**STATUS REPORT REGARDING HOME ENERGY AUDIT AT COMPLAINANT'S  
PROPERTY**

Respondent Duquesne Light Company ("Duquesne Light"), files this Status Report Regarding Home Energy Audit at Complainant's Property ("Status Report") pursuant to the Presiding Administrative Law Judge's Second Interim Order Re-Opening Hearing Record for Performance of Home Energy Audit and Further Hearing dated January 18, 2019:

1. Duquesne Light submits this Status Report to provide an update on the home energy audit that was recently completed at the property of Complainant Nancy Leininger ("Complainant").
2. On June 25, 2018, Complainant filed a Formal Complaint with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission against Duquesne Light.
3. On September 28, 2018, the parties participated in an initial telephonic hearing before Administrative Law Judge Mark A. Hoyer ("the Presiding ALJ").
4. The Presiding ALJ closed the hearing record pursuant to an interim order on October 11, 2018.

5. On January 18, 2019, the Presiding ALJ issued a Second Interim Order that reopened the hearing record.

6. The Second Interim Order instructed Duquesne Light to perform a home energy audit within 60 days from the date of the Order.

7. In addition, the Second Interim Order instructed Duquesne Light to “notify the undersigned presiding officer in writing after the home energy audit has been conducted and a report has been prepared so that a further call-in telephone hearing can be scheduled.”

8. Duquesne Light completed a home energy audit at Complainant’s property (106 Byron Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15237) on March 4, 2019, which was within 60 days from the date of the Second Interim Order.

9. Duquesne Light also prepared a report in connection with the home energy audit.
