



Andrew and Theresa Sabatini (“Complainants”) response to West Penn Power Company’s (“West Penn”) Answer and New Matter is as follows:

16. Denied. Act 129 does not require that an RF emitting, transient- and harmonic-producing "smart meter" be installed.
17. Denied. The installation of an RF emitting, transient- and harmonic-producing "smart meter" on our home would be harmful to our health, therefore would be in violation of 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501. Other objections include: safety, privacy, reliability, and constitutional infringements.
18. We don't have sufficient information to respond to this at this time.
19. Denied. In fact, if the Commission allows West Penn to install an RF emitting, transient- and harmonic-producing "smart meter" on our home, the Commission is allowing West Penn to violate 66 Pa.C.S. § 1501.
