To the honorable Judge Jeffrey Watson,

My many attempts at contacting the PUC for instructions as to how to submit a petition for extension of time for responding to Discovery paperwork received by Duquesne Light's utility attorneys had ended in failure.

In reference to docket number: C-2018-3003482, I went ahead and e-filed for the extension of time on September 25, 2018 with the limited information that was available to me.

I assuming that the attorneys would be automatically notified upon doing so. I wrongly assumed and because of this error I feel that may have interfered with the proper process and subsequently I have not gained approval on this petition to date.

I appeal to you now to grant this extension of time based on the information provided in my original petition, as well as the confusing instructions regarding time constraints in the paperwork sent by Duquesne Light Corporation. It states a period of 20 days given to respond when upon further investigation I have discovered the 52 pa code § 1.36 requires a separate service for response for objections giving a period of only 10 days.

In your consideration of this matter on my behalf, I ask that you grant me the originally 30 days that I requested along with a more detailed response regarding the time restraints for filing of objections. I am also copying in this email one of the attorney's of Duquesne Light who also received the e-service of my original request for petition of extension of time. The other attorney who was originally on this case is no longer working this case and I apologize but I was not notified of the newly added attorney's email information in any paperwork to send this email to him as well.
