

Request for Correction of Transcript Errors

Dear Secretary Chiavetta,

I was instructed to send you a request for correction of transcript errors. There were two transcript companies for my hearing in Philadelphia, April 10-13. Both companies indicated to me over the phone to email them the list of errors for them to review, and that there was no specific deadline to do so. My husband and I highlighted the problems within the .pdf document and marked them as Notes as there were dozens of typos and errors. After emailing the errors to the first transcription company, I was then told that since the transcripts have already been sent to the Commission, I need to request corrections in a letter to you.

The major omission was a short discussion not transcribed on April 13 (Page 291, Line 7), but instead (WHEREUPON, AN OFF RECORD DISCUSSION WAS HELD.) was written. I was asking the judge about PECO not having admitted Mr. Renner and Mr. Watson to my case pro hac vice. Somebody--I believe Mr. Smith—responded that he had submitted a global document and that he would send that to me. This discussion was not off the record and I am requesting that it be transcribed and added to the record (see attachment from the transcript, where more transcribed material followed this deleted discussion).

If additional errors are allowed to be addressed, I have attached the transcribed files from all 4 days of the hearing with highlights and Notes in an email to Secretary Chiavetta on June 8. I am not having success uploading them on eFile, though I will continue to try to do so. These include mistakes of who was speaking, ex. April 10 (Page 49, Line 12). There are several of these types of mistakes. Additional typos where the meaning is unrecognizable, such as April 10 (Page 115, Line 2). There are dozens of these types of errors. Furthermore there are many minor typos.
