On October 17, 2018, Administrative Law Judge, the Honorable Katrina Dunderdale, issued an Interim Order directing the Complainant to obtain an attorney on or before October 26, 2018, and ordering such attorney to file a Notice of Appearance with the Commission's Secretary's Bureau and provide a copy of the same to Duquesne Light's counsel.

6. By a letter dated October 25, 2018, Complainant requested a postponement to allow her more time to retain an attorney.

7. On October 30, 2018, the Administrative Law Judge issued a Second Interim Order, granting Complainant's request for a continuance and directing the Complainant to obtain an attorney on or before November 30, 2018 and ordering such attorney to file a Notice of Appearance with the Commission's Secretary's Bureau and provide a copy of the same to Duquesne Light's counsel.

8. The Second Interim Order states in part that the Complainant's Formal Complaint "will be dismissed" if Complainant does not hire an attorney on or before Friday, November 30, 2018 (emphasis added).

9. As of the date of this filing, an attorney has not filed a Notice of Appearance on behalf of the Complainant, nor has the undersigned counsel received a copy of any such Notice of Appearance, if any.

10. The Complaint must now be dismissed because Complainant has failed to obtain an attorney by November 30, 2018 in accordance with the Administrative Law Judge's Second Interim Order.
