Dear Ms. Lepkoski:

There are four purposes of this letter: a) establish the date of my receipt of FirstEnergy's Responses to the Interrogatories and Requests for Production of Documents of Christopher Macey dated February 13, 2018; b) request the tracking number of your mailing to me of March 14, 2018; c) present my comments on First Energy's responses to the Interrogatories of Christopher Macey dated February 13, 2018; and d) advise you of my availability for mediation.

On June 14, 2018, I received a phone call from you asking me if I wanted to proceed with mediation. My reply was that I had not received any responses to my Interrogatories and Requests for Production of Documents. To clarify this position with the PUC, I received the Responses and Production on June 21, 2018. (I phoned your office on June 22 to confirm this.) The cover letter and the Certificate of Service were both dated March 14, 2018. The package was postmarked June 19th, five days after our phone conversation.

The package was approximately 1-3/8" thick, so please be advised that there is NO WAY that I would have missed this packet had it arrived in March. Please send me the tracking number of the March 14 mailing so that I may complain with the local post office for a failed delivery of these important documents.

To the 36 Interrogatories and Requests for production of documents, FirstEnergy objected in whole or in part to a total of 20, specifically 6,11,13, 15 through 23, 27, and 30 through 36. The objections were based upon the questions being vague (9), unduly burdensome (6), and outside the scope of the litigation (3). From the complainant's perspective, the responses were unresponsive and woefully inadequate.

Among the issues I remain concerned about are the safety of the smart meter device. FirstEnergy provided no information of its experiences regarding any failures of the device especially regarding fires. I am responsible for the safety of all residents of 201 Highland, and I do not take lightly that FirstEnergy may be withholding vital information in that regard.

FirstEnergy has no one studying or responsible for the effects of RF energy exposure on humans. That is a position I find to be negligent at best. As I have disclosed, my wife is emf-sensitive, and should the installation of FirstEnergy's smart meter cause her discomfort or more severe symptoms, is FirstEnergy willing to bear the cost of the financial and emotional burden that the device may cause?

The inquiries to the costs and profits of the smart meter deployment are not irrelevant but go to motive and transparency in dealing with your customers. As I have discussed this issue with

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
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many people locally, I have yet to find an individual that understood consumers (in Pennsylvania) are paying for the smart meters and the deployment. Consumers bearing the cost of the devices and their deployment is a well-kept secret.

FirstEnergy has truly established a pattern of concealment regarding the smart meter program. At this point, I do not believe that I have received sufficient answers to my questions and concerns to proceed to mediation. Since we are in "informal discovery," please contact me about resolving this dispute without my filing a motion with the court.

As you may be aware, I have periods of travel for my work, and I will be out of the country during the middle of July that may possibly extend through the first full week of August.

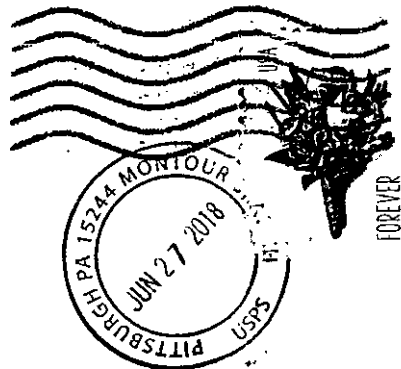
