Lifestar Response of NJ – Lifestar Response Corp. (“Respondent”) has paid, in full, its outstanding assessment balance for the July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 Fiscal Year (“2016-2017 Fiscal Year”) and the civil penalty to resolve the above-docketed complaint without litigation.

On May 17, 2018, the Commission received a cashier’s check from Respondent in the amount of \$11,060, which constitutes payment of Respondent’s outstanding assessment balance for the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year in the amount of \$8,848, as well as \$2,212 related to the civil penalty for Respondent’s failure to timely pay the Commission’s assessment.

Given that the outstanding assessment and civil penalty have been satisfied in the above-referenced matter, I&E hereby withdraws its Motion for Default Judgment filed on April 25, 2018 pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.94.
