Dear Ms. Brown,

The above docket number is reference to a formal complaint I filed with the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC) regarding my wish for West Penn Power/First Energy Company/First Energy Corporation (EDC) to respect the contract I have with them to retain the analog meter.

As you are or should be aware, there are many flaws with the deployment of the weapon commonly known as a “smart meter.” As these “smart meters” (also known as “home controllers”) are investigated and tested by independent experts who have no vested interest in the product, the harm being done by smart meters is becoming obvious to the public. On your Oath of Office, you and the commissioners/board of the PUC must keep the rights and safety of the people of Pennsylvania first.

I submitted a challenge to jurisdiction to Judge Jeffrey Watson which was denied. I then submitted amendments to that challenge of which the most recent, dated February 4, 2019, was not acknowledged by the EDC council or Judge Jeffrey Watson.

My first question to you is, does Judge Jeffrey Watson, as Administrative Law Judge, have the jurisdiction to grant or deny a change to The Commission's interpretation of Act 129 of 2008 as stated in the Implementation Order, Docket No. M-2009-2092655? It appears from his writings that he (Watson) does not have jurisdiction to change the Commission's interpretation of the Act, no matter the harm being done to the public and the ratepayers. As one of our (the public's) employees, I expected Judge Watson to at least refer me to someone who can direct me to the right jurisdiction. Instead I got mumbo jumbo, as though Judge Watson seems not to comprehend plain English.

Secondly, if in fact Judge Watson does not have jurisdiction to change the interpretation of the act, does the PUC have the jurisdiction and an administrative procedure to correct the PUC's interpretation of Act 129 of 2008 as stated in the Implementation Order, Docket No. M-2009-2092655? If so, please advise me of that procedure by return email. I have asked Judge Watson but have no response.

It has become apparent that smart meters are not fulfilling their mission, to secure the electric distribution grid and to reduce electric costs to the ratepayer. The flimsy design of the electronics does not even provide for sufficient surge protection, there has been insufficient safety testing by the EDCs and/or the PUC, and there is expansive infringement on the people's Natural Rights as recognized by the 4<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the Constitution for these united States. In fact, some EDCs have testified they did zero testing on how the non-thermal effects of the electromagnetic radiation poisoning would affect insects, pets, wild animals, or even humans. In

short, smart meters must be replaced with something better thought out or return to the legacy analog meters. It is no longer if they must go, but rather **how much more harm will be done before they go**. Then there is the matter of liability for any additional harm.

If the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and Judge Jeffrey Watson do not have jurisdiction in the above matter, this matter must be moved to a court of competent jurisdiction, or as common courtesy to your employers, Complainant should be made aware of the proper administrative procedure to request a correction of the existing PUC ruling.

If there is no administrative procedure for correcting the interpretation of Act 129 of 2008, that must be admitted.

Please respond within 14 days from the date of this letter.


