PREHEARING ORDER

Upon concluding a prehearing conference with Jeremy V. Farrell, Esquire and Paul Shane Miller, Esquire appearing for Respondent and Francis Hriadil participating, and after notice was provided to Michele Hriadil who did not participate, an in-person hearing in this case is scheduled for Thursday, April 26 and Friday, April 27, 2018, at 10:00 a.m. in an available hearing room, Piatt Place, 2nd Floor, Suite 220, 301 Fifth Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15222.

You must be available in the hearing room when your case is called by the presiding Administrative Law Judge. If the customer is not present and prepared to go forward with the case when it is called, the case will be dismissed.

The parties are hereby directed to comply with the following requirements:

1. That all parties must comply with the following deadlines:

a. Any additional discovery requests shall be served not later than **January 2, 2018**. Responses shall be served within twenty (20) days, pursuant to the applicable regulations.

b. **ON OR BEFORE February 2, 2018**, any Complainant wishing to present expert testimony (including but not limited to medical, technical, etc.) must provide to

the other party in writing, the name and business address of that expert and a written summary of the expected testimony of that expert.

c. **ON OR BEFORE February 2, 2018**, any Complainant wishing to present factual testimony of any person other than Complainants must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that person and a written summary of the expected testimony of that person.

d. **ON OR BEFORE February 15, 2018**, Respondent, wishing to present expert testimony (including but not limited to medical, technical, etc.) must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that expert and a written summary of the expected testimony of that expert.

e. **ON OR BEFORE February 22, 2018**, any party wishing to present rebuttal factual testimony of any person other than Complainants must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that person and a written summary of the expected testimony of that person.

f. **ON OR BEFORE February 22, 2018**, Respondent, wishing to present rebuttal expert testimony (including but not limited to medical, technical, etc.) must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that expert and a written summary of the expected testimony of that expert.

g. Any dispositive motions must be filed **by March 1, 2018**. Any responses to any dispositive motion must be filed no later than seven (7) days after service of that motion.

h. **ON OR BEFORE April 9, 2018**, Complainants and Counsel for Pennsylvania Electric Company are directed to provide one another with copies of all exhibits and statements which the parties intend to present at the hearing.

i. Any stipulations should be submitted to the undersigned, in writing, no later than **noon on April 16, 2018.**

j. *Pro se* Complainants should be served by hard copy unless otherwise agreed to between the parties.

2. THAT YOU MUST SERVE THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE DIRECTLY WITH ANY DOCUMENTS THAT YOU FILE IN THIS PROCEEDING. IF YOU SEND ANY DOCUMENT OR CORRESPONDENCE, YOU MUST SEND A COPY TO ALL OTHER PARTIES IN THE CASE. THE CURRENT SERVICE LIST IS ATTACHED TO THIS ORDER.

3. That a request for a change of the scheduled hearing date must state the agreement or opposition of other parties, and must be submitted in writing no later than five (5) business days prior to the hearing. 52 Pa. Proposed exhibits should be properly pre-marked for identification.

5. This hearing is a formal proceeding and will be conducted in accordance with the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure.

6. Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code §§1.21 & 1.22, you may represent yourself, if you are an individual, or you may have an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*, represent you. However, if you are a partnership, limited liability company, corporation, trust, association, or governmental agency or subdivision, you must have an attorney licensed to practice law in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, or admitted *Pro Hac Vice*, represent you in this proceeding. Unless you are an attorney, you may not represent someone else. Attorneys shall insure that their appearance is entered in accordance with the provisions of 52 Pa. Code §1.24(b).

7. If you intend to subpoena witnesses for the hearing, you should review the procedures established in 52 Pa. Code §5.421. You must submit your written application to the Administrative Law Judge sufficiently in advance of the hearing date so that the other parties will have the required ten (10) days' notice to answer or object, and so that you will have enough time to receive the subpoena and serve it.

8. **If you, or anyone you plan to call as a witness on your behalf, have a limited ability to speak or understand English or are deaf or hearing-impaired, a qualified interpreter can be provided upon your request. 10. **IF ANY MOTIONS ARE PENDING, THE PARTY FILING THE MOTION MUST PROVIDE A COPY OF THAT MOTION TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE WITHIN 7 (SEVEN) DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THIS ORDER.**

11. **THE COMPLAINT WILL BE DISMISSED IF THE CUSTOMER FAILS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE HEARING AND PRESENT ADMISSIBLE EVIDENCE IN SUPPORT OF THE COMPLAINT.**

12. Complainants bear the burden of proof and must demonstrate by a preponderance of the evidence that Respondent violated its tariff, the Public Utility Code or a Commission order or regulation, and that they are entitled to the relief requested in the Complaint.

b. **ON OR BEFORE April 30, 2018**, any Party wishing to present expert testimony (including but not limited to medical, technical, etc.) must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that expert and a written summary of the expected testimony of that expert.

c. **ON OR BEFORE April 30, 2018**, any Party wishing to present factual testimony of any person other than Complainants must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that person and a written summary of the expected testimony of that person.

d. **ON OR BEFORE May 18, 2018**, any Party wishing to present rebuttal expert testimony (including but not limited to medical, technical, etc.) must provide to the other party in writing, the name and business address of that expert and a written summary of the expected testimony of that expert.

e. Any dispositive motions must be filed **by June 4, 2018**. Any responses to any dispositive motion must be filed no later than seven (7) days after service of that motion.

f. **ON OR BEFORE June 29, 2018**, Complainants and Counsel for Respondent are directed to provide one another with copies of all exhibits and statements which the parties intend to present at the hearing.

g. Any stipulations should be submitted to the undersigned, in writing, no later than **noon on July 9, 2018**.

h. *Pro se* Complainants should be served by hard copy unless otherwise agreed to between the parties.
