
Dear Secretary Chiavetta,

I am responding to a request dated February 26, 2019 from Metropolitan Edison Company to file a written request to deny or correct their motion to dismiss within 5 days. One reason that I have not complied with their request is because I did not receive their notice until this afternoon. Six (6) days after the date that their document was signed. It will not get mailed until tomorrow, 2 days after the arbitrary, unrealistic, deadline that they set. I cannot determine what specific, relevant, information they desire that I have not provided.

They state that I have not complied with their earlier request for information. That is true as some time ago they requested information within 10 days, a time frame which I could not meet. At that time they also threatened me with the possibility of terminating my power if I did not comply within 10 days. I am under the impression that they can take no action until this formal complaint is resolved. Are they allowed to threaten me like that?

What is a discovery deadline of March 29, 2019?

I hereby request that the Pennsylvania Public Utility commission deny their Motion to Dismiss and I reaffirm my right to a public hearing.

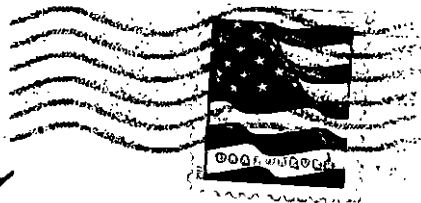
