, that if a utility has utilized a future test year it must submit the results of its actual experience in the future period for each "quarter" starting with the day following the end of the historic test year. PP&L's historic test year ended July 31, 1982.


As indicated above, Exhibit MJB 9B compares actual to budget for the three months ended December 31, 1982 which is a calendar year quarterly report and not a test year quarterly report. Because the Company publicly releases such information of actual experience only on a calendar year quarterly basis, it believes it would be improper to deviate from this practice for purposes of the present proceeding.
