My name is Conrad Martin, and I am the President and sole officer and shareholder of Applicant.

As such, I am authorized to give this statement.

2. List the <u>applicant's</u> affiliation (owner, manager, controls) with any other carrier, with the description of affiliation.

Neither I, nor the Applicant, is affiliated with any other carrier by means of ownership, control, stock voting, or as being an officer or director.

3. Please provide evidence of minimum of two-years' experience with a licensed household goods carrier as required by 52 Pa. Code §3.381(c)(1)(iii)(A)(II)(-1-).

As the President, and sole officer and shareholder of Applicant, I supervise and conduct Applicant's present daily operations since June, 2014. I and Applicant have three and a half (3.5) years experience in transporting household goods, for hire, in interstate commerce. I and Applicant have two and a half (2.5) years experience in transporting property, for hire, in intrastate Pennsylvania commerce. These experiences include the transportation of safes, pianos, and appliances to or from points of purchase or warehouses. Applicant also performs furniture staging for customers, wherein new unused household goods are transported for corporate clients to homes to be staged for the sale of the house and thereafter removed after the house staging is completed for return to our customer. Such furniture staging requires the same skills and equipment that will be utilized in the transportation of household goods in use.

Applicant presently employs the services of two (2) persons, one of whom serves as administrative office personnel and the other as a full time driver, packer, and foreman. Applicant also utilizes the services of a part-time helper. Applicant's driver(s), helper(s), and office/administrative staff are familiar with Pennsylvania the streets, roads, and highway locations.

As President of Applicant, I have become familiar with this Commission's regulations at 52 Pa. Code § 29.501 et seq., § 31.27 et seq., § 31.121 et seq., and § 32.11 et seq. regarding driver and vehicle regulations, shipper/shipment information regulations, and insurance regulations for transporting household goods in use between points in Pennsylvania. The operations proposed

herein will be to transport household goods, in use, for hire, between points in Pennsylvania for the public. All of Applicant's drivers and employees receive the required training to offer professional, personalized, on-time, and courteous service to all customers and clients. Applicant already holds authority to transport property between points in Pennsylvania. See Exhibit 1 attached hereto.

4. Describe your facilities, record maintenance plan and your communication network. At this location, Applicant has facilities for offices and a shop (consisting of approximately 1,200 square feet) and for sufficient parking for vehicles. Applicant utilizes a facility at 400 W. Main St., Ephrata, PA 17522 for storage (consisting of approximately 5,000 square feet) with multiple loading docks and ample facilities. As now, dispatching and communications will be performed through a network consisting of employee and office cell phones, internet, text and email, from which all orders/reservations for service will be received and confirmed, public inquiries will be handled, drivers will be communicated with, and vehicle(s) dispatched daily. Also as done now, records will be maintained in our offices in the manner and form required by this Commission.

Likewise, the same person that acts as a driver can also perform foreman, packing, and helper duties. Applicant believes this limited amount of employees is appropriate for commencement of operations with initial limited revenue in the territory sought, but intends to expand operations and business staffing as its operations and business grows in Pennsylvania.

(a.) Regarding the hiring and retention of drivers, Applicant will abide by and comply with all applicable regulations of this Commission regarding driver hiring, qualification, and training, as set forth in 52 Pa. 
