
Dear Judge Watson:

I have been served a twelve (12) page interrogatory with instruction A thru K and questions 1 thru 39 by Frist Energy's Attorney. All tallied with instructions and subsection to the thirty-nine (39) questions, the total instructions with answers expected equals ninety-nine (99). The awkward position, ridiculous demands, and time restraints First Energy has burdened me with are absurdly unrealistic. I question some of the inquests validity and relevancy to my complaint. The interrogatory goes far beyond personal with specific questions about my family and household. I should not be expected to divulge any discrete and private information or data to a utility company for civic amenities rendered. The interrogatory reads more like a transgressing witch hunt or subvert autocratic criminal interrogation that would undoubtedly violate any individual's civil liberties if left unchecked to fruition. I am outraged, I dispute the procedure the arrogance and gall why anyone would expect me to subject myself to such tyranny or agree to reply according to Metropolitan Edison's ridiculous demands. These levies are inconsistent with anything I would subscribe to if given an actual choice. I have lost all faith in the process. The entire one-sided scheme has arisen flawed from its inception with no defense for my own wellbeing or security.

What happened? It should have remained simple. I am not a common thief or criminal. I am provided electricity at a specific rate. I get my bill and I pay what's due on time. I should not expect to be left with threats, intimidation and fears of terminated service. What or who gives a utility company the authority to expect anything more or to exert such leverage? Absolute power corrupts absolutely. I do not want or need any further aggravation that complicates or impacts upon my modest existence. When I buy fuel for my vehicle, I do not have to explain, or answer questions where I am going or what I am doing. They sell energy at a specific rate and I agree to pay accordingly, no questions asked.

Without giving up any of my rights, I petition the court for more time, as much as possible to answer questions I am comfortable answering that I feel are appropriate to the process with time to prepare my own Interrogatories.
