PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION

Pursuant to 52 Pa. Code § 5.572, I respectfully request reconsideration of the Commission's FINAL ORDER, dated: December 21, 2018 "dismissed with prejudice and marked closed".

INTRODUCTION

Faced with the Commission's decision to dispense with my case, a grave injustice occurs. This action alone violates not only the U.S. Constitution and Pennsylvania's Constitution, but it also violates Title 18 USC Chapter 13 §§ 241 and 242. It is critical that the Commission protect and defend a person's inherent rights, not bow down to industry's whims, while riding roughshod over any individual's rights enabling collusion.

ARGUMENT

This petition presents new arguments, not previously heard, or considerations that appear to have been overlooked or not addressed by the Commission, supporting reconsideration. The reason why I did not file an Exception was because I felt there was enough evidence presented at the hearing, and I thought the judge would do the right thing. It was also made clear to the parties involved that neither the Brief nor the Exception process was necessary since the evidence about a person's rights was clearly established in law and covered by Constitutional codes.

The Fourteenth Amendment "...No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal

protection of the laws.” -(The Constitution of the United States)

In addition, Title 18 USC, Chapter 13 §§ 241 (Conspiracy Against Rights) and 242 (Deprivation of Rights Under Color of Law) must not be overlooked or enabled by the Commission, because that would make the Commission just as guilty of conspiracy as the Defendants.

Furthermore, the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania § 1. **Inherent Rights of Mankind** – “All men are born equally free and independent, and have certain inherent and indefeasible rights, among which are those of enjoying and defending life and liberty, of acquiring, possessing and protecting property and reputation, and of pursuing their own happiness.”

It is with the aforementioned facts in mind that prove beyond reasonable doubt that Act 129 should be abolished or rewritten to mention an individual’s rights and/or allow opt-outs as other States are allowing. Also keep in mind that there is no mention of the word “mandate or opt-outs” within the body of the Act 129’s wording, therefore, how can the State even feel it has the right to enforce such a biased law upon the State’s People.

The Smart Meters are known to gather sensitive information without the users consent and are prone to in-house hacking by employees and staff, which is mentioned in the Cryptographic Key Management for Smart Power Grids, dated February 22, 2012 – this white paper study was submitted at my initial hearing but reject because I did not have an expert that wrote this report. I find it hard to understand why the people who test and do research and development on these products for safety reasons are not taken into consideration, when the papers they produce are peer-reviewed studies.

Lastly, I filed an R-T-K (Right-To-Know) form with the PUC’s Secretary requesting the Bond paperwork and Sworn Oath information on Judge Jeffrey A. Watson, only to find out that PUC has created a code that negated that requirement. This allows an ALJ (Administrative Law Judge) to avoid taking into consideration both the U.S. Constitution and the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania when making his Corum Non Judice findings. “When a suit is brought and determined in a court which has no jurisdiction in the matter, then it is said to be coram non judice, and the judgment is


void."²(Manufacturing Co. v. Holt, 51 W. Va. 352, 41 S. E. 351)


