Dear Judge Watson,

We received West Penn Power's (WPP) Motion to Compel and another copy of the previously-answered Interrogatories today, May 1, 2019, already past the five day deadline to respond based on the date of their Motion and letter (April 23, 2019). We are responding as timely as we can.

We object to WPP's Motion to Compel. We have answered the questions on time and as completely as we could. We provided links to our documentation, and they are free to print them if they need hard copies. It's costly, time consuming, and burdensome for us to print and mail all those sheets of information, and they are freely available at the electronic sources we provided.

As for our responses that we will provide information as it becomes available, we are working diligently toward preparing for the hearing. We have many obligations for work and family, and we lack an administrative staff, a team of lawyers, and the money, time, and power that WPP has. We are just two individuals, caring for children, ailing elderly parents, and the basic necessities of life, with little time and energy available to fight WPP and its giant parent company, First Energy. We are diligently and sincerely trying, and will continue to comply and cooperate to negotiate this dispute with WPP over our contracted services for electricity at our home. As we find information and sources to answer those questions, we will provide it to WPP.

Our responses of "not relevant" were made because the questions/answers are, in fact, not relevant to the issues at hand in our complaint against WPP. These questions are burdensome and obtrusive into the privacy of our home and family life. They have no bearing as to our contract with WPP for electrical service at our home.

We were hoping to have an expert witness, but have not, to date, been able to secure one. We would like to reserve our right to do so if we can find and afford an expert witness for the hearing. WPP has three paid expert witnesses. They have the resources, staff, and legal team to do as they wish and to exert their power in the marketplace and over their customers. We hope to have a fair process and a fair hearing that takes into account our lack of resources, legal expertise, and political/financial power.

Please let us know how best to proceed. We are ready and willing to cooperate.
